#### **GOLDEN GATE DISTRICT 21**

#### CONVENTION MINUTES

The 59th District Convention in Fresno California was called to order by Brother Jim Nicolaou, President of Fresno #151. He welcomed all the delegates and wished them a successful convention. Brother Nicolaou then introduced District Governor (DG) Nick Kapetan, Fresno #151, who also welcomed the delegates. DG Kapetan instructed Past District Governor (PDG) Chris Rockas, Fresno #151, to escort Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251, into the meeting room and seat him at the head table. DG Kapetan requested that the convention be dedicated to the brother Ahepans who have passed away since last year's convention (see Page 16).

DG Kapetan noted that Brother Aris Kufasimes, Sacramento #153, was ill and couldn't attend the convention this year. A card for Brother Kufasimes was circulated for the members to sign. DG Kapetan led the delegates in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. District Chaplain Nick Alevizos, Oakland #171, offered the opening prayer and requested a moment of silence for our departed brothers.

The first order of business was to elect convention officers. District Lieutenant Governor (DLtG) Mike Pappas, Stockton #212, nominated PDG George Marmas, Stockton #212, for Convention Chairman. The nomination was seconded by PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Marmas as Convention Chairman.

Brother Angelo Lygizos, Garden City #251, nominated Brother Gus Hazifotis, Garden City #251, for Convention Vice-Chairman. The nomination was seconded by District Warden Dennis Mouzakis, San Mateo #392. Brother Hazifotis declined the nomination. PDG John Koplos, Oakland #171, nominated Brother Ted Cuclis, Oakland #171, for Convention Vice-Chairman. The nomination was seconded by PDG George Bezaitis, Oakland #171. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Cuclis as Convention Vice-Chairman.

DLtG Mike Pappas, Stockton #212, nominated Brother George Booras, Oakland #171, for Convention Secretary. The nomination was seconded by Brother Gregg Kosmos, Oakland #171. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Booras as Convention Secretary.

The newly elected convention officers were given the oath of office by Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251.

Convention Chairman George Marmas, Stockton #212, appointed PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153, to be the Parliamentarian for the convention.

There were 33 delegates in attendance (unofficial count) at this time.

Vice-Chairman Ted Cuclis, Oakland #171, asked that the chapter reports be given at this time.

Golden Gate-Pacific #150 - James Patiris reporting. See Page 17 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Patiris.

<u>Fresno #151</u> - Bill Booras reporting. See Page 18 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Booras.

Sacramento #153 - Tony Diavatis reporting. See Page 19 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Diavatis.

Oakland #171 - Gregg Kosmos reporting. See Page 20 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Kosmos.

Stockton #212 Angelo Mitchell reporting. See Page 21 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Mitchell.

Solano County #217 - Arnold Dorer reporting. See Page 22 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Dorer.

Marysville #228 - Henry Cook reporting. See Page 23 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Cook.

<u>Modesto #246</u> - John Christy reporting. See Page 24 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Christy.

Garden City #251 - Angelo Lygizos reporting. See Page 25 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Lygizos.

Salinas Valley #253 - No report submitted since no delegates from the chapter were present at the convention.

<u>Contra Costa County #259</u> - No report presented since no delegates from the chapter were present at the convention.

Reno #281 - Alex Lemberes reporting. See Page 27 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Lemberes.

San Mateo County #392 - John Guy reporting. See Page 28 for report. Report accepted as read by Brother Guy.

Convention Chairman George Marmas, Stockton #212, called for the following standing committee and District Lodge officer reports:

<u>Legislative Banquet</u> - PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153, reported that the legislative Banquet was held on February 19, 1991 in Sacramento. See report on Page 29. Support from District 20 was very poor, with only one Ahepan and three Daughters present. The report was accepted as read by Brother Rotas.

Scholarship Financial Report - PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153, noted that the scholarship accounting has been reorganized this year. See report on Page 32. He also reported that American Savings had been withholding 20% tax since the Ahepa Headquarters non-profit organization number (#52012175) was not valid. The scholarship report on Page 32 excludes \$904 currently held by the I.R.S. PDG Rotas reported that District 21 now has its own non-profit organization tax ID number (#680249615). The report was accepted as read by Brother Rotas.

<u>District Chaplain's Report</u> - Given by Brother Nick Alevizos, Oakland #171. See report on Page 45. The report was accepted as read by Brother Alevizos.

