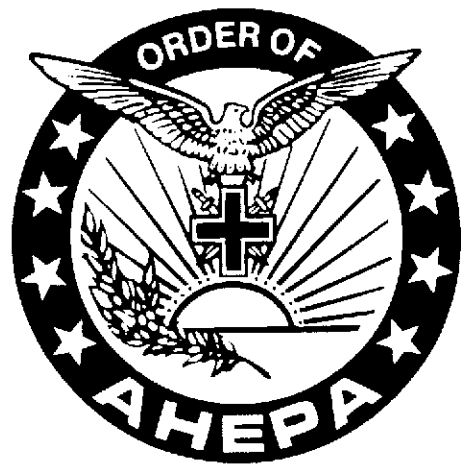

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY MORNING, JUNE 11, 1999

Convention called to order by Convention Chairman Arnold Dorer, Solano Chapter #217, at 10:20 am. Brother Dorer welcomed all delegates to the convention and offered to assist all delegates to insure they have an enjoyable and productive convention.

Brother Dorer introduced District Governor K. Gus Hazifotis, Garden City Chapter #251.

The colors were posted by Brother Lou Eleopoulos, Oakland Chapter #171.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given by the delegates present.

The opening prayer was given by District Chaplain John Koplos, Oakland Chapter #171.

District Governor Hazifotis appointed PDG Anthony Maris, Sacramento Chapter #153, and Lambros Panayotopoulos, Garden City Chapter #251 to the Credentials Committee.

District Secretary Bill Booras, Fresno Chapter #151, called roll of delegates. See Convention Agenda pages 11-18. There was discussion concerning the voting eligibility of those delegates in attendance whose per capita tax has been paid but not recorded or received by the District Secretary. It was decided that those in question would be reviewed by the Grievance Committee.

District Governor Hazifotis appointed the following as tellers:

Election of Convention Officers. (See page 1 of the Convention Agenda). The following brothers were elected uncontested: Convention Chairman PDG Michael Pappas, Stockton, Chapter #212; Convention Vice-Chairman Jim Nicolaou, Fresno Chapter #151; and Secretary Bill Christie, San Jose Chapter #251. PDG Anthony Maris administered the oath to the elected officers.

Convention Chairman PDG Mike Pappas appointed PDG Chris Rockas, Fresno Chapter #151 as Parliamentarian, Jim Dariotis, San Francisco Chapter #150 Marshall and John Guy, San Mateo Chapter #392, Inside Sentinel.

Convention Chairman PDG Mike Pappas dedicated the Convention to PDG Nick Kapetan and to all of our departed brothers. See Memorial pages 19-21 in convention agenda.

Chapter Reports. The next item of business was the Chapter Reports. In order to save time, Chapter representatives were asked not to read reports included in the Convention Agenda and only report on additional news or information not included in their written reports. The written reports are on pages 22 - 33. Additions were as follows:

Golden Gate Pacific #150. PSG Paul Eliopoulos reported that brother Victor Kreatsoulas passed away after their chapter report was submitted.

Sacramento #153. PDG Bill Rotas reported that per capita dues had not been paid by his chapter for three years due to procrastination of the chapter secretaries. The problem has since been resolved and the chapter will fulfill their obligation.

Oakland #171. Brother Harry Metaxas gave Oakland's report since it was not included in the Convention Agenda. The report has since been added to the Agenda material. Brother Metaxas reported that brothers Peter Contos and Gus Constantine passed away this past year.

Ahepa Chapters in Greece (11:00 am). Brother Robert Potts, Glyfada, Greece, Chapter HJ-2 was introduced by Convention Chairman Mike Pappas. Brother Potts spoke about the Ahepa chapters in Greece. He is a member of Glyfada Chapter HJ-2 in Athens. The chapter started in 1992 and was at that time made up primarily of retired military personnel. Dues are \$25 per year plus 10,000 drachmas (about \$33). They have donated food, a TV and VCR to a local orphanage. There are now 3 chapters in Greece, two in Athens - Chapters HJ-1 and 2, and one in Thessoloniki - HJ-3. Since there are now 3 chapters in Greece they qualify as a District, they will become District 25. Brother Potts said we can communicate with the chapters via E-mail (he didn't have E-mail addresses with him). Brother Potts is currently moving back to the US. For further information his local number is 707/399-7662.

