CONVENTION MINUTES

The 63rd Annual District Convention hosted by the San Jose AHEPA family at the Sunnyvale Hilton Hotel, Sunnyvale, Ca. was called to order by Convention Chairman Bro. Steve Bolaris at 9:45 AM on Friday, June 23, 1995. Bro. Bolaris welcomed all the Delegates and wished them success in their deliberations. Bro. Bolaris turned the gavel over to Distr. Gov. Ted Cuolis. Bro. Cuolis had Bro. Nick Smith, Distr. Chaplain start the business session with a prayer, and then asked for nominations for convention chairman.

Bro. Jim Nicolaou nominated PDG Nick Kapetan, Fresno Chapter 151, for Conv. Chm. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for PDG Nick Kapetan for Convention Chairman.

PDG Bill Rotas nominated PDG Mike Pappas, Stockton Chapter 212, for Conv. Vice Chm. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for PDG Mike Pappas for Conv. Vice Chairman.

PDG Mike Pappas nominated Bro. Bill Booras, Fresno Chapter 151, for Conv. Sect. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for Bro. Bill Booras as Conv. Secretary.

PDG and Chm. of The Board of Dir. Gus Aretos administered the oath of office to the newly elected convention officers.

Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan thanked the delegates for electing him as Conv. Chm. Bro. Kapetan made the following appointments: PDG Chris Rockas, Fresno Chapter 151, Conv. Parliamentarian. Bro Stavros Kalomiris, Fresno, Chapter 151, as Marshall. Bro. Steve Houvardas, Fresno Chapter 151, as Inside Sentinel.

Bro. Kapetan suggested, with the approval of the body, that there will not be any fines at this convention for the Scholarship Fund. All discussions on motions will be limited to 10 min. on any item and each delegate will be allowed to speak on the motion for one minute. Bro. Kapetan suggested that to keep the meetings going smooth, we should try and keep the side remarks at a minimum.

Bro. Gus Hontalas, San Jose Chapter 251, was appointed as Conv. Credentials Chm. Bro. ## DISTRICT LODGE REPORTS

DISTRICT CHAPLAIN: Bro. Nicholas Smith, San Jose Chapter #251, reported, with the written copy on page 36.

DISTRICT MARSHALL: Bro. Arnold Dorer, Solano Chapter #217, reported that there was an overload of work thrust upon him at his place of employment, he therefore was not able to make any of the Distr. Lodge Chapter visitations. When elected in 1994 he promised the Delegates to give back \$50.00 for each visitation that he was not able to attend. Since he was not able to make any visitations Bro. Dorer presented a check for \$300 to be given to the Distr. Lodge Officers travel allowance. PDG Bill Rotas moved that we waive the promise that was made by Bro. Arnold Dorer, at the 1994 Distr. Conv. PDG Nick Kapetan 2nd. the motion. Motion passed. Conv. Vice Chm. Mike Pappas said that the only way the Distr. Conv. could accept Bro. Dorer's check was to give the \$300 check to the Distr. Scholarship Fund. Bro. Dorer agreed and gave the check to the Scholarship Comm.

DISTRICT TREASURER: Bro. Alex Lemberes, Reno Chapter #281, reporting. For written report see page 37. Report accepted as presented. Auditors found all records and procedures in order.

DISTRICT SECRETARY: Bro. Charles Spyropoulos, Oakland Chapter #171, reported, with the written report on page 39. Bro. Charles Spyropoulos reminded the Chapter Secretaries to submit the National Headquarters billing with each per capita payment. He also requested that Chapter Secretaries must send Distr. Conv. reports in by May 10, as passed in previous Distr. Conv. It was also suggested from the body that Distr. Lodge mailings should be sent to the Chapter Presidents and the Secretaries.

DISTRICT LT. GOVERNOR: Bro. George Booras, Oakland Chapter #171, reported, with the written report on page 40.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR: Bro. Ted Cuclis, Oakland Chapter #171, reported, with the written report on page 41.

Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan at this time requested that the 63rd Distr. Convention be held in memory of our recently departed Brothers. See page for a list of deceased Brothers.

Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan introduced PDG and Chm. of The Board of Directors, Gus Aretos, San Jose Chapter #251, to explain the situation at National Headquarters. On August 3, 1992, Gus Gekas and Wanagan Hairabedian applied for a Certificate to Amend the name "Order of AHEPA Education Foundation, Inc." They also changed the name to "The Order of American Hellenic Progressive Association". They were running two parallel corporations. By working the two corporations they were able to take approximately \$3,063,418.00. The possible chance of recovery maybe can reach 1 to 2 million dollars. They took credit cards under the names of the officers, forged names and accumulated a dept of \$200,000.00.

## BOARD OF DIRECTORS REPORT: (Cont.)

Some of the credit cards had a "no limit" on purchases. The property that was uncovered is worth approx. \$3 million with a \$1 million dollar mortgage. At many of the Nat. Conv. the auditors would bring in reports close to the end of business, and many questions from the floor went unanswered. Requests for documents were never received. The CPA's that were auditing the AHEPA books were also auditing the private accounts of Gekas, Hairabedian, and Planet-10. Planet-10 is the group of owners for the property which includes Hairabedian and the Saudi Arabian investors. The auditors did finally turned over 1700 documents for investigation. Lawyers fee's to date have cost the AHEPA approx. \$76,000.00. Many of the chapters are not sending in their per capita tax, which is needed at Headquarters. Basil Moosaides offered to stay at headquarters until November. He also will send in a resume. Bro. Aggie Capsalis has been doing the accounting for the AHEPA HQ.

PDG Andy Banis, Oakland Chapter #171, on behalf of all the Bros. of Distr. #21 congratulated Bro. Gus Aretos for his diligent work in trying to resolve the problem at AHEPA NAT. HEADQUARTERS. There was a standing ovation for Bro. Aretos.

Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan called for a roll call of all Conv. Delegates. The voting strength of the morning session was 42 Delegates. The after noon session was to meet at 1:30 PM and all committees were to meet and have their reports ready for the Sat. session. The meeting was adjourned at 12 noon to attend the Delegates Luncheon.

There was no afternoon session other than the various committee meetings.

The Saturday session was called to order by the Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan at 9:30 A.M. There was a roll call of Conv. Delegates with 33 Delegates in attendance. Conv. Chm. called for committee reports.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: PDG Lou Janakos, Chm. of the scholarship committee reported. For written report see page 33. Report approved as presented.

DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: Report given by Bro. Harry Kalargiros, San Jose Chapter #251. Report approved as presented. See page 59 for written report.

ATHLETIC COMMITTEE: Bro. Richard Taylor, Fresno Chapter #151, reported. For written report see page 62. Report approved as presented.

CONVENTION CITIES AND CONFERENCES COMMITTEE: PDG George Margelos reporting. See written report on page 45. The 64th Annual Dist. Convention will be hosted by the Stockton Chapter #212 for 1996. Bro. Margelos advised the body that he had no requests for the spring or fall conferences as well as no host city for the 1997 District Convention. He did have a suggestion from Bishop Anthony that we could use St. Nicholas ranch for a Distr. Conv. Bro. Margelos suggested that if any Ahepa and Daughters Chapter present could get together to agree on having the 1997 Convention it would make it much easier for the new Distr. Lodge. PDG Nick Kapetan volunteered the Fresno Chapter #151 to host the Fall Distr. Conference. PDG Andy Banis also volunteered the Oakland Chapter #171 for the Spring Distr. Confr. in conjunction with the Scholarship Dinner Dance, but he did need prior approval for the Oakland Daughters. Comm. Chm. Margelos asked body to approve the Fall Distr. Confr. in Fresno. Approved. He also urged Bros. to try and come up with a host city chapter for the 1997 Distr. Conv Report to be finalized in the afternoon session.

GROWTH AND EXPANSION: Bro. Ilias Frangos, San Mateo Chapter #392 reporting. See written report on page 57. Report approved as presented.

BOARD OF ADVISORS COMMITTEE: PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento Chapter #153, reporting. The committee is composed of PDG and are there in an advisory capacity. See page 64 for the written report. The report was approved as presented.