<u>District Legal Advisor's Report</u> - PDG Chris Rockas, Fresno #151, reported that there were no legal problems in the district this year.

Scholarship Committee Report - Given by PDG Lou Janakos, San Mateo #392. See report on Page 46. PDG Janakos presented an award to Dr. Karl Konstantin, Oakland #171, former scholarship committee chairman. Brother Janakos displayed examples of the gold (\$1500) and silver (\$1000) scholarship awards. This year there were 23 applicants for 8 awards. Brother Janakos solicited the brother's participation in the "500 Club" for the benefit of the district scholarship program. The report was accepted as read by Brother Janakos.

The Friday morning business session was adjourned at 11:45 am.

The Friday afternoon business session was reconvened at 1:20 pm after the Delegate's Luncheon. Convention Chairman George Marmas, Stockton #212, called for the remaining district lodge officers reports.

<u>District Warden's Report</u> - Given by Brother Dennis Mouzakis, San Mateo #392. See report on Page 48. The report was accepted as read by Brother Mouzakis.

<u>District Athletic Director's Report</u> - Brother Dennis Mouzakis, San Mateo #392, reported that there were no athletic activities this year.

<u>District Treasurer's Report</u> - Given by District Treasurer George Komis, San Mateo #392, and District Auditor Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153. See report on Page 49. The report was accepted as read by Brothers Komis and Rotas.

<u>District Secretary's Report</u> - Given by Brother George Konstantopoulos, Oakland #171. See report on Page 50. The report was accepted as read by Brother Konstantopoulos.

<u>District Lieutenant Governor's Report</u> - Given by Brother Mike Pappas, Stockton #212. See report on Page 51. The report was accepted as read by Brother Pappas.

<u>District Governor's Report</u> - Given by Brother Nick Kapetan, Fresno #151. See report on Page 52. Brother Kapetan gave special commendations to the Solano, Marysville, and Reno chapters for their outstanding efforts as small chapters to get their members involved. Brother Kapetan recommended that the chapters elect district convention delegates in April and send the names to the district secretary by May 10th. The report was accepted as read by Brother Kapetan, with the recommendation forwarded to the appropriate convention committee. The District Governor was commended for a job well done by Tony Diavatis, Sacramento #153, and Angelo Lygizos, Garden City #251.

<u>Supreme Governor's Report</u> - Given by Brother Gust Aretos, Garden City #251. See report on Page 56. The report was accepted as read by Brother Aretos.

<u>District Public Relations/Rules & Regulations Committee Report</u> - Given by PDG John Koplos, Oakland #171. See report on Page 57. The report was accepted as read by Brother Koplos.

Convention Chairman George Marmas, Stockton #212, read the names of the various convention committees. All committees were instructed to meet Friday afternoon and be ready to report on Saturday morning. DG Nick Kapetan, Fresno #151, read a summary of the motions from the last district convention so that the committee chairmen could be prepared to act on any outstanding motions.

<u>Special Scholarship Announcement</u> - Scholarship Committee Chairman Lou Janakos, San Mareo #392, announced that Brother Steve Jordan, Sacramento #153, had just made a \$10,000 donation to the scholarship fund in his and his father's names.

The Friday afternoon session was adjourned at 2:15 pm.

The Saturday morning business session was called to order by Convention Chairman George Marmas, Stockton #212, at 9:05 am. The Chairman called for the following convention committee reports:

Convention Cities Report - Given by PDG Anthony Maris, Sacramento #153. See report on Page 58. The only chapter to bid for the 1993 convention was San Mateo #392. The committee recommended that San Mateo's bid be accepted. A review of previous minutes indicated that Modesto #246 was interested in hosting a convention, but no delegates from the Modesto chapter were present at the meeting. The committee agreed to discuss hosting the 1994 convention with the Modesto delegates and report back to the convention later in the day.

Sacramento #153 was awarded the Fall Conference and Garden City #251 (San Jose) was awarded the Spring Conference in 1992.

Acceptance of the Convention Cities Report was deferred until the committee contacted the Modesto chapter. See continuation of the Convention City Report on Page 7.

Growth & Expansion Report - Given by Gregg Kosmos, Oakland #171. See report on Page 59. An additional suggestion was made from the floor by John Guy, San Mateo #392. Brother Guy said that PDG Lou Janakos, San Mateo #392, made a brochure with a brief Ahepa history and an application form. These were passed out at the Church Festival, where the Ahepans had a booth to take the applications and answer questions. The Growth & Expansion Committee's report was accepted as read by Brother Kosmos.