Standing Committee Reports:

Scholarship (11:05 am). Scholarship Committee Chairman PSS Andy Banis, Oakland Chapter #171 read his report (see page 34 of the Convention Agenda). Brother Banis reported that there are four scholarship committee vacancies. These vacancies are to be filled at this convention. A full committee consists of 9 members. Vice-Chairman Jim Nicolaou submitted a check for \$165 on behalf of Fresno #151 to the Scholarship Fund. Brother Nicolaou reported that Fresno #151 has now given \$1,774.00 to the Scholarship Fund for this year.

Scholarship Foundation (11:15 am). PDG Lou Janakos, San Mateo Chapter #290 made a very comprehensive and complete report on the status of forming a District #21 Scholarship Foundation. His written report was submitted at the convention and is included with the Convention Committee Reports on pages 11 through 16. Brother Janakos stated we now have a tax ID # which will allow tax deductible donations to the Scholarship Fund.

PDG Advisors-Directors. Because of the sudden and untimely death of Brother Nick Kapetan a report was not available. Brother Kapetan was Chairman of the PDG Advisors-Director Committee.

Charitable Raffle. A detailed written report by Manager PSG Paul Eliopoulos is included in the Convention Agenda on pages 34 through 39. A current report submitted after the convention by Brother Eliopoulos is included in the Convention Committee Reports, pages 17 -21.

District Lodge Officer Reports: During this session the following reports were given:

District Marshal Nick Korakas (11:25 am) See page 44.

District Secretary Bill Booras (11:35 am) See page 43. Brother Booras emphasized the need for Chapter Officers to carry out their duties.

Credentials Committee Report (11:30 am). The Credentials Committee reported the total voting strength as 35. 3 Officers, 14 Past District Governors and 18 Delegates. The same number reported earlier by roll call. See page 11 of the Convention Agenda.

Convention Chairman Mike Pappas called a recess at 11:45 am so all Delegates could attend the Delegates Luncheon. Friday afternoon session will begin at 2 p.m..

Delegate Luncheon. No dignitaries present. Only District Officers and Delegates were in attendance.

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY AFTERNOON JUNE 11, 1999

Afternoon session called to order by Vice-Chairman Jim Nicolaou at 2:10 p.m..

Roll Call. First order of business was roll call by District Secretary Bill Booras. Afternoon voting strength was 3 District Lodge Officers, 7 District Governors and 17 Delegates.

PDG Andrew Manis thanked everyone for the get well card sent to him when he was ill.

District Governor Report (2:18 p.m.). District Governor K. Gus Hazifotis gave his report. See written report on page 41. Brother Gus indicated that Ahepa University, as a start, will offer courses on the Internet. Appoximately \$15,000 will be needed by September 1999 to launch the program. Donations, fund raisers and grants will be needed to fulfill this need. To establish an AHEPA Chair, \$1.5 million to \$2 million dollars are needed. Reported that American/Hellenic Veterans Memorial Project is in its beginning stage (See Presentation by Lou Eleopoulos, Oakland Chapter #171).

Brother Potts commented that a Greek American nicknamed "Dough Boy" was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for heroics during W.W.I. During the German occupation of Greece in W.W.II, German soldiers took the medal from his family. Ambassador Burns replaced the medal and awarded it to the family about three weeks ago.

Brother Bill Booras questioned the \$15 registration fee. Bylaws say the fee is \$10. Vice-Chairman Jim Nicolaou said we should go by the by-laws. District Governor Gus Hazifotis responded that registration fee and delegate packages were voted on at the 1996 Sunnyvale Convention.

Afternoon Business Session Adjourned at 3:10 p.m. by Vice Chairman Jim Nicolaou. Brother Nicolaou asked all delegates to meet with their respective committees following this session and be prepared to report at the Saturday morning business session. Business session will convene Saturday, June 12, 1999 at 9 am sharp.

Friday evening: Grand Banquet and presentation of Scholarship Awards. List of recipients is included with Scholarship Chairman Report on page 34 of the Convention Agenda. Oakland Chapter #171 presented a check for \$5,000 to the Modern Greek Studies Foundation at the Banquet. See copy of program on pages 10-12 of Convention Committee Reports.

BUSINESS SESSION - SATURDAY MORNING JUNE 12, 1999.

