June 18, 1982

HOST

Garden City Chapter No. 251

The 50th Annual District Convention of the Order of Ahepa was convened at 11:30 a.m., Friday, June 18, 1982 at the Hilton Hotel in Sunnyvale. The President of the Garden City Chapter #251, Harry Kalargiros, opened the meeting and greeted delegates and guests. President Kalargiros then turned the meeting over to the Chairman of the Convention, Gust Aretos, also of the Garden City Chapter #251. Chairman Aretos welcomed all those present and then turned the meeting back over to President Kalargiros. Kalargiros then introduced Brother Nick Alevizos, #171.

The Opening Prayer was given by Brother Nick Alevizos, the District #21 Chaplain.

President Kalargiros then introduced the Governor of the District #21, Ted Pepitone, who also welcomed the delegates to this Convention. Then Governor Pepitone introduced the Supreme Vice President, Peter Kouchalacos, from Florida, who made a brief speech. He then turned the meeting back over to Harry Kalargiros who then introduced Ann Mountanos, the National Advisor to the Maids of Athena to say a few words. She then introduced the Grand Treasurer to the Daughters of Penelope, Thalia Banis, to make a few comments. District Governor Melba Pappageorge was then introduced who also welcomed the delegates to this convention. President Kalargiros then took the podium and asked the sisters to leave the room and continue their meeting upstairs while the brothers remained in the room to continue with theirs.

The First Order of Business by District Governor Ted Pepitone was the election of a Convention Chairman. Brother Tentos nominated Brother Karl Konstantin of the Oakland Chapter, #171. Brother Konstantin was unanimously elected as Convention Chairman.

The next Order of Business was the election of other Convention Officers. For Vice-Chairman, Brother Mountanos nominated Brother Margelos. Brother Margelos was unanimously elected Vice-Chairman. Brother Konstantin nominated Brother Eliopoulos as Convention Secretary. Brother Eliopoulos was unanimously elected Convention Secretary.

Brother Peter Kouchalacos administered the Oath of Office to Brothers Karl Konstantin, George Margelos, and Paul Eliopoulos.

Brother Nicholas Loumos, #171 will serve throughout this Convention as Parliamentarian.

Brother Tentis, #259 said there will be a budget meeting at 4:00 p.m.

Lou Janakos made a motion to bring up a discussion about the Medical Research Project. The motion was seconded by Brother Stella, #150. Brother Loumos also commented on this matter. Brother Stella commented that we should not lay the matter aside, but resolve the discussion on the Medical Research Project. Brother Loumos, #171 again commented on the subject. Brother Lourentzos, #150 made the comment that all he wants to do with the resolution is revive it and then adopt it.

Because there was too much discussion on this issue, and other matters had to be taken care of today, the Medical Research Project discussion would continue tomorrow, June 19, at 10:30 a.m.

Brother Lou Colombotos, #171 gave the Convention City Report. He suggested to the convention cities that they have further conventions over Father's Day Weekend and could start an annual Father's Day Luncheon. He made a preliminary report that next year's convention may be held in Oakland.

Brother Mountanos gave the delegate's count of the votes from the Credentials Committee. As of 3:00 p.m., 11 past district governors, 5 district lodge members, and 27 delegates were registered. The voting strength of qualified delegates is 43.

The Convention meeting was reconvened at 9:50 a.m., Saturday morning, June 19, 1982, by Chairman Konstantin.

On the Good of the Order, Brother Tahan, #151 says that the Order of Ahepa is from a Christian background. He comments that this organization should express their concern for people all over the world.

On the Good of the Order, Brother Kosieris, #151 says that he fully agrees with Brother Tahan.

On the Good of the Order, Brother Zakos, #392 tells the Brothers to put a notice in the city paper to get more members to come to the meetings.

Chairman Konstantin held a vote whether or not to accept the \$5.00 registration fee. It was a unanimous decision by the Brothers to accept the \$5.00 fee.