Sons of Pericles Report - Given by PDG Agamemnon Zafiratos, Oakland #171. See report on Page 60. The committee recommended that the two existing Sons of Pericles chapters (San Francisco and Oakland) be reinstated and that the chapters present a report to the district lodge within 30 days. DG Nick Kapetan read a letter from Ahepa Headquarters that was addressed to the District 21 Sons of Pericles Chapter Presidents. The letter said that the Sons were now operating illegally and that they must elect a district lodge and participate in district conventions in order to be reinstated. Reasons for the current lack of interest in the Sons of Pericles were debated. Brother Arnold Dorer, Solano #217, offered to help Brother Zafiratos draft a resolution regarding the Sons of Pericles for adoption by the convention.

Scholarship Committee Report - Given by Brother Harry Kalargiros, Garden City #251. PDG Lou Janakos, San Mateo #392, and his executive scholarship committee had prepared written by-laws for adoption by the convention. See scholarship by-laws on Page 61. The proposed by-laws were read by Brother Gus Hazifotis, Garden City #251.

PDG Anthony Maris, Sacramento #153, made a motion to delete the clause allowing grandparents to sponsor their grandchildren for Ahepa scholarships. The motion was seconded and approved. PDG George Bezaitis, Oakland #171, made a motion to reconsider the deletion of the grandparent clause. The motion was seconded, but was defeated.

Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251, made a motion to table the adoption of the scholarship by-laws until the next district convention so that the scholarship committee could distribute copies of the proposed by-laws to the chapters for review and comment. The motion to table was seconded and approved.

Resolutions Committee Report - Given by Brother Charles Spyropoulos, Oakland #171. See report on Page 64. Resolution VIII, which would increase the number

of district convention delegates for each chapter from 4 to 6, will be presented to the Legislative Committee at the National Ahepa Convention since it requires a change in the Ahepa by-laws. The Resolutions Committee was accepted as read by Brother Spyropoulos.

<u>Ahepa Traveler Report</u> - Given by Brother John Christy, Modesto #246. See report on Page 67. The report was accepted as read by Brother Christy.

<u>Athletic Committee Report</u> - Given by Brother Angelo Mitchell, Stockton #212. See report on Page 69. The report was accepted as read by Brother Mitchell.

<u>By-Laws Committee Report</u> - Brother Ted Efstratis, Marysville #228, indicated that he had no report to present since other reports had already suggested by-laws changes (for example, the proposed increase in number of district convention delegates).

Grievance Committee Report - Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251, was pleased to report that no grievances were filed. See report on Page 70.

<u>Audit Committee Report</u> - Given by PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153. See report on Page 71. The report was accepted as read by Brother Rotas.

Budget & Finance Committee Report - Given by Brother Arnold Dorer, Solano #217. See report on Page 72. Past Supreme Secretary Andy Banis, Oakland #171, made a motion to add a line item under the expenditures for a \$1000 District 21 Ahepa Scholarship. Motion was seconded and approved.

PDG Karl Konstantin, Oakland #171, made a motion to increase the Sons of Pericles allowance from \$200 to \$400. Motion was seconded and approved.

Past Supreme Secretary Andy Banis, Oakland #171, made a motion to add a line item under the expenditures for the National Ahepa Charitable Foundation. The total amount would be \$1000 and could be made in several installments. Motion was seconded. PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153 made a motion to amend the Banis motion to specify a minimum contribution of \$200 per year for the next 5 years. The amendment was seconded and approved. The main motion was then approved.

The Budget Committee Report was accepted as amended by the convention delegates. See report on Page 72 for changes to budget.

The Saturday morning business session was adjourned for lunch at 12 noon.

The Saturday afternoon business session was called to order by Convention Vice-Chairman Ted Cuclis, Oakland #171. Brother Cuclis called for a continuation of the convention committee reports.

Board of Directors Report - PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153, indicated that he had nothing to report.

<u>District Ahepan, Chapter, and President of the Year Report</u> - DG Nick Kapetan, Fresno #151, announced the district lodge selections for the following awards:

Ahepan of the Year - James Fotes, Fresno #151

<u>Chapter of the Year</u> - Sacramento #153 and Garden City #251 were selected as co-recipients of this award for the second straight year.

