CONVENTION MINUTES

The 65th Annual District Convention hosted by the Sacramento AHEI'A family at the Sacramento Hilton Hotel, Sacramento, Ca. was called to order by Convention Chairman Bro. George Koufasimas at 9:30 AM on Friday, June 27, 1997. Bro. Koufasimas welcomed all the Delegates and wished them success in their deliberations, he also urged the Delegates to contact any of the Convention Committee members for any assistance that they might need. Bro. Koufasimas turned the gavel over to District Gov. Charles Spyropoulos. Bro. Nick Kapetan, PDG, started the business session with a prayer. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present. Distr. Gov. Charles Spyropoulos appointed Bros. George Johnson and PDG Ted Cuclis as tellers. The unofficial voting strength of the opening session was 40 Delegates which included District Lodge Officers, Past District Governors, and Chapter Delegates.

Gov. Charles Spyropoulos asked for nominations from the floor for the office of Convention Chairman:

PDG George Margelos nominated PDG Nick Kapetan, Fresno Chapter 151, for Conv. Chm., second by Bro. Steve Houvardas. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for PDG Nick Kapetan as Convention Chairman for the 65th District Convention.

PDG Nick Kapetan nominated PDG Angelo Mountanos, San Francisco Chapter, for Conv. Vice Chm., second by PDG Ted Cuclis. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for PDG Angelo Mountanos as Convention Vice Chairman.

PDG Nick Kapetan nominated Bro. Bill Booras, Fresno Chapter 151, for Conv. Sect., second by PDG Ted Cuclis. Nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast for Bro. Bill Booras as Conv. Sect.

PDG George Margelos administered the oath of office to the newly elected Convention officers.

Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan thanked the delegates for electing him as Conv. Chm. Bro. Kapetan made the following appointments: PDG Chris Rockas, Fresno Chapter 151, and Bro. Tassos Konstantin, Oakland Chapter, as Conv. Parliamentarians, Bro. Steve Houvardas, Fresno, Chapter 151, as Marshall, and Bro. Stavros Kalomiris, Fresno Chapter 151, as Inside Sentinel. Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan then explained the format for the Business Sessions of the Convention. All discussions on motions will be limited to 10 min. on any item and each delegate will be allowed to speak on the motion for one minute. Bro. Kapetan suggested that to keep the meetings going smoothly, we should try and keep the side remarks to a minimum. The next order of business was Chapter reports:

The Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan called for a roll call of all Delegates at 10:20 A.M. The voting strength was 32 Delegates.

PDG Anthony Maris referred to news bulletin which gave a brief history about several Chapters in the District.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: Bro. Harry Kalargiros, Chm. of the Scholarship Com. gave his report. See page 33 & 34 for written report. At this time the Modesto Chapter made a \$500.00 donation to the Scholarship Fund.

DISTRICT LODGE REPORTS

DISTRICT CHAPLAIN: Bro. PDG John Koplos, Oakland Chapter, reported with the written copy on page 35. A moment of silence was held for our departed Brothers. See page 17 for list of our departed Brothers.

DISTRICT WARDEN: Bro. Anastasios Piliotis, Oakland Chapter reported with written report on page 36.

SON'S OF PERICLES ADVISOR: Bro. Tassos Konstantin, Oakland Chapter reporting for Bro. Harry Haramalis who was ill and not able to attend Convention. Written report on page 37. At this time the Distr. Gov. of the Son's of Pericles, John Wood, was escorted to the podium by Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan. The goal of the Son's was to organize Chapters to meet regularly and increase membership. They initiated 34 new Son's this year, plus 16 new Son's in Sacramento. They now have 5 active Chapters and are willing to help Ahepans in any way possible. Conv. Chm. directed Bro. Ilias Frangos to attend the Son's Committee meeting to clarify the situation between the San Mateo Son's and the Belmont Son's.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR: Bro. Tassos Konstantin, Oakland Chapter, reported that District 21 Son's had a successful year, not many activities, but successful. They wish to form a Northern Calif. Sports Hall of Fame to recognize our local athletes. They had a Golf Tournament on May 23, 1997 which was co-sponsored with the Son's District Lodge. Net profit from the tournament was \$700.00 which was split with the Son's Distr. Lodge. Bro. Tassos presented a check for \$350 to be used for athletic functions in the District. See page for additional comments on this item. It was suggested by the Conv. Chm. that the Athletic Directors recommendations be submitted to the Athletic Com. for review and possible implementation. See letter by Athletic Director on Page 38.

DISTRICT MARSHALL: Bro. Tom Chiarchianis, Stockton Chapter, reported with written report on page 39.

DISTRICT TREASURER: Bro. Alex Lemberes, Reno Chapter reported with written report on page 40.