Saturday morning Business Session was called to order at 9:20 am by Convention Chairman PDG Mike Pappas.

Convention Chairman Pappas introduced Supreme Governor J. John Rumpakis, of Portland, Oregon. Supreme Governor Rumpakis was encouraged with our deliberations and the sense of humor of the delegates. He felt that District #21 was more progressive and ahead of the other Districts in the West.

Roll Call of Officers, Past District Governors and Delegates. See pages 11-18 of the Convention Agenda. 3 Officers, 11 Past District Governors and 16 Delegates. Total voting strength = 30.

Convention Working Committee Reports

Daughters of Penelope Liaison (9:50 a.m.). Chairman John Guy reporting. The Daughters of Penelope submitted a list suggestions as follows (see Convention Committee Reports - page 22.

1. St. Nicholas Ranch is asking for a \$5,000 donation to replace air conditioning. Cost to be shared by Ahepa/DOP. Consensus was to table or deny. Motion to table was made by Brother Bill Rotas, 2nd by Steve Bolaris. Motion carried.

2. District Convention to recognize Greek Americans, Ahepa Family or not, Favorable response. Brother Rockas stated Fresno Chapter does this at the local level. Consensus was to this at the local level is better. Brother Rumpakis reported that a Plato Award was given to a graduate student by the Portland Chapter for his achievements.

3. Visitations to be held during the day hours and on weekends. Good idea - should be referred to the incoming Governor. This should be left at the discretion of each Chapter.

4. Supreme Convention ad for District. Cost to be shared. Motion by Brother Bill Rotas to share the cost of a full white page ad. 2nd by Lou Janakos. Motion carried.

5. The District Convention is held too early. We are at the mercy of the National Convention and/or when hotels are available. This should be referred to resolutions committee.

6. Speeches take up too much time and take away from meeting time at the Spring and Fall Conferences. Should have introductions only - no speeches. Response - it is the job of the person conducting the meeting to control time. Felt that Daughters were trying to micro-manage conventions and conferences.

7. When a member passes away some churches (priests) will not allow an Ahepa ceremony. District Lodge will meet with Metropolitan Anthony to discuss (this is a recommendation of the Grievance Committee).

Grievance Committee (10:25 a.m.). Chairman Jim Dariotis reporting. See written report on page 23 of the Convention Committee Reports. Two main grievances were the length of Chapter meetings and the problem in some communities with the priests not allowing Ahepa Funeral services. The latter to be referred to the District Lodge to resolve with Metropolitan Anthony. Motion to accept report carried.

Scholarship Committee (10:35 a.m.). Chairman George Johnson. PDG Bill Rotas submitted the following recommendation for adoption. Motion carried to adopt all three recommendations. Written report on page 24 of Convention Committee Reports.

1. Scholarship Committee to hold quarterly meetings as part of policy.
2. May 15th of each year is the cut off date for notifying committee of available funds for scholarships.
3. Scholarship application forms and related material to be available for distribution to the committee and chapters by December 31 of each year.

Audit & Finance Committee (10:45 a.m.) Chairman PDG Bill Rotas. A resolution was submitted by the committee in an effort to have financial reports available in a timely manner. See page 25 for the resolution. Motion to accept resolution carried.

Growth & Expansion (10:55 a.m.). Chairman PDG George Marmas reporting. Committee recommended that more activities are needed to generate more interest in AHEPA. Another recommendation was to simplify Convention Agenda to combine some of the committees that presently overlap. Convention Chairman PDG Mike Pappas indicated that some modifications are being considered. Motion for adoption carried. See Committee Reports on page 26.

Special Projects. Chairman PDG George Marmas. Four recommendations were submitted by the Special Projects Committee. They are: (1) to continue the Charitable Raffle, (2) Ahepa University, (3) Senior Housing and (4) Hellenic American Veterans Memorial. Motion to adopt all projects carried. See page 27 of Convention Committee Reports.

Traveler (11:45 a.m.) Chairman DG Gus Hazifotis reporting. Written report on page 28 of the Convention Committee Reports. Still using Oakland Chapter Bulk Rate Non-profit Postal Permit. Mailing list a problem keeping accurate and up-to-date. Convention mailing went out first class mail (donated) and over 10% (150) were returned for lack of sufficient address. Invoicing of advertisers very important to defray costs.