RULES AND BY LAWS COMMITTEE: PDG Nick Kapetan, Fresno Chapter #151, reporting. To date he has not come up with any corrections or additions, but vowed that with the other PDG, some legislation will be presented by the next convention. Sister Irene Margelos took it upon herself to update the Guide Lines that we have been using. The few minor clarifications made were approved as presented.

SPECIAL PROJECTS COMMITTEE: Bro. Jim Nicolaou, Fresno Chapter #151 reporting. For written report see page 53. Report approved as presented.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE: Bro. Greg Scandalis, Marysville Chapter #228, reporting. For written report see page 43. Report approved as presented.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE: Bro. George Johnson, Oakland Chapter #171 reporting. See page 60 for written report. Items 1 thru 4 approved as presented. Item 6 is in regards to Distr. 21 obtaining the 2nd class mailing permit. See written report on page . Note: It is now required that all per capita tax payments to Distr. Lodge HQ. include the Nat. HQ. billing print out. New member applicants must have a copy of the membership applications along with copy of new members check to the Distr. Secretary.



## RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT(cont.)

The new Distr. Gov. along with the Distr. Lodge will make sure that all Chapter Pres. and Secretaries will abide by this requirement so that Distr. 21 can maintain the 2nd class mailing permit. Item 6 approved as presented.

Item 5: Vote of confidence for PDG Andy Banis. Bro. Andy Banis related the past history of his involvement with the Order of AHEPA and why he is seeking the office of Supreme President. A secret ballot was called for. Conv. Vice Chm. Mike Pappas appointed Bros. Arnold Dorer and Alex Lemberes as tellers for resolution #5. There were 43 yes votes and 4 no votes. Resolution passed.

LEGISLATION COMMITTEE: Anastasios Piliotis, Oakland Chapter #171 reporting. See page 63 for the written report. Report approved as presented.

Reconsideration of previous motion: Bro. Gus Hazifotis wish to reconsider his vote on last item of Special Projects report which was the request from Bishop Anthony for the refurbishment of the AHEPA lodge at the St. Nicholas Ranch. Steve Bolaris 2nd the motion for reconsideration. Motion failed.

Bro. George Douveas, Contr Costa Chapter #259, Son's of Pericles Advisor reported on the Distr. 21 Son's progress. He thanked the Bros. for allowing him and the Son's to be present. All they ask is to continue the support that the Ahepa Chapters have been giving. They are working on re-instating the Sacramento and the Fresno Son's Chapters. Present were the newly initiated Son's from the Contra Costa Chapter. Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan asked that the new Son's introduce themselves. Bro. Douveas asked if there were any questions from the Delegates. Bro. Ilias Frangos, San Mateo Chapter #392 asked Bro. Douveas what is happening with the San Mateo/Belmont Son's of Pericles. Bro. Douveas deferred that question to Supreme President Tassos Konstantin. Bro. Konstantin related that the San Mateo/Belmont Son's only participation this year was their participation in the Regional Basketball Tournament in Seattle. The Son's have been given notice that they must sponsor a local event before this Nat. Conv. or cease to exist. Bro. Konstantin re-affirmed that he will help them as much as possible to get them re-activated legally.

SON'S OF PERICLES COMMITTEE: PDG Karl Konstantin, Oakland Chapter #171, reporting. See pages 55 for written report. Report was accepted as presented.

CONVENTION CITIES FINAL REPORT: Bro. Anastasios Piliotis reported that he was above to talk to the Oakland Daughters of Penelope and that they were in agreement to help host the Spring District Conference. Since there were no Chapters willing to commit for the 1997 Distr. Conv. Chm. George Margelos recommends that the new District Lodge inquire during their visitations for a host chapter for the 1997 Distr. Conv.

AHEPAN OF THE YEAR COMMITTEE: Jr. PDG Ted Cuclis, Oakland Chapter #171 reported. The committee composed of the District Lodge selected BROTHER PAUL ELIOPOULOS, San Francisco Chapter #150, as the AHEPAN OF THE YEAR, 1995-1996. Chapter of the Year award went to the FRESNO CHAPTER #151. President of the Year award went to RICHARD "BUD" TAYLOR, Fresno Chapter #151. \* At this time PDG Chris Rockas, Fresno Chapter #151, moved that since the Fresno Chapter is so progressive that we should go historically back and change the Fresno Chapter number from 151 to Fresno Chapter #150. Bro. Steve Houvardas 2nd the motion. Motion passed with very few no votes. See page 55 for the written report.

AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT: Bro. Arnold Dorer, Solano Chapter #217, reporting. PDG Gus Aretos has raised much concern on auditing, that the committee verified that all documents concerning the Distr. accounting were correct. The comm. reviewed the records of the Distr. Treasurer, Alex Lemberes, and found all procedures and accounting principles in order. Distr. Auditor, PDG Bill Rotas reviewed the Scholarship Fund Account and were also found to be in order.

Lt. Distr. Gov. George Booras made the following recommendations for the Traveler: Increase Travelers share from the Charitable Raffle proceeds from 20% to 25%. Increase per capita tax income for Traveler from \$2.50 to \$3.00. Increase Daughters share of the Traveler from \$1200.00 to \$1500.00. The net affect of these recommendations will increase the Traveler income by \$900.00. Bro. Dorer opened discussion on the proposed budget. PDG Karl Konstantin moved that we accept the 1995-1996 Budget as presented by the committee. PDG Chris Rockas 2nd the motion.

Jr. PDG Ted Cuclis moved that the Distr. Conv. donate \$500.00 towards the Atlanta Statue Comm. PDG Gus Aretos 2nd the motion. Motion passed. Bro. Leo Malliarys, Oakland Chapter #171, informed the Budget Comm. that the totals presented were in error. The Comm. verified that the computer had made an error. The totals were corrected as noted. Bro. Anastasios Piliotis, Oakland Chapter #171 moved that we add to line item for the Son's of Pericles a sum of \$400.00. PDG Karl Konstantin 2nd the motion. Motion passed. PDG Angelo Mountanos, San Francisco Chapter #150 suggested that we should not give the \$400 to the Son's Distr. Lodge. They should make requests thru the Son's Advisor and the distr. Lodge before any monies is given. Motion was passed along with the suggestion by Bro. Angelo Mountanos.

BUDGET/AUDIT COMMITTEE: (Cont.)

The budget was passed with all the amendments. See page 67 for the written reports.

LIAISON COMMITTEE: Jr. PDG Ted Cuclis, Oakland Chapter #171, reported. The fee increases for the Traveler have been approved. See page 66 for written report. Report approved as presented.

GOOD of the ORDER: PDG Mike Pappas suggested that it would be a good idea if all the Delegates from Distr. 21 going to the Nat. Conv. would wear the white polo shirt similar to the ones from the Fresno Chapter.

Bro. Lou Phillips, San Francisco Chapter #150, suggested that the donors of the various Scholarship awards be shown on the program for the Grand Banquet. Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan requested that the start times of the meetings in the agenda be changed to 9:00 AM. The Conv. Year Book should also show the correct times. PDG Bill Rotas informed the body that the agenda is going to be revised and will be corrected for the next convention. It was also suggested that proof reading of the agenda should be done more carefully. PDG Mike Pappas commended the author and style of the Memorial Page.

NOMINATIONS FOR DISTRICT WARDEN: There were no nominations for the office of Distr. Warden. The new Distr. Lodge will appoint the Warden.

NOMINATIONS FOR DISTRICT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR. There were no nominations for the office of Distr. Athletic Director. The new Distr. Lodge will appoint the Athletic Director.

NOMINATIONS FOR DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: Nominated members will serve a 4 year term. Bro. Harry Kalargiros nominated Bro. Lambros Panayotopoulos, San Jose Chapter #251. PDG Gus Aretos nominated Bro. Gus Hazifotis, San Jose Chapter #251. Bro. PDG Karl Konstantin nominated PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento Chapter #153. PDG Ted Cuclis nominated Anastasios Piliotis, Oakland Chapter #171. PDG Bill Rotas nominated PDG John Koplos, Oakland Chapter #171. PDG John Koplos nominated PDG Ted Cuclis, Oakland Chapter #171. 

II. SCHOLARSHIP General Guide Lines

1. The scholarship committee members shall be elected by the District Convention.

a. The members tenure of office will be for a period of four years.

b. The committee will be composed of seven elected members and the current District Governor.

c. Committee members will not serve more than two consecutive terms on the committee.

