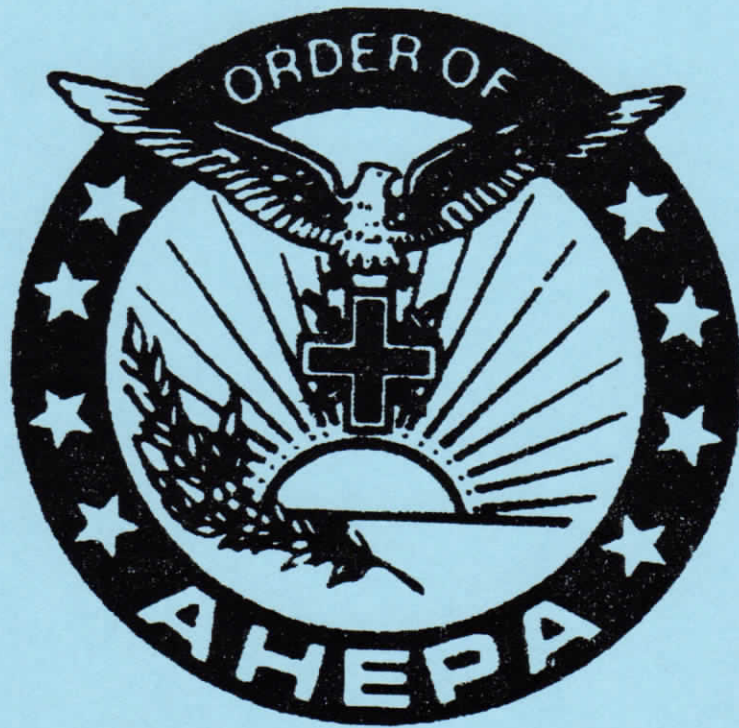

CONVENTION MINUTES

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY MORNING, JUNE 29, 2001

The meeting was called to order by K. Gus Hazifotis, co-chairman of the convention at 9:50 A.M. After some opening remarks Bro. Hazifotis introduced the District Governor Bill Booras.

District Governor Bill Booras welcomed the delegates to the 69th District Convention and thanked Bro. Hazifotis and the San Jose Chapter for chairing the convention. Brother Booras stated some of the ground rules in conducting the business meetings. He also pointed out that all committee reports be turned in typed or clearly printed with 1" margins on both sides. Bro. Booras explained some of the corrections that needed to be done in the Convention Agenda. Bro. Booras appointed Rick Kylan and Steve Drosos for the Credentials committee.

The convention was opened for business and Distr. Gov. Bill Booras read the names of the Delegates for a roll call. The voting strength was 26 Delegates. Bro. Booras appointed Delegates John Guy, Steve Drosos, Alex Bantis, and Steve Houvardas as Tellers for the Convention. The elected Convention Officers were as follows:

The oath of office for the newly elected Convention Officers was administered by Andy Banis, Supreme Vice President. Bro. Gus Hazifotis informed the Delegates about the agenda for the Delegates/Sports Awards Luncheon which was to take place at noon. Convention Chairman Harry Metaxas appointed Bill Rotas as Parliamentarian and Byron Gavrilis as Marshall/Sentinel.

The morning business session was adjourned at 11:45 A.M. so the Delegates could attend the Delegates/ Athletic Hall of Fame Awards Luncheon. Afternoon business session to start at 2:00 P.M.

The afternoon business session started with a report on the St. Nicholas Ranch by Father Tom Parris from the Oakland Church. He reported that the Retreat Center was increased from 300 acres to 338 acres with the purchase of the adjacent turkey ranch. The ranch is in better hands now, they are continually remodeling, they are having many conferences year round, mini camps, and various youth programs. Father Parris reported that there are many Elder Hostels at the ranch and they come from various parts of the state. The management is going to be changed shortly, and employees are paid hourly.

The cost to renovate the Ahepa Lodge will run from \$111,301.91 to \$133,155.71. See enclosed proposal from a Clovis, Ca. contractor. The Diocese recommends that the individual District 21 Chapters have fund raisers to raise money for the Ranch. Bro. John Guy asked if there were any other Ahepa District involved in raising money for the Ranch. The answer was no. PDG Anthony Maris has visited the Ranch recently and reported that it needed a lot of work to get it back in shape. See page 3 for balance of report.

Bro. Evangelos Gerontino reported that we should not keep funding the ranch if upkeep is not maintained. See page 37 and page 5 in Resolutions Report on the St. Nicholas Ranch.

Convention Chairman thanked Fr. Parris for bringing us up to date on the St. Nicholas Ranch renovation needs. Convention Chairman called for a roll call of Delegates. The voting strength for the afternoon business session was 31 Delegates.