DISTRICT SECRETARY: Bro. Gus Hazifotis, San Jose Chapter, reported with the written report on page 41.

DISTRICT LT. GOVERNOR: Bro. Stephen Bolaris, San Jose Chapter, reported with the written report on page 42.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR: Bro. Charles Spyropoulos, Oakland Chapter 171, reported, with the written report on pages 43-47.

Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan read the names of the Chairman for the various working committees of the Convention. See pages 18-20 for the names of the committee chairpersons. All committees are to meet this afternoon so that they can start reporting on Saturday morning. The business session of the Convention was to reconvene immediately after the Delegates Luncheon.

GOOD OF ORDER: PDG Karl Konstantin, Oakland Chapter, reported on the Cyprus resolution in Congress. He suggested that as individuals we should write to our Congressmen concerning this matter, he also passed out literature.

Credential Committee reported that Brothers John Guy, Tony Lagis, and William Panagopoulos to be considered official delegates from their respective Chapters.

The Friday afternoon session was to meet at 1:30 PM and all working committees were to meet in the afternoon and have their reports ready for the Saturday business session. The morning meeting was adjourned at 12 noon to attend the Delegates Luncheon.

The Friday afternoon session was reconvened with District Lodge Officers Alex Lemberes, Steve Bolaris, and Distr. Governor Charles Spyropoulos reading their reports. Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan urged the Delegates again to have their working committee meetings this afternoon so that we can start with the reports at 9:00 A.M. Saturday morning. Conv. Chm. read the roll call of all Delegates at 2:25 P.M. There were 6 Distr. Lodges Officers, 23 Delegates, and 13 Past Distr. Gov. Meeting adjourned at 2:30 P.M.

The Saturday session was called to order by the Conv. Chm. Nick Kapetan at 9:10 A.M. There was a roll call of Conv. Delegates with 39 Delegates in attendance. Conv. Chm. Kapetan called for committee reports.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE: Chm. Bill Christe, San Jose Chapter, reporting. See pages 61-63 for the written report. First half of the report was approved as read. Resolution on Joint Distr. Conv. to be discussed and reported on at the next Distr. Conference and voted on at the next District Convention.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: PDG Lou Janakos, Chm., San Mateo Chapter reported. All items No. 1 thru No. 5 were approved as amended. See page 56-40 for full details. Bro. Gus Hazifotis made the motion to give two more scholarship to two students that were previously disqualified during the qualification process. Motion was tabled until Grievance Committee reports. Bro. Arnold Dorer, Solano Chapter, presented a resolution on forming a Scholarship Foundation with the Ahepans and Daughters of Penelope. Resolution passed. See page 62, in Resolutions Committee report for details on the proposed Scholarship Foundation.

SPECIAL PROJECTS COMMITTEE: Bro. Jim Nicolaou, Fresno Chapter #151 reporting. For written report see page 52. Items No. 1 and 2 were passed as presented. Item No. 3 was referred to the Resolutions Committee report on page 62. Item No. 4: PDG Chris Rockas, Fresno Chapter, moved that the Charitable Raffle Com. deduct \$5000.00 from the 1998 Raffle prizes and come up with a revised format for future Charitable Raffles. PDG George Marmas, Stockton Chapter, 2nd the motion. Motion passed.

ATHLETIC COMMITTEE: Bro. Steve Houvardas, Fresno Chapter #151, reported. For written report see page 64. Report approved as presented.

CONVENTION CITY AND CONFERENCES COMMITTEE: Chm. John Guy, San Mateo Chapter, reported that the Oakland Chapter will be the host Chapter for the 1998 Distr. Conv. San Francisco Chapter and/or Marysville Chapter are recommended for the 1999 Distr. Conventions. Also included in the report are considerations for a possible joint District Conv. with Districts 19, 20, and 22. See page 50 for written report. Report approved as presented. PDG Andy Banis, Oakland Chapter, briefly reported on the joint District Convention in Reno. The Supreme Pres. was in attendance and the banquet was well attended and short.

GROWTH AND EXPANSION: Bro. Ilias Frangos, San Mateo Chapter #392 reporting. See written report on pages 53-54. Report approved as presented. PDG Chris Rockas, Fresno Chapter, presented a Resolution on the same subject. See pages 55 for the written report.

PDG Anthony Maris, Sacramento Chapter, presented Bro. Mario Stathopoulos with a 15% rebate check for sending in a Ad for the Conv. Album other than the Chapter Ad from the San Francisco Chapter.