2. If a committee man cannot serve out his term of office, the committee will select a replacement to finish out the vacancy.

3. If a committee member misses three consecutive regular meetings without a valid excuse, the committee by a five man vote may remove said member and appoint another member to finish the term of office.

4. The committee must hold its first meeting by August first.

a. Officers elected by this committee shall be publicized.

b. The Chairmens and Treasurer names shall appear in the Traveler.

5. It shall be the duty of the committee members to publicize the Scholarship program throughout the District.

6. The committee will administer the scholarship funds by investing them in "insured" savings institutions and accounts.

7. The chairman, vice chairman, secretary and treasurer shall be voted by committee members for a term of one year. If a member does not perform his duties, they may be removed from office by a majority vote of committee.

\* a. Chairman may not serve more than ~~three~~<sup>TWO</sup> consecutive years.

8. Duties of the Chairman and Secretary shall be , but not limited to:

a. Maintanance of records, to include processing applications for scholarships,

b. Announce the results to all recipients in writing, by June 1.

c. Publicize the scholarship winners in the Traveler, AHEPA magazine, AND OTHER NEWS PUBLICATION.

d. Maintain all donations and records of chapter participation.

9. Duties of the Treasurer shall be, but not limited to:

a. Collecting and recording all donations.

b. Deposit all monies received in stated institutions and accounts.

c. Maintanance of all money records.

d. Assist Secretary in the donation acknowledgements.

e. Issue all checks so ordered by a majority vote of the member of this committee, upon being countersigned by Chairman or other authorized signatures.

10. Committee shall prepare and present a written report and financial statement to the District Lodge immediately preceding the District Convention.

\* 11. At written publicized meetings, the committee must have five ( 5 ) voting members present. <sup>Balance of</sup> ~~two~~ members may cast a written vote on publicized predetermined matters by mail to the Chairman and Secretary before the meeting.

12. The committee will continually endeavor to promote and seek funds.
  - a. By direct appeal.
  - b. by personal contact.
  - c. Through the Traveler and other methods as decided by committee.
13. To establish a perpetual titled scholarship, a minimum of \$5000.00 is required.
14. To establish a one time titled award, a minimum of \$1000.00 is required.
15. Each chapter President shall be a scholarship chairman within their chapter whose duties will be to publicize the program throughout his jurisdiction. Those chapters that have a member in their chapter on the scholarship committee shall automatically be scholarship chairman of their chapter. Chapter president may also choose some one to act as his scholarship chairman.
16. The District Lt. Governor may attend meetings, with out voting privilege.
- 17 Applicants for under-graduate scholarships will be selected from high school graduates who are about to enter an accredited institution or who are all ready in such an institution.
18. Applicant must produce evidence for scholarly achievement in order to receive consideration.
19. Applicants must be a permanent resident of District 21, be a member of the AHEPA family, or, son or daughter of a member of the AHEPA, IN Dist. 21, the member must be in good standing for a period of 36 consecutive months from date of initiation or re-instatement, prior to their son or daughter applying for scholarship
  - a. The grandchild of an AHEPAN in good standing, with at least ten (10) consecutive years of membership in the Order of AHEPA, at the time of submitting an application.
  - b. Students who havestep-parent or legal guardian who are members in good standing for a period of 36 consecutive MONTHS in the Order of AHEPA WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY
  - c. A deceased member's son or daughter may apply, and be eligible based on father's prior full membership status.
20. Applications for scholarships must be filed on or before April 15 of each calender year. Committee may adjust date due to a week-end date.
21. Committee shall deliver or have at least one copy of current scholarship application to each chapter by the third of January.
22. All scholarship awards given by any chapter in District 21 shall be presented through the committee at the District Convention, in their name.
23. Student may receive only one award as an under-graduate or one as a graduate.



NEW ITEMS ADDED TO BY LAWS:

1. All Scholarship awards made by Distr. 21, ORDER OF AHEPA, must be reviewed and awarded by an outside independent qualified person or board.
2. No Scholarships are to be awarded to any person who does nor meet the minimum requirements in the current application.