Convention Cities (11:30 a.m.). Chairman DG Gus Hazifotis reporting. Written report on page 19 of the Convention Committee Reports. The 68th Annual District Convention will be held the second weekend in June, 2000 in Fresno. The 1999 Fall workshop will be in San Francisco, November 14, 1999. Spring 2000 conference city has not been selected. Convention City 2001 will be Reno. Discussion of separating Scholarship Dinner from the Spring Conference and more Chapters participating in the Christmas Dinner Dance.

Convention Chairman PDG Mike Pappas adjourned the morning session at 11:45 a.m. Meetings to reconvene at 2 p.m. sharp!

Athletic Luncheon. The Athletic Luncheon was held following the morning business meeting sessions. The menu was a Texas Style Barbecue. Brother Tassos Konstantin chaired the event and was introduced by DG Gus Hazifotis. Three athletics were honored. They were Evangelos Gerontinos for swimming, bodybuilding and golf; Nikki Geanulias, a professional bowler and George Zuras, a great basketball player. Tassos should be commended for producing an excellent event. The Solano Chapter did an outstanding job of decorating the luncheon room including the center pieces. The luncheon was well attended, about 110 guests. See program on page of Convention Committee Reports.

BUSINESS MEETING SESSION - SATURDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 12, 1999.

Convention Chairman PDG Mike Pappas called the meeting to order at 2:10 p.m.

District Officers Reports Continued.

District Treasurer Alex Lemberes reporting. See Treasurer report on page 44 of the Convention Agenda. Brother Alex reported that chapters must send in their per capita tax in order to support the District activities.

Convention Committee Reports Continued.

Board of Advisors/Directors (2:15 p.m.). Chairman PDG Ted Cuclis reporting. Board after the Banquet Friday night. Ted Cuclis was elected President, George Margelos was elected Vice President and Paul Eliopoulos was elected Secretary/Treasurer. Dues were collected. Voted to donate \$200 to the Nicholas Kapetan Memorial Scholarship Fund. Written report on page 30 of the Convention Committee Reports. Motion to adopt report passed.

By-Laws, Rules and Regulations (2:20 p.m.). Chairman John Koplos reporting. Suggested that Chapter Reports to be given at one of the Conferences. Suggested that Early Bird Raffle be changed from 4 \$500 prizes to 2 \$500 and 1 \$1000 prizes. After discussion it was determined that these recommendations are not a function of this committee. A motion to table further discussion was made by Brother Jim Dariotis and 2nd by Brother Bill Rockas. No written committee report.

Sons of Pericles Advisor (2:25 p.m.) Brother Tassos Konstantin reporting. There were no official Sons meetings over the past year, however, they are active and four chapters are recognized by National. There was no written report.

Athletics. Chairman Tassos Konstantin reporting. The Hall of Fame project has been successful and supported by donations by the Oakland Chapter (\$150), Dr. Konstantin (\$150) and by a Golf Tournament Fund Raiser. No written report.

Legislative Banquet (2:30 p.m.) PDG Bill Rotas reporting. It has been 10 years since the last Legislative Banquet. The banquet is held only after is new Governor has been elected. A letter was sent to Governor Gray Davis, however, his office misplaced the letter. A second letter was hand delivered by Assemblymembers Lou Papan and Elaine Alquist. The Governor office will not commit to a schedule beyond 60 days. Brother Rotas feels that they need at least nine months to make arrangements for a Legislative Banquet. There was not a written report.

District Governor presented Supreme Governor E. John Rumpakis with a District #21 Ahepa shirt and hat.

Resolutions Committee (2:45 p.m.). Chairman PDG Charles Spyropoulos reporting. Resolutions commending the Solano Chapter et al and a change to the Olympic Medal were submitted to the delegates. Motion to adopt was passed. See pages 31-33 in the Convention Committee Reports.

Growth and Expansion (2:55 p.m.). Brother Lou Eleopoulos reporting. A resolution was submitted to form a committee to support a Hellenic Veterans Memorial and a Hellenic Veterans Library. Brother Lou Eleopoulos read the Veterans Resolution and asked to modify by removing reference to WWII and Washington, D.C. and to refer

resolution to Resolution Committee. See resolution on page of the Convention Committee Reports.

This concluded the Officer and Convention Committee Reports.