The Saturday morning business session was recessed at 11:30 A.M. and the Saturday afternoon business session was reconvened at 1:40 P.M. Bro. Tom Tjovenes, San Francisco Chapter, offered the San Francisco Chapter #150 for a October 5 Distr. Conference. Bro. John Korakis 2nd the motion. Motion passed. The October 5 date was picked, because they were celebrating their 75th anniversary with a dinner/dance on Oct. 4. Modesto reported that they would bid for the Fall 1998 District Conference.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE: PDG George Margelos, San Francisco Chapter, reporting. For written report see pages 48-49. Deliberations concerning the Scholarship selections was discussed, and recommendations were made on this matter and others items concerning the Scholarship Com. Item #7 of the report should read: After the ranking is made the committee with a quorum present will meet. The secretary of the committee will notify the recipients with a personal letter. After much discussion on whether the two denied scholarship recipients should receive a scholarship this year and/or next year was defeated. They can re-apply next year for a scholarship. Report approved as modified.

SON'S OF PERICLES COMMITTEE: No report given by the Committee other than the report given by the Distr. Son's Advisor Bro. Harry Haramalis.

AHEPAN OF THE YEAR COMMITTEE: Gov. Charles Spyropoulos, Oakland Chapter, reported that **DISTRICT AHEPAN of the YEAR** to be Bro. Gus Hontalas, San Jose Chapter. **CHAPTER of the YEAR** to be the Sacramento Chapter. **PRESIDENT of the YEAR** to be Bro. Alex Lemberes Reno Chapter. See page 66 for written report.

AUDIT/BUDGET COMMITTEE: PDG Bill Rotas, Sacramento Chapter and Bro. Arnold Dorer, Solano Chapter reported. See pages 67-69 for Operating Account Summary and Distr. Scholarship fund Accounts. It was asked from them conv. floor why there was no dollar amount for the Modern Greek Studies as approved at the last Distr. Conv. PDG Bill Rotas explained that the budget was in a deficit mode and the \$500 expenditure was left out. The Conv. body approved that the \$500 for the Greek Studies program be inserted back into the 1997-1998 budget. The new Distr. Lodge to try and raise funds to minimize the deficit. PDG Ted Cuclis suggested that a raffle during the next Scholarship dinner/dance could raise the extra \$500 needed. Budget approved as amended with a \$1965.00 deficit. PDG Chris Rockas moved and Bro. George Johnson second that a preliminary report by the Budget/Audit committee be presented at the Conv. and that the audited budget be presented at the first Distr. Conference after the Convention. Motion passed. This motion was made to alleviate the congestion the committee faces trying to audit books while monies are being received at the last minute and bills having to be paid does not allow the committee sufficient time to give an accurate report to the conv. body. PDG Bill Rotas also reported on the Scholarship Fund account. Account balance was \$218,945.13 This does not include the \$10,000 that has to be withdrawn for this years Scholarship recipients. The committee has not invested any monies as proposed at the last convention. They researched many investment firms, but have not been able to find a reasonably safe investment. Scholarship Fund Account approved as presented.

LIAISON COMMITTEE: PDG George Marmas, Stockton Chapter reported that there was no problems between the Daughters of Penelope and the Ahepans.

AHEPA TRAVELER COMMITTEE: PDG Ted Cuclis, Oakland Chapter, reported. Report approved as presented including possible increase in Traveler budget. See page 51 for written report.

GUST ARETOS MEMORIAL FUND: PDG Nick Kapetan, Fresno Chapter, reported that the donations for the Gust Aretos Scholarship Fund had reached the goal of \$5000.00 for a perpetual scholarship under the name of Gust Aretos. Bro. Nick Kapetan suggested that the 5% income from the Charitable raffle proceeds as approved at the last Distr. Conv. will not be required any more since the initial \$5000 seed money has been raised. PDG George Konstantopoulos move to drop the 5% deduction from the Charitable raffle. Motion passed. Report approved as presented. See page 65 for written report. A check for \$5010.59 was presented to the Scholarship Chm. Bro. Harry Kalargiros.

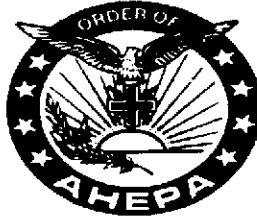

DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S REPORT

Mr. Chairman, Past Supreme Lodge officers, Past District Governors,
Members of the District Lodge, Chapter Officers and Delegates:

It has been a wonderful experience and an honor to serve as your District Governor this past year. I want to thank the delegates of the 64th Annual District Convention in Stockton for electing me to this office.

As District Governor, I visited eleven chapters in the District with members of the District Lodge. Due to a conflict in dates the Fresno visitation was cancelled. During these visitations I made many new friends and renewed some old acquaintances with Brother AHEPANS. I wish to thank the officers and members of all the chapters for their hospitality and friendship. I also want to thank members of my District Lodge for their help and support.

Bouquets of thanks and appreciation should go to Sister Christine KOCKINIS, District Governor, Daughters of Penelope, and members of her District Lodge for their help, support, and cooperation during this past year.