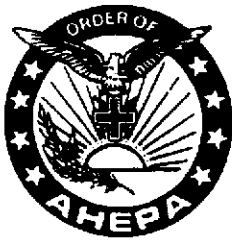

District Governor's Report, June 22, 1995

*At the joint meeting of the AHEPA and Daughters of Penelope district lodge officers on July 24, 1994, an accelerated schedule was agreed to whereby all visitations would be completed prior to the spring conference. Reno and Fresno agreed to Friday visitations. This permitted those traveling long distances to spend the night if so desired. Scheduling Reno in the fall prior to the snow season was helpful. I visited all chapters except Stockton due to an ear infection.*

*The fall conference in Fresno and spring conference in Sacramento were both successful. This district lodge thanks those chapters for their efforts. Special applause to Sacramento Chapter for taking-on the Scholarship Dinner/Dance and Silent Auction with great success.*

*Incorporated into the spring conference was Supreme President Charles Georgeson's "workshop" with participation of other past and current Supreme and District Lodge officers from Districts #20, #21 & #22.*

*On November 13, 1994 Daughters of Penelope District Governor Dianne Petersen and I, with our delegations, attended a program and reception held by the Modern Greek Studies Foundation at San Francisco State University. Together we presented \$3500.00 to fund a Modern Greek Studies class. Mis-communication between the Daughters and AHEPA at last year's district convention resulted in not fulfilling our joint total obligation of \$4000.00. This convention should allocate an additional \$500.00 to complete the funding of the class.*

*I participated as one of the speakers at the So. San Francisco (San Mateo Chapter) and the Oakland flag raising ceremonies for Greek Independence Day. The San Mateo AHEPA Family is commended for the impressive program and reception. Guest speakers included So. San Francisco Mayor Robert Yee, State Senator Quinton Kopp, former So. San Francisco Mayor Gus Nicolopoulos, and Greek Consul General Konstantinos Tritsarlis. Also performing on the program were the "Niki" Greek Dancers.*

*The AHEPA Board of Directors, under the chairmanship of our own Past District and Supreme Governor Gust Aretos, in co-ordination with the Educational Foundation conducted a seminar for District Governors in Washington D.C. on May 20, 1995 which I attended. Considerable time was spent by auditor A. Capsalis explaining how the Supreme Headquarters embezzlement occurred. As presented, it appears too much trust and authority was placed in one person former Executive Director Gus Gekas. The blame might be assumed by many supreme lodge officers and directors, past and present, taking for granted that all was going well at headquarters and not having proper controls in place.*

*Many hours have been expended by Brothers Aretos and Capsalis in the investigation, and should be recognized for the dedicated job they continue to perform. Hopefully under their leadership, and the F.B.I., this matter will come to a reasonable conclusion. Milton Gust, Chair of the Educational Foundation, gave assurance funds are available for national scholarships.*

*I traveled to Constantinople and Thessaloniki with Surperme President Charles Georgeson's AHEPA excursion to Greece. More details are reported in the Summer 1995 Traveler. The manner in which we were received with friendship and hospitality was most impressive. It made me feel proud to be an "AHEPAN".*

*As District Governor, I continued my involvement with the scholarship committee and participated in most meetings under chairman Harry Kalargiros. I commend him for his continued service in raising funds for the district scholarship program. I am particulary proud of my Oakland Chapter #171 for contributions of \$11,000.00. [This amount does not include individual donations made directly to the District.] Three scholarships in the memories of George Bezaitis, Mr. & Mrs. Eliades/Waco and Louis Colombotos will be presented this year from the Oakland #171 Chapter.*

A letter was received from Bishop Anthony requesting the Order of AHEPA consider funding refurbishment of the AHEPA/Daughters lodge building at St. Nicholas Ranch. The Philoptochos recently refurbished their lodge building at an approximate cost of \$50,000.00. A committee consisting of Charles Spyropoulos, District Secretary, Nick Kapetan, P.D.G.; Gus Constantine & Jerry Petsas, Oakland Chapter #171 and myself traveled to St. Nicholas Ranch on June 14, 1995 to evaluate conditions. We concluded the AHEPA/Daughters building, as well as many other areas at St. Nicholas Ranch, are in need of planning and refurbishment.