Roll Call to determine voting strength was taken at 3:00 p.m. Total count was 41. 6 Officers, 16 Past District Governors and 19 Delegates. See pages 12-18 of Convention Agenda.

Good of the Order (3:00 p.m.)

Ilias Frangos, San Mateo Chapter #290, asked the delegates for suggestions on creating more interest in attending meetings. Typically they only have about five members at their meetings even though they have 33 paid up members. Some suggestions were to offer a free meal, have joint meetings with the Daughters with a guest speaker and bringing in new members that show more interest.

Arnold Doer, Host Chapter, thanked everyone for their participation and hoped that all had an enjoyable convention. Thanked Brother Aristomenis Geltis for all his help with the Convention.

District Governor Gus Hazifotis, thanked the Solano Chapter for their hard work. Commented on the beautiful table decorations and thanked Brother Geltis for donating the dinner wine.

Elections (3:25 p.m.)

Election of District Governor: Brother Andy Banis nominated District Governor Gus Hazifotis for re-election. Brother Gus declined. Brother Bill Rockas nominated Brother Bill Booras, District Secretary, Fresno Chapter #151. The nomination was seconded by Brother Jim Nicolou. Brother George Johnson moved that the nominations be closed and since there were no other nominations the rules were waived and he asked for a unanimous ballot to be cast. Motion carried.

Election of District Lt. Governor: Brother Anthony Maris nominated District Secretary Alex Lemberes, Reno Chapter #281 for the office of District Lt. Governor. Nomination was seconded by George Konstantopoulos. A unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Alex Lemberes as District Lt. Governor.

Election of District Secretary: Brother Bill Booras nominated District Marshall Nick Karakas, Modesto Chapter #246 for the office of District Secretary. Nomination was seconded by Brother Ilias Frangos. A unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Nick Karakas as District Secretary.

Election of District Treasurer: Brother George Marmas nominated District Warden Bill Panagopoulos, Stockton Chapter #212, for the office of District Treasurer. Nomination was seconded by Brother Lou Janakos. A unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Bill Panagopoulos as District Treasurer.

Election of District Marshal: Brother Bill Rotas nominated Brother Jim Nicholson, Reno Chapter #281 for the office of District Marshal. Nomination was seconded by Brother John Kopolos. A unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Jim Nicholson for the office of District Marshal.

Election of District Warden: Brother George Johnson nominated Brother John Guy, San Mateo Chapter #392 for the office of District Warden. Brother Guy declined. This position will be appointed by the District Lodge.

Election of District Athletic Director: Brother Gus Hazifotis nominated District Athletic Director Tassos Konstantin for re-election for the office of District Athletic Director. The nomination was seconded by George Konstanopoulos. Brother Konstantin was re-elected to serve as District Athletic Director by unanimous ballot.

Election of District Scholarship Committee Members: The District Scholarship Committee is composed of nine members. This year there are openings for 4 new members (4 members of current committee terms have been completed). There were eight nominations to fill the 4 openings. Number of votes in parenthesis following names. Brother Ted Cuclis was nominated but declined to allow a wider chapter representation on the committee.

IN MARCH OF 1999 A CHECK FOR FIFTEEN HUNDRED DOLLARS WAS GIVEN TO ME (LOU JANAKOS PDG). I IN TURN PRESENTED THIS AMOUNT TO ZACH GEARGOPOULOS ATTORNEY AT LAW. THESE FUNDS WERE TO COVER THE COST OF LEGAL FEES, FILING FEES TO STATE BOARD AND IRS. FOR THE PURPOSE OF FORMING OF AN INDEPENDENT GOLDEN GATE AHEPA SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION AND TO OBTAIN OFFICIAL NON PROFIT STATUS UNDER CURRENT FEDERAL AND STATE GUIDE LINES. ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
AMERICAN HELLENIC EDUCATIONAL PROGRESSIVE ASSOCIATION
GOLDEN GATE DISTRICT 21 EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

BILL JONES, SECRETARY OF STATE

I. NAME

The name of the corporation is: American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association Golden Gate District 21 Educational Foundation.

II. PURPOSES

This Corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public purposes, as follows:

(a) The public purposes of the Corporation are to give and grant scholarships to able and worthy students of Hellenic descent, or of non-Hellenic descent, who meet certain educational criteria and who are (i) members of the following national organizations: the Order of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA), the Daughters of Penelope, the Sons of Pericles or the Maids of Athena, or (ii) are children of a person who is a member of the Order of AHEPA or the Daughters of Penelope, or (iii) are grandchildren of a member of the Order of AHEPA.