<u>President of the Year</u> - Angelo Lygizos, Garden City #251, was selected as the first recipient of this new award.

See Page 74 for DG Kapetan's report.

Convention Cities Report - (Continued from Saturday morning) PDG Anthony Maris, Sacramento #153, reported that Modesto does want to host the 1994 District Convention. Reno also wanted to bid for the 1994 convention. Tony Diavatis, Sacramento #153, made a motion to award the 1994 convention to Modesto and to consider awarding the 1995 convention to Reno at the next district convention. He noted that the 1995 convention city cannot be awarded until the 1992 district convention. The motion was seconded. Reno offered to take the 1994 convention if Modesto could not host it for some reason. Brother Diavatis withdrew the Reno portion of his motion, and Modesto was awarded the 1994 District Convention.

Modesto also expressed an interest in hosting the 1991 Fall Conference. The convention delegates approved changing the 1991 Fall Conference from Sacramento to Modesto.

The Convention Cities report was accepted as amended.

Special Projects Report - Given by PDG Paul Eliopoulos, Golden Gate-Pacific #150. See report on Page 75. Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251, recommended that the raffle prizes be distributed differently next year. He suggested that two early bird drawings (\$1000 each) be held around March 1st and May 1st. The winning tickets would then go back into the bin for the main raffle. The early bird raffle would be run by the Ahepa and Daughters of Penelope District Lodges. The first drawing could be held at the Spring Conference. PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153, made a motion to accept the recommendation of Supreme Governor Aretos. The motion was seconded and approved. The Special Projects report was accepted as amended by the convention delegates.

Convention Chairman George Marmas, Stockton #212, recognized PDG George Bezaitis, Oakland #171. Brother Bezaitis once again made a motion to allow

grandparents who are Ahepans to sponsor their grandchildren for Ahepa scholarships. The motion was seconded and Brother Bezaitis asked for a roll call vote. A roll call vote was taken by the Convention Secretary. The motion was defeated by a vote of 25 to 21 with 4 abstentions.

Past Supreme Secretary Andrew Banis, Oakland #171, addressed the convention. He praised DG Nick Kapetan and Supreme Governor Gust Aretos for their outstanding work during the past year. Brother Banis announced that there were no candidates for supreme office from District 21 this year, since he decided for personal reasons not to run for Supreme Vice-President. He noted, however, that District 21 is very well respected by the Supreme Lodge.

Good of the Order - Brother Angelo Lygizos, Garden City #251, spoke in support of the Ahepa scholarship program.

<u>District Governor's Report</u> - (Continued from Friday afternoon) DG Nick Kapetan, Fresne #151, made a motion to accept his recommendation that district convention delegates be elected in April (See Page 54 for the District Governor's Recommendations). The motion was seconded and approved. PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento #153, noted that this recommendation doesn't have to go to the National Ahepa Convention since the Ahepa by-laws state that elections should be held in April or May.

Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251, addressed the convention and presented an award from Ahepa Headquarters to DG Nick Kapetan. Several of the delegates also praised the District Governor for a job well done.

<u>Daughters of Penelope Liaison Committee Report</u> - Given by John Guy, San Mateo #392. See report on Page 76. The report was accepted as read by Brother Guy.

Past Supreme Secretary Andrew Banis, Oakland #171, made a motion to open the nominations for the scholarship committee and district lodge offices, with elections to follow completion of the last remaining business item (Report by DOP DG Niki Lenes). Motion was seconded and approved.

Nominations for District Governor - DLtG Mike Pappas, Stockton #212, nominated Brother Nick Kapetan, Fresno #151, for the office of District Governor. Brother Kapetan declined and in turn nominated Brother Mike Pappas. Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251, seconded the nomination. The nominations for District Governor were closed.

Nominations for District Lieutenant Governor - Charles Spyropoulos, Oakland #171, nominated Brother George Konstantopoulos, Oakland #171, for the office of District Lieutenant Governor. Brother George Thodos, San Mateo #392, seconded the nomination. The nominations for District Lieutenant Governor were closed.

Nominations for District Secretary - James Hadres, San Mateo #392, nominated Brother George Komis, San Mateo #392, for the office of District Secretary. Brother Peter Kireopoulos, Golden Gate-Pacific #150, seconded the nomination. The nominations for District Secretary were closed.

