OFFICIAL CONVENTION MINUTES OF THE 53rd ANNUAL

DISTRICT CONVENTION -- GOLDEN GATE DISTRICT NO.21 - ORDER OF AHEPA

JULY 5, 1985

The Golden Gate District No.21 - 53rd Annual Convention was held at the Clarion Hotel in Millbrae, California. It was sponsored by the Local Chapter of San Mateo County No. 392 under the leadership of PDG Louis Janakos. The Convention City did a tremendous job. They deserve a lot of credit.



DISTRICT SECRETARY'S REPORT

This has been an exciting year to have served as your District Secretary. It was a year where we joined with the Daughters in promoting a districtwide charitable raffle. It was a year that has seen the Ahepa name proudly put into place at our St. Nicholas Ranch. I made 35 meetings or visitations, traveling 5,334 miles within the District. It was a year where some chapters, which have vibrant, innovative leaders, become stronger. It was also a year where some chapters, having apathetic or lethargic leadership, became weaker.

This year, the District Secretary's books and records were once again reinstalled so that they will conform to our Constitutional requirements. To all Chapters and members of District 21, Thank You, for the hospitality, fraternalisim and frendship that was bestowed to us on our visiations.

To the Convention Committee of San Mateo, THANK YOU for a great Convention.

To Tom Tjovenos, Editor of the Traveler, Thank You and your coworkers for the work and effort you put into the Traveler.

To Dr. Karl Konstantin, Thank You and your Scholarship Committee for a job well done.

Finally to my District Lodge, Thank You for your effort, your time, and your cooperation, it was exceptional. A special Thank You, to John Koplos, my Lt. Governor who filled in for me during my wifes illness.

This year, 1984-1985, has been one of the finest years of District 21 or any other District of the Order of Ahepa. On January 23, 1985 we had the Legislative Banquet in Sacramento. It was truly a magnificent affair. The banduet room was crowded with over 700 members of District 20 & 21. The legislatures responded over nod beyond the call of duty. Usually 10 to 15 legislatures go to an ethnic affair, which it a good showing, we had over

90 including the Tovernor, Speaker of the House, and President of the Senate. This was the first time any District has so honored its State Officials. The Charity Raffle has also become a reality with our first drawing Saturday nite. Again it was a few people who made it a sucess. Some of our Chapters did nothing to help, yet they want Conventions and Conferences. A big BRAVO to Gus Aretos and his committee. A job well done.

Yes Brothers, we did have a banner year, so good that we had difficulty picking the Chapter of the Year.

Over all the District is in fair shape. Membership is about half paidor 480members as of June 6. He do have some weak Chapters Rodsto, Vallejo, Reno, Contra Costa and Salinas, we do hope to resolve this problem soon. Our Chapter in Salinas, has not paid per capita tax this gear, paid for only 12 members in 1984, refuses visitations, refuses to take part in District projects. I am refering it to the grievence committee.

My recommendations are as follows: pages 3 & 4

Brothers I have given you my recommendations I do hope that you take them into consideration for the betterment of the Ahepa. Thank you for letting me serve as your District Governor.

District Governors Recommendations

- 1. This year, the District Lodge incorporated the Ahepa Agenda. I recommend that we continue to use this all important paper It can be used by the delegates for their reports, and the Convention Secretary can use it for the Convention Minutes. All they have to add is the District Officers reports, the Chapter reports, and motions made.
- 2. Start the Convention promptly at 9:00 A. M. so that all Committee work be done on Friday and the committee reports and election on Saturday. There have been complaints that delegates have been in meetings while important legislation has been passed. A fine could be imposed by the Convention Chairman for being lateand the proceeds to the Scholarship Comm.
- 3. The summer issue of the Traveler should concentrate on pictures of the Convention and Scholarship recipients. Also each chapter should have a strong person for publicity, Traveler, Ahepan and newspapers.
- 4. * Each Convention should have an official photographer.
- 5. At Ahepa Functions such as Conference and Convention Banquets the Ahepan of the Year, and Chapter of the Year, should be recognized.
- 6. The Delegates Luncheon be changed to an Athletic Luncheon and present awards to athletes, coaches or anyone involved in athletics.
- 7. A revolving Membership Trophy be instituted by the Convention and presented to the Chapter membership chairman who has the highest per cent of increase in his Chapter.
- 8. A matching Scholarship should be added to the scholarship. If a person wants to name a scholarship after some loved one, he may do so by paying half the scholarship and matched by the scholarship committee. This way we can have a \$500, \$1,500, or a \$2,000 Scholarship.
- 9. Any man who wishes the office of District Governor, should be on the District Lodge for at least 3 years.
- 10. Find ways to make the Convention Fun for the whole family whether it is sports, games, etc.
- 11. An Ahepa Blood Bank be considered for the Chapters & District.
- 12. Ahepa Family Booths be set up at Festevils, with liturature, and applications to acquaint the people with Ahepa.
- 13. All legislation involving the Auxilliares should be made known to them before the Convention ends so that they may adopt it.,
- 14. The District Lodge have at least one meeting with the Bishop every year to anomate good will and resolve any problems.