The meeting was reconvened at 2:45 p.m., by Vice Chairman Margelos.

Whereupon, Committee Chairman, Sam Dakis, gave the report. See Report. For the Record, Brother Loumos, #171 made a recommendation. Brother Dakis moved for the adoption of this report. The motion was seconded by Brother Kireopoulos. Motion carried.

Grievance Committee Report

Whereupon, Committee Chairman, Gus Zakos, gave the report. See Report. There was some question as to a meeting that was held on October 13, 1981, as to it being formal or

Whereupon, Brother Tentes gave the report. See Report. The motion was moved and seconded. Motion carried.

District #21 Election Of Officers For 1982 - 1983

Governor

Brother Gus Lekas nominated Brother Ted Pepitone to serve as Governor again. Brother Pepitone declined from the nomination. Brother Pepitone nominated Brother Jirair Aghazarian, #212. The motion was moved and seconded. It was a unanimous decision to put Brother Jirair Aghazarian into office as District Governor.

Lieutenant Governor

Brother Agamemnon Zafiratos nominated Brother John Koplos. The motion was moved by Chairman Konstantin and seconded by Brother Loumos.

Brother Bill Rotas nominated Brother George Marmas. The motion was moved by Brother Rotas and seconded by Brother Harry Kalargiros. The motion to close the nominations was moved by Brother Rockas and seconded by Brother Haramalis.

Whereupon, the qualified delegates voted. The results were tallied by Brother LaBritt, Brother Harris, and Brother Zakos. The voting strength was 45. The votes were tallied - 16 for Brother John Koplos and 29 for Brother George Marmas.

Chairman Konstantin congratulated Brother Marmas as the new Lieutenant Governor.

GROWTH AND EXPANSION COMMITTEE

The Growth and Expansion Committee met at 4:00 p.m. June 18, 1982. Present Chairman Sam Dakis, Secretary Angelo T. Mountanos, and members present John LaBritt, Peter Kireopoulos, and Peter Papageorge.

The District Lodge with the District Governor become more involved with local District chapters to guide them in increasing members, community services, etc. Annual visitations alone do not achieve this purpose.

A District meeting to be held once a year in the month of September between the District Lodge and all chapter presidents and vice-presidents in the District to find ways of promoting AHEPA in individual communities.

District Governor and the Lt. District Governor to canvass the District each year through the chapter presidents to find leaders to be elected to the District Lodge at forthcoming District conventions.

The District Lodge to promote better public relations with the local Greek Orthodox parishes and its spiritual leaders to promote AHEPA and impress them with the community service AHEPA offers. This should also be carried through to the diocese level and the Bishop.

All of those who take District Lodge offices should have one objective in mind - the betterment of our beloved Order of AHEPA.

The District convention delegates are not obligated to elevate District Lodge officers, once they have been put into the officers line. Election to higher office should come on the basis of merit of work and qualifications. By the same token, all those seeking District office need not start at the lower levels of the District Lodge. District Lodge officers need not feel that they are obligated to run for higher office.

These suggestions and recommendations should serve as a guideline not only on a District level, but on a chapter level.

Regarding District conferences, abolish two District conferences per year. Hold only one District conference per year in January or February, on a Sunday only, in a central location. Conference should be structured to eliminate individual chapter reports and take on the character of an open forum type workshop with the members participating to discuss their local problems and ideas for the betterment of AHEPA. The conference to begin with a lecture from a guest speaker sent by Supreme Headquarters, informing the members how to promote the growth and expansion of AHEPA.

The last 30 minutes of the conference to be a joint meeting with the rest of the AHEPA family in attendance, to discuss mutual problems and ways of cooperating better with each other for the betterment of the AHEPA family.

I respectfully submit it for adoption.



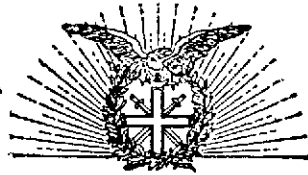