Golden Gate District was fortunate to have George Douveas, of Contra Costa Chapter #259, join the District Lodge as advisor to the Sons of Pericles. With District Governor John Konstantin, Supreme President Tassos Konstantin, he has stimulated activity with the youth of Golden Gate District. New chapters will be initiated at this convention.

In closing, the following recommendations are offered:

1. Present resolutions at National convention that would re-organize the duties and responsibilities of Supreme Lodge officers and Board of Directors. And let's finally eliminate party politics in our AHEPA fraternity.
2. Evaluate the purpose and contributions of Surperme Governors. If not justified, take action at National Convention to eliminate such positions.
3. Present AHEPA in a more desirable image for the times. Change the word Progressive fo Philanthropic. (Also suggested by James Miller, District Governor #22. )
4. Support the AHEPA Centennial Foundation's "Tribute" project. The sculpture now being created will be an everlasting tribute to the Spirit of the Olympics. A plus for AHEPA!
5. Convention city committee evaluate feasibility of combined district conventions with District #20 and/or #22, thereby sharing in good fellowship and social festivities.
6. Give the addtional \$500.00 required to sponsor the Modern Greek Studies class at San Francico State University to start in the fall of 1995.
7. Continue to support the Deborah Hospital program in New Jersey whereby National provides funds for specialized training of nurses and technicians from the AHEPA Hospital in Thessaloniki.
8. District #21 convention special projects committee consider Bishop Anthony's request for refurbishment of the AHEPA/Daughters building at St. Nicholas Ranch.

Now that my term as Governor is rapidly ending, it is difficult to fathom four years have whizzed by serving Golden Gate District #21. This represents many miles traveled for visitations, conferences, special meetings, etc. It also represents many new friendships. The courtesy and hospitality expended to the district lodge during visitations and social events are greatly appreciated. Many thanks to all the brothers and sisters for their continued support

Committee Comments: a) In the future, the Host Chapter arrange to have the Flags displayed.

Chapter Response: We require Flags in the Daughters Meeting Room, AHEPA's Meeting Room and Delegate Luncheon. This requires either a) six flags or shifting flags from room to room. The Host Chapter intended to move the flags from the Meeting Room to the Delegate Luncheon but due to an oversight, this was not done.

Grievance #2 That AHEPA follow Article III, P-4 of the Constitution; i.e. that religious and/or political discussions at meetings be prohibited. ( see attached)

Committee Comments: a) We recommend that the AHEPA Constitution be reviewed by the National Legislative Committee in order to insure that it conforms with the IRS Regulation.

b) Also the Committee believes that the AHEPA Constitution is written, as individuals, we can become involved in Civic, Political and Religious discussions and/or activities. We cannot, however, do this over the AHEPA name or Officers Stationary or Titles. In addition, the objectives and principles of AHEPA encourages instruction of members in the principals of Government and Civic responsibilities.

Grievance #3 In the past, Convention Host Chapters have had problems and lost money because convention center monetary package deals depend upon numbers of lunch and dinner participation. The National Convention Policy is to require Delegates to purchase a mandatory events package.

Committee Comments: a) Investigation revealed, without a certain number of commitments for convention center luncheons and dinners, prior to the convention dates, it is true that problems develop and host Chapters suffer a monetary loss.

b) The committee recommends that the District establishes a policy to allow host Chapters to require all Delegates to purchase a package for all scheduled events. This package to be similar to the National Convention Package, excluding room registration and events that are directed specifically to the AHEPAn's or Daughters. (i.e. golf, fishing, fashion shows, etc.)

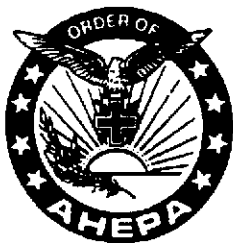

The major issues discussed by the Ahepa Traveler committee were the status of our second class mailing permit and the need to supplement the District's Traveler income.