- 15. The District Governor and the District Sectly, be on each Chapters mailing list.
- 16. The Past District Governors get more involved with the weaker Chapters. These Chapters need stimulation and assurance from the District Lodge and Past District Governors.
- 17. Each year, the Budget should be made up by the District Lodge and presented to the Convention Budget Committee for approval.
- 18. With a \$ 4,000 budget, I do not think the \$ 200 budgeted for a computor is needed.
- 19. Brief cases should be provided for the District Lodge, it would enhance their apperance.
- 20. Each Chapter should get involved with a Community project of their own, such as Special Olympics, blind, deaf etc.
- 21. An annual youth dance, sponsered by the District Lodges of the Ahepa Family, with no cost to the potential members of the Sons or Maids.
- 22. A yearly appropriation of § 150, so that the District Gov. ca go to the biannual Congressional Banguet in Washington, D. C.
- 23. The District Governors allowance to the Supreme Convention be increased by \$ 200 and his District allowance be increased. by \$ 200.
- 24. A study be made by the Past District Governors for new Chapters in San Rafel and Santa Cruz.
- 25. Any Chapter that does not participate in Mational or District projects, conferences etc., should not be eligible for a District Convention or a conference.

Dear Mr. Premier:

The purpose of this letter is to express our outrage and indignation with your views and public position as expressed in your interview as broadcast on "Sixty Minutes" on the sixth day of January, 1985. Ahepans, we feel that our silence may be interpreted as tacit agreement by Greek-Americans concerning your comments.

Your support of the Soviet's explanation justifying their ruthless and inhumane destruction of the Korean Airlines commercial plane and alleging that it was on an American spy mission is of particular concern to us. Most nations, particularly those in NATO, including Greece, are aware that the United States has sufficient information sensors available and does not need to use commercial aircraft for this purpose. disappointing and ironic that of all the western democracies only the Greek government agreed with the Soviets' explanation. Additionally, Mr. Premier, you implied that the United States would have done the same thing to errant Soviet aircraft. It is a known fact that Soviet intruders have been intercepted, warned, and permitted to safely depart after penetrating American airspace.

Another concern that we must express is your apparent depreciation of the American contribution to prevent a communist military conquest of Greece following World War II. Ahepans and other Greek-Americans are acutely aware of the contributions

made by American military personnel during the bitter and destructive Civil War. American assistance in training and equipping the Greek armed forces was a critical factor in preventing the destruction of democracy and the establishment of a communist dictatorship in Greece. However, no mention was made regarding the enormous support to the insurgents by Soviet bloc countries. Fortunately, Mr. Premier, no Greek leader has had to make any mandatory pilgrimage to Moscow and thank the Soviets for their aid in overthrowing its democratically elected government.

As Americans of Greek heritage, we love the land of our fathers. It is hard for us to understand your support of a government which has invoked nothing but death and destruction to the Greek people.

We fully understand that your politically expedient anti-American remarks were made for local consumption, but to express your personal views on a national telecast to those same Americans whose tax monies and political influence have supported the democracy and security of Greece is an even greater outrage.

We sincerely believe that your comments are not shared by the majority of the citizens of Hellas. You may have found it politically advantageous at this time to play the two super-powers against each other. However, we feel you have committed inestimable and perhaps permanent damage to future Greek-American relations, especially in the Greek-American community which is in sympathy with the many problems facing Greece today.

As Ahepans, we collectively believe you owe Americans, especially the Greek-Americans, an apology for these biased and reckless anti-American statements. These are the same citizens who have been supportive of Greece, both financially and politically since its independence. Many of us feel you have not only demeaned and embarrassed us with many of your provocative remarks but have fueled anti-Americanism in Greece.

In closing, Mr. Premier, you know that in this world of turmoil and suspicion, America is the only country which has freely shared its wealth and good fortune with our beloved Greece. As a former American citizen, you are undoubtedly aware of this fact. His Excellency Premier Andreas Papandreou March 5, 1985 Page Three

Please do not spurn the outstretched hand of friendship with a clenched fist of rhetoric.

- 4. Dose not have regular meetings.
- 5. Refuses to participate in District projects.

The District Lodge has tried to resolve this matter but we have not been successful. That is why we are taking it to the Grievance Committee.

Dear Brother Marmas:

Please accept my apology for the delay in responding to your inquiry. I hope you find the information set forth in this letter to be helpful.

You indicate a chapter in your district refuses to pay per capita tax, declines visitations, and does not participate in district projects. You state, "They (the chapter) do not want any part of the District."

You inquire as to what can be done to resolve the situation. Specifically, you ask whether the chapter's charter can be revoked, whether the members may constitute a chapter at large, and whether the chapter may participate in a District or Supreme Convention.