Nominations for District Treasurer - PDG George Bezaitis, Oakland #171, nominated Brother Ted Cuclis, Oakland #171, for the office of District Treasurer. Brother Tony Diavatis, Sacramento #153, seconded the nomination. The nominations for District Treasurer were closed.

Nominations for District Marshal - PDG George Bezaitis, Oakland #171, nominated Brother George Booras, Oakland #171, for the office of District Marshal. Brother Ted Cuclis, Oakland #171, seconded the nomination. The nominations for District Marshal were closed.

Nominations for District Warden and Athletic Director - PDG Lou Janakos, San Mateo #392, nominated Brother Dennis Mouzakis, San Mateo #392, for the office of District Warden and Athletic Director. DG Nick Kapetan, Fresno #151, seconded the nomination. The nominations for District Warden and Athletic Director were closed.

Nominations for Scholarship Committee - Ted Cuclis, Oakland #171, submitted his resignation from the scholarship committee in order to run for the office of District Treasurer. Scholarship Committee Chairman Lou Janakos, San Mateo #392, appointed Harry Kalargiros, Garden City #251, to fill the remaining 3 years of Brother Cuclis' term. Nominations were then opened to fill two four-year positions on the scholarship committee.

PDG Lou Janakos, San Mateo #392, nominated Brother John Guy, San Mateo #392. Past Supreme Secretary Andrew Banis, Oakland #171, seconded the nomination.

PDG Lou Janakos, San Mateo #392, nominated DG Nick Kapetan, Fresno #151. Brother Kapetan declined the nomination.

PDG Anthony Maris, Sacramento #153, nominated Brother Tony Diavatis, Sacramento #153. District Secretary George Konstantopoulos, Oakland #171, seconded the nomination.

The nominations for scholarship committee were closed.

Daughters of Penelope District Governor's Report - DOP DG Niki Lenes, Urania #290, addressed the Ahepa delegates at 4:40 pm. She noted that the Daughters had also recommended increasing the number of district convention delegates for each chapter from 4 to 6. Sister Lenes announced that the Reno trip would include a one night stay in Reno and that the DG's would arrange a joint visitation during the Reno trip.

Election of District Officers and Scholarship Committee - Past Supreme Secretary Andrew Banis, Oakland #171, made a motion to instruct the Convention Secretary to cast a unanimous ballot for all of the candidates, with all rules waived. Angelo Lygizos, Garden City #251, seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, Garden City #251, gave the oath of office to the newly elected District Lodge Officers and Scholarship Committee members.

Newly elected District Governor Mike Pappas, Stockton #212, thanked the delegates for electing him to the office of District Governor.

Convention Chairman George Marmas, Stockton #212, thanked the Fresno Chapter for their hospitality and congratulated their convention committee for a job well done.

District Chaplain Nick Alevizos, Oakland #171, gave the closing prayer. The 59th District 21 Convention was adjourned at 4:55 pm.



ATTACHMENT TO DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S REPORT TO THE 59th DISTRICT CONVENTION:

### RECOMMENDATIONS

The Order of Ahepa Constitution states that Delegates and Alternates to the Supreme and District Convention are to be elected during the month of March, April or May. Results of the District Convention elected Delegates/Alternates are to be sent to the District Secretary immediately or at least (20) days prior to the opening of the District Convention.

In the instance of the Supreme Convention Delegates/Alternates results are to arrive at Ahepa Headquarters post marked no later than June 1st. Recognizing that the Supreme Convention is on a magnitude much greater than the District Convention, one must also acknowledge that there are several full time paid employees to get the information out to the Delegates in the 9-10 week period.

The District is not blessed with full time compensated employees and are required to provide the Delegates information in less than 3 weeks. This short period of time creates a great hardship on the District Convention Host Chapter.

MOTION: THAT DELEGATES/ALTERNATES FOR THE DISTRICT CONVEN-TION BE ELECTED IN APRIL AND THE ELECTION RESULTS SENT TO THE DISTRICT SECRETARY NO LATER THAN MAY 10TH. THE DISTRICT SECRETARY WILL IN TURN SEND ALL DELEGATE/ALTERNATE ELECTION FORMS (COMPLETED) TO THE CONVENTION HOST CHAPTER NO LATER THAN MAY 15.

This procedure should do much to enhance the planning and success of future District Conventions.