(b) The general purposes and powers of the Corporation are:

(1) To assist young people who are members or related to members of the above referenced Hellenic fraternal organizations to pursue their education by providing scholarship funds;

(2) To have and to exercise all the powers conferred by the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, as that law is now in effect or may at any time hereafter be amended.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), or by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

III. INITIAL AGENT FOR SERVICE OF PROCESS

The name of the initial agent of the Corporation for service of process is Zach Georgopoulos, whose complete business address is Georgopoulos & Pahlavan, LLP, 605 Market Street, Ste. 1300, San Francisco, CA 94105.

IV. DIRECTORS

The Corporation shall have five (5) directors until changed by an amendment to the Articles of Incorporation.

V. BYLAW PROVISIONS

(a) Directors. The manner in which Directors shall be chosen and removed from office, their qualifications, powers, duties, compensation, and tenure of office, the manner of filling vacancies on the Board, and the manner of calling and holding meetings of Directors, shall be as stated in the Bylaws.

(b) Members. The authorized number, if any, and qualifications of members of the Corporation, the filling of vacancies, the different classes of membership, if any, the property, voting, and other rights and privileges of members, and their liability to dues and assessments and the method of collection, and the termination and transfer of membership shall be as stated in the Bylaws.

VI. TRUST FUNDS

The Corporation may establish one or more common trust funds for the purpose of furnishing investments to it. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law in any way limiting the right of any of the foregoing or the officers or directors thereof, as fiduciary or otherwise, to invest funds held by them, it shall be lawful for the Corporation to invest any or all of its funds or property in shares or interests of such common trust fund or trust funds; provided, that, in the case of funds or property held as fiduciary, such investment is not prohibited by the wording of the instrument creating such fiduciary relationship.

VII. DEDICATION AND DISSOLUTION

(a) The property of this Corporation is irrevocably dedicated to the public purposes set forth in Article II hereof, and no part of the net income or assets of this organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof, or to the benefit of any private persons.

(b) On the dissolution or winding up of the Corporation, its assets remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of this Corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for public or charitable purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

(c) If this Corporation holds any assets in trust, or the Corporation is formed for charitable purposes, such assets shall be disposed of in such manner as may be directed by decree of the superior court of the county in which the Corporation has its principal office, on petition therefor by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation, in a proceeding to which the Attorney General is a party.

VIII. LIMITATION ON CORPORATE ACTIVITIES

No substantial part of the activities of this Corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall this Corporation participate or intervene in any political campaign (including publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

IX. DISTRIBUTION OF INCOME AND PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

Notwithstanding any other provision in these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall be subject to the following limitations and restrictions:

(a) The Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at a time and in a manner that will not subject the Corporation to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.


(b) The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

(c) The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

(d) The Corporation shall not make any investments that will subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

(e) The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.



The first grievence brought jto our attention referred to the fact that some Chapters have time limits for the Chapter meetings.



Resolution to Affect A Change In the Design of the Olympic Gold Medal

- 1) Whereas, the design of the Olympic Medal which is awarded at the Summer Olympic Games is not completely representative of the Olympic spirit. The Design consists of the Goddess of Victory, Nike, Two Palm Branches, an Olive Wreath, A Grecian Urn depicting a scene of Ancient Olympic History. A horse drawn chariot, The Five modern ERA Olympic rings, and the Roman Colosseum.

- 2) Whereas, the inclusion of the Roman Colosseum, is historically inaccurate and morally inappropriate. None of the Ancient Games were held in the Colosseum and for over 300 years of Roman Rule the Colosseum was not used for athletic contests. Instead the Colosseum was a site of intentional bloodshed where slaves and people of many nationalities were murdered by gladiators and Christians and Non-Christians were torn apart by lions. The Colosseum became a symbol of death and atrocity; the anti-thesis of the Olympic Spirit.

- 3) Therefore, be it resolved that AHEPA undertakes efforts to call upon the International Olympic Committee to revise a new medal design by removing the Roman Colosseum, but retaining the symbols which reflect the true Olympic spirit and history of honor, integrity, glory and brotherhood.