The power to revoke a chapter charter is vested exclusively in the Supreme Lodge by Article VII, Section 4 of the Constitution of the Order of Ahepa. Article XXXIII, Section 2(b) provides a District Governor may suspend the charter of a chapter within his district for "justifiable cause." The latter action must be consented to by the District Lodge and Supreme President.

You have cited three examples of nonaction by the chapter. It should be determined whether these failures, individually or collectively, constitute "justifiable cause."

Under the Constitution, the onus for failure to pay per capita tax falls upon the individual member. Article XVI, Section 3 states that if "the Supreme Lodge has not received any per capita tax for twelve consecutive months for any member, such member shall be considered ipso facto suspended ..."
A suspended member loses his rights and privileges. Indeed, Article XVI, Section 1 states a member is delinquent if he is six months late in payment

of his dues. In that instance he can attend but not participate in a meeting. He cannot serve as a delegate to any convention. If every member in a chapter fails to pay his per capita for twelve consecutive months, the chapter is declared inactive by the Supreme Lodge.

The chapter secretary may be held accountable if a member pays his dues and the per capita tax is not remitted to the Supreme Lodge. The secretary must notify the Supreme Lodge of all dues monies collected pursuant to Article XIV, Section 1. Failure to do so may subject him to impeachment proceedings pursuant to Article XIII.

The failure of a chapter to accept visitations or to participate in district projects does not constitute justifiable cause for revocation of the chapter's charter. As reprehenisble as the lack of cooperation may be, the Constitution does not provide specific remedies. For example, if a chapter properly elects delegates to a district convention, and observes all other procedures as prescribed by the Constitution with respect to qualifying those delegates for credentials to the convention, the chapter may not be denied representation in the convention because of its failure to accept visitations or to participate in district programs.

A chapter may, however, be denied the benefits of any specific project if a precondition to receiving benefits is support of that project. For example, if a district publishes a newsletter which is supported by contributions from the district's chapters, the district may refuse to send the publication to any chapter which fails to provide financial support.

It should be noted financial assessments may not be imposed on a chapter by action of the district without the chapter's consent. Article X, Section 9 provides a chapter treasurer "shall pay out no moneys, unless so ordered by a majority vote of the members of the chapter present at a regular meeting, or unless provided for in the Constitution or Decrees of the Supreme Conventions.

You ask about membership at large. This status is limited to persons whose actual residence is not nearer than 50 miles from any chapter within the district. Moreover, since the Constitution places all chapters within districts, a chapter may not under present circumstances become a chapter at large.

In conclusion, with the exception of nonpayment of per capita tax, the causes stated in your letter do not appear to justify revocation or suspension of the chapter's charter. With respect to nonpayment of per capita, the Constitution's penalties are directed against the delinquent member(s) except in the instance of a secretary or treasurer who may be removed from office for failure to perform his duties, including the remitting of per capita tax to the Supreme Lodge.

It may be other causes exist in the present instance which have not been identified in your letter. If that is the case, please feel free to contact me for any assistance I can provide. Ultimately, however, any

proposed revocation or suspension of the chapter's charge must involve the Supreme President and Supreme Lodge.

It is to be noted that annual visitations alone are ineffective in guiding the local Chapters. The District Lodge should provide mailing data for former members so that they may be reinstated.
- 2) Each individual Chapter must maintain an active strong membership Committee.
- 3) Each individual Chapter must maintain a chapter publicity committee with a knowledgeable photographer.
- 4) The aforementioned membership and publicity committee are to be fostered and encouraged at every opportunity.
- 5) The District Lodge should encourage the local Chapters to establish visible realistic goals. These goals must be concentrated accordingly. They must be coordinated by the District Lodge. The key to the growth of Ahepa is the setting and attaining of visible and realistic goals. Only by maintaining and attaining goals which are worthwhile and for the betterman of our Community and our nation can we maintain our membership and attract new members. Should be noted that the sponsorship of Social functions should not be the goal of Ahepa but rather the result of the fellowship gained in working for common goals. Worthwhile goals which are recommended above.
 - a) The raising of funds for Philanthropic and charitable causes within the local community.
 - b) The involvement on a local level of the individual Chapters with Non-partisan political activities committee in conection with such civic involvements. Civic and community leaders should be invited as speakers at local Chapters meetings.
 - c) The encouragment of a strong athletic program for the youth of the District.

Growth and Expansion (continue)

6) The attaining of Ahepa goals on a local level requires that funds be expanded by the local chapters for Publicity and membership education.

On the other hand the funds raised by the Local Chapters for District Projects are submitted in total to the District Lodge accordingly. It is recommended that a fair share renumeration based on the gross income generated by and local Chapter for a District project be returned to that local chapter for expansion and growth perposed, excluding the District Scholarship fund.

Number 6 was tabled for the next District Convention.