## **Status of Mailing Permit**

Movement of the second class mailing permit from San Francisco to San Jose when Bill Christie took over publication of the Traveler resulted in an audit of our organization and procedures. The Post Office wanted to see signed membership applications forms along with verification that members receiving the Traveler were in good standing. We would also have to make the following changes to the masthead on the Traveler:

- District 21 should be noted as the publisher of the Traveler.
- Franciscan Press should be noted as the printer of the Traveler.
- Show the cost of the Traveler to each member (i.e., \$2.50 per year).

Brother Bill Rotas has been negotiating with the Post Office to resolve these issues for the District. He sent a letter to the Post Office which included a suggestion that the Chapter Secretaries will make copies of new member applications for the District Secretary's files before forwarding the applications to National Headquarters.

In the meantime, our second class mailing permit has been revoked (see attached letter from U.S. Postal Service). The mailing for the Summer 1995 issue had to be made using the Oakland Ahepa Chapter's bulk mailing permit. At this point the District has two options: 1) reapply for the second class permit, or 2) apply for a non-profit bulk mailing permit. The committee discussed the relative benefits of each approach. Non-profit bulk mail would be cheaper, but would take longer to deliver. Also, with bulk mail there is no return of undeliverable items so address corrections may become more of a problem. Another problem is that as of October 1, 1995 no paid advertising will be allowed in publications sent with non-profit bulk mail.

Recommendation

The Traveler committee recommends that the District attempt to reapply for the second class permit. However, if this is unsuccessful, the committee recommends that the District apply for a non-profit bulk permit.

Ahepa Traveler Publication Budget

The expenses for publication and mailing of the Ahepa Traveler are expected to remain about the same as shown in our approved budget. However, in order to break even, the Traveler income needs to be increased by about \$850.

Recommendation

The Traveler committee recommends the following measures be adopted:


- Increase the Traveler's share of Charitable Raffle proceeds from 20 to 25%
- Increase the per capita tax for the Traveler from \$2.50 to \$3.00.
- Increase the DOP Traveler Assessment from \$1,200 to \$1,500.

The net effect of these measures would be to increase the Traveler income by nearly \$900. This is slightly more than currently required, but would provide some contingency funding in case we are forced to eliminate the paid advertisements.

Miscellaneous Recommendations

- Maintain the current 8-page format.
- All Chapters are encouraged to appoint a Publicity Chairman to submit articles.
- Promptly send mailing list updates to the Traveler editor.
- Observe publication deadlines (Aug. 1, Nov. 1, Feb. 1, and May 1)

I spoke to Caroline Woo, Rates & Classification Service Center in San Bruno regarding your organizations efforts in getting your second-class mailing privileges reinstated.

Due to failure in meeting the basic compliance criteria your organization would have to reapply for second-class, which would require another review. After careful consideration and research of your case it is the consensus of the post office that your organization does not at this time meet the requirements for Second-Class mailing privileges as set forth in the domestic mail manual.

I sincerely hope that given time your organization will be able to reapply and qualify for second-class mailing privileges. Should you have any questions regarding this matter please call me at (408) 437-6812.

As you know, we have had our 2nd class mail permit was revoked by the US Post Office.

The post office wants to see signed application forms, and verifiable documentation that the member to whom the Traveler is mailed is in fact a currently paid up member of either the AHEPA or the Daughters of Penelope.

One of the ways that we can partially accomplish this request, is to have on file at the District Secretary's Office, copies of all signed applications, in addition copies of the per capita tax billing that is sent to the Chapter Secretary, and annotated when the Secretary mails the PCT payment to the Headquarters.

Therefore effective with this District Convention, the method of transmitting the chapter PCT to the District Secretary, will be as follows:

1. For each newly initiated candidate into an AHEPA Chapter, the Chapter Secretary, will, when sending in the PCT for this member, make a "photocopy" of the signed application, and attach this photocopy to the transmittal and the check that is sent to the District Secretary.

If this is not submitted, the District Secretary will contact the Chapter Secretary and obtain the necessary documentation required.

2. In mailing the regular PCT payments to the Supreme Lodge, The Chapter Secretary sends a copy of the chapter billing report, properly annotated with the check in payment of the PCT. At the same time, the Chapter Secretary is to make a photo copy of the annotated form he prepared for Headquarters, and send this copy along with proper payment to the District Secretary.