My term as District Governor passed so quickly that I would like to reflect briefly on what took place within District 21 in the 1996-'97 year. A summary of my activities as District Governor is included as an attachment to this report.

The year began with my attendance at the Supreme Convention in Houston where the main topic of discussion was the AHEPA 2000 Report. The report set forth 22 recommendations to improve AHEPA in order to survive in the 21st Century. The recommendations were met with a mixed review by the delegates.

On December 7, 1997 Supreme President, Spiro MACRIS, conducted a combined AHEPA and Grand DOP/Supreme Lodge Workshop at Reno, Nevada concerning AHEPA 2000. In attendance were Governors and Chapter officers from Districts 20, 21, 22 and 26. It was obvious from the questions raised that the AHEPA 2000 recommendations were not favorably received by those in attendance.

On February 22, 1997 Golden Gate District 21 held a combined AHEPA/DOP Supreme Lodge Workshop in Elk Grove, CA. The purpose of the workshop was to provide chapter input and to develop a Golden Gate District 21 joint position on the AHEPA 2000 recommendations. A report of the District's position was furnished to all Districts, AHEPANS and Daughters of Penelope within the AHEPA domain. Copies were also sent to each member of the Supreme Lodge, Board of Directors, Grand Lodge, Supreme President of the Sons of Pericles, Grand President of the Maids of Athena and the Chairman of the AHEPA 2000 Committee.

Our collective views, as presented in this report, are the result of this workshop in February. The recommendations regarding AHEPA 2000 will be voted on for acceptance at the Supreme Convention in Atlanta in August.

Fall and Spring Conferences

In lieu of the annual Fall Conference the District sponsored a "Chapter Officers Workshop" which was held at Holy Cross Church in Belmont on Sunday, October 13, 1996. It was hosted by the San Mateo Chapter and there was good attendance by the majority of chapters in District 21.

The "Workshop" was conducted by Past District Governor, Nick Kapetan, who did an excellent job explaining the duties and responsibilities of Chapter officers. I propose that we continue to hold a similar workshop each October in place of the Fall Conference.

The Spring Conference would continue to be held prior to the beginning of Lent. The District Scholarship Dinner Dance also would continue to be held on the Saturday before the Spring Conference.

San Francisco will host the 1997 Fall Conference on October 5, 1997. On the preceding Saturday, October 4, 1997, the San Francisco Chapter will be celebrating its 70th Anniversary with a dinner-dance at the Annunciation Cathedral in San Francisco. Currently, the District seeks a host for the 1998 Spring Conference.

Modern Greek Studies Program.

Last year AHEPA and DOP agreed to become sponsors of the Center for Modern Greek Studies. AHEPA and the DOP will each donate a sum of \$500. annually over the next four years, beginning with the 1997-'98 budget. AHEPA, District 21 shall include an operating budget line item for this expenditure.

* With the appointment of Anastasios KONSTANTIN as District Athletic Director last year, the District Athletes Program was activated when he and Sons of Pericles' (SOP) District Governor, John WOOD, assisted by Sons and Maids of Athena within District 21, organized a District 21, SOP Golf Tournament at Tilden Park Golf Club in Berkeley on May 23, 1997. Despite rainy weather thirty golfers participated and completed their round of golf. This was followed by a delicious barbecued shis-ke-bob dinner. This initial event made a small profit. Let's make this an annual event which, with additional publicity, can attract a larger field of players in 1998.

AHEPA Educational Foundation.

During this past year, representatives of the Scholarship Committees of both AHEPA and the DOP met in order to discuss the feasibility of forming a District Educational Foundation. These talks were exploratory and no decision was reached regarding the formation of such a foundation. Committee meetings should be held at this convention for the purpose of discussing the advantages and tax consequences of such a foundation.

Voluntary Assessment.

The voluntary assessment of \$12.00 per AHEPAN was due by March 31, 1997. This is an urgent plea! For those who have not yet made their donation, please make every effort to comply with the request from the Supreme Headquarters. This one-time assessment is urgently needed to pay the legal fees for our civil suits that AHEPA filed to recover monies lost as a result of the embezzlement. Let's finish this job which our departed Brother, Gust Aretos, resolved to rectify and in so doing, close this dark chapter in AHEPA's colorful history.

During my visitations I was pleased to witness the number of new members who are taking an active role in many of our chapters. I should like to see these same members participate in the operation and leadership of District 21 as members of the District Lodge.

In closing, I wish to thank the entire Sacramento AHEPA Family for its warm hospitality extended us, the visitors and delegates of District 21, and for its outstanding job as organizers of this year's District Convention. Let us resolve that during this Convention, our discussions will be meaningful, productive, and filled with good will toward our fellow members.

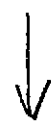