Discuss Admin. of the Ahepa Family Charities Raffle with the Past District Governors. Determine if there is a more efficient method of administratively conducting the raffle each year. Must have the revenue to effectively operate the District Lodge.

# Proposed Scholarship By-Laws\*

- 1. The Scholarship Committee members shall be elected by the District Convention.
  - a. The member's tenure of office will be for a period of four years.
  - b. The Scholarship Committee will be composed of seven elected members and the current District Governor.
  - c. Committee members may not serve more than two consecutive terms on the Scholarship Committee.
- 2. If a member of the committee cannot serve out his term of office, the Scholarship Committee will select a replacement to finish out the vacancy.
- If a member of the committee misses three consecutive regular meetings without a valid excuse, the committee by a five man vote may remove said member and appoint another member to finish the existing term of office.
- 4. Scholarship Committee must hold its meeting by August 1st.
  - a. Scholarship Officers to be elected by the committee shall be publicized.
  - b. Chairman and Treasurer's names, addresses, and telephone numbers shall appear in the Traveler and other publications.
- 5. It shall be the duty of all Scholarship Committee members to encourage and publicize the District Scholarship program throughout District 21.
- 6. The Scholarship Committee will administer the scholarship funds by investing them in insured savings instruments and accounts.
- 7. The Scholarship Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be voted by members of the committee. The tenure of office will be for a period of one year. It is advisable to have some members in the field of education. If a member does not perform his duties as defined in the by-laws, he may be removed from office prior to his tenured time by a majority vote of the Scholarship Committee.

<sup>\*</sup> Transcribed from audio tapes by the Convention Secretary. Note that the adoption of these proposed scholarship by-laws was <u>tabled</u> by the convention delegates.

- 8. The duties of the Scholarship Chairman and Secretary shall be as follows and not limited to:
  - Maintenance of records, to include incoming processed applications for scholarships, active files of students in school, records on progress of graduates.
  - b. Will publicize the scholarship winners in the Traveler, the Ahepan magazine, newspapers, and bulletins.
  - c. Maintain all donation records and record chapter participation.
- 9. The Scholarship Committee shall present a written report to the District Lodge at the meeting immediately preceding the District Convention, indicating the funds available for each scholarship and the current financial status. District Lodge to notify the Chairman as to the specific meeting date, approximately 20 days prior to the District Convention.
- 10. At a written publicized Scholarship Committee meeting, the committee must have at least five voting members present, two of which can be proxy voters.
- 11. The Scholarship Committee will continually endeavor to promote and seek funds for the Ahepa Scholarship Fund.
  - a. By direct appeal.
  - b. By appeal through the Ahepa Traveler.
  - c. By other methods as decided by the committee.
- 12. To establish a perpetual titled scholarship, hereunder, a minimum of \$5,000 is required.
- 13. To establish a one-time titled scholarship, a minimum of \$1000 is required.
- 14. Each Chapter President shall be a Scholarship Chairman within their chapter whose duty it will be to publicize the District Scholarship program throughout his jurisdiction. Those Chapters that have a member of the chapter on the Scholarship Committee shall automatically be the Scholarship Chairman in their chapter. Chapter Presidents may also choose someone to act as his chairman.

- 15. The District Lieutenant Governor may attend meetings, without voting privileges.
- 16. Applicants for undergraduate scholarships will be selected from high school graduates who are about to enter an accredited institution of higher learning, or who are already in such an accredited institution.
- 17. The applicant must produce evidence for scholarly achievement in order to receive scholarship consideration.
- 18. An applicant for a scholarship must be a resident of District 21, and be a member of the Ahepa family, or the son or daughter of a member of the Ahepa or Daughters of Penelope in District 21. The member must be in good standing for a period of two years from the date of initiation or reinstatement prior to their son or daughter applying for a scholarship.
- 19. Applications for scholarship must be filed on or before April 15th of each calendar year.
- 20. The committee shall send at least one copy of the scholarship application to each chapter by the 1st of January.
- 21. The scholarship awards given in any chapter in District 21 shall be presented to the committee by the District Convention.
- 22. Students who have grandparents, step-parents, or legal guardians who are members in good standing for a period of two years in the Order of Ahepa will be eligible to apply.
- 23. Sons or daughters of a deceased Ahepan or Daughter may apply and be eligible based on the parent's prior membership.
- 24. Students may receive only one award, undergraduate or graduate.