District Governor Bill Booras gave his report. He noted that too many Chapter Secretaries and Treasurers are not following the normal rules in filling out reporting forms. Per capita tax checks should be sent along with the billing rosters that National Head- quarters provides. Per capita tax monies should be sent in on a regular basis and not wait to the last minute to be sent in. Chapter rosters should be examined for accuracy. One Chapter has a Brother still on the delinquent list when the Brother has been dead for almost 5 years. Other Chapters still have old area codes for phone numbers. Bro. Booras thanked the Chapters that have been sending him their monthly Chapter bulletins. Bro. Nick Korakas, Distr. Secretary, reported that he has copies of all checks mailed to him if anyone requires a copy.

Bro. Byron Gavrilis, Pres. of the Modesto Chapter donated \$500.00 from the Modesto Chapter for the District Scholarship Fund. Scholarship Chairman James Nicolaou thanked the Modesto chapter for their donation.

Distr. Gov. Bill Booras reported to the Delegates that we do not have a candidate for Lt. Distr. Gov., Distr. Marshall, and Distr. Warden. Bro. Byron Gavrilis again offered the Modesto area for a working seminar for the Chapter Secretaries and Treasurers.

Ahepa Time: Distr. Chaplain John Koplos gave a Prayer for our departed Brothers. The names of the departed Brothers was read. See page 38 for listing of our deceased Brothers.

Brother Gus Hazifotis, PDG reported on the Ahepa University Project. They are planing to add a third course, Greek Language. Donations are still coming in, but more are needed. Everyone was urged to try and find large donors to fund this important project.

Brother Andy Banis asked the Brothers for their support in Puerto Rico for his run for Supreme President. All Convention Committees were urged to have their meeting this afternoon and be prepared to report Saturday morning. All reports should be typed or printed with a one inch margin on each side.

The afternoon session was adjourned at 4:50 P.M. The Saturday, morning business session was to reconvene at 9:00 A.M.

Saturday morning Business Session:

The Convention Chairman Harry Metaxas opened the meeting at 9:05 A.M. Bro. Metaxas reported that the individual committee meetings were to be completed within the hour. Bro. Metaxas announced a recess until 10:15 A.M. The morning meeting reconvened at 10:20 A.M. There was a roll call of all Delegates. The voting strength was 34 Delegates.

*** The Daughters Liaison Committee brought the following items to the floor: All National Conventions should be held in areas where there are Ahepa Chapters and Districts. See page 34.**

The host Chapters for the District Conventions should be allowed to provide package deals for the Delegates. Bro. Anthony Maris PDG said that he was against packaged deals for Delegates, that it might be a hardship for delegates that got sick and could not attend. Bro. John Guy stated that it would make it easier for the hosts to make arrangements for the various luncheons and banquets. Bro. Antony Maris PDG also suggested that the host chapters should provide partial packages for guests. Bro. Steve Bolaris PDG stated that District 21 is allowing partial packages for guests currently, however, the full convention package is encouraged. A motion was made to defeat the convention full package. Motion was defeated by two votes. Host chapters for District Convention will be allowed to have full Delegate packages along with guest packages and partial Delegates packages for Delegates that cannot attend the Friday business session and banquet. The two District Lodges must be informed of what the host chapters are planning.

*** John Koplos moved to reduce the business sessions, so that we may accommodate more delegates to attend the conventions. He also suggested that the starting times be altered. The motion was tabled and that future conventions to remain the same.**

Several Brothers suggested that each Chapter try to promote youth activities or career days within their own community, so that we can encourage Hellenism to our Hellenes and Phil Hellenes.

*** Scholarship Committee: Chairman Bro. Agamemnon Zafiratos PDG read the report from the Scholarship Committee. Report was approved by the body. See page 27 for written report.**

*** Ahepa Traveler Committee: Chairman Bro. Alex Bantis read the Ahepa Traveler Report which was approved by the body. Page two of Traveler to have names and addresses of officers in bold type. expand the advertisers so as to increase revenue to defray cost of the traveler and the district. See page 29 for the written report.**

Distr. Gov. Bill Booras suggested that names and telephone numbers be listed on Convention letters that are sent to the Chapters and/or Delegates.

*** Bro. Arnold Dorer suggested that a motion be made for the formation of a new committee for previously awarded scholarship recipients. This committee is to keep our District informed about their college progress. The Scholarship recipients would be speaking at various local or District functions to talk about their progress. Bro. Charles Spyropoulos PDG moved that this new committee be formed to keep track of the Scholarship recipients for a period of five(5) years. Bro. Alex Bantis second the motion. Motion was passed.**

*** Audit and Finance Committee: Chairman Arnold Dorer of the Audit and Finance Committee read the report. The Operating Account Summary for District 21 was added by Bro. Bill Rotas PDG(who did the work for the report given by Arnold Dorer)Bro.Ted Pandazis moved that the report be approved, second by Bro. Agamemnon Zafiratos PDG. Motion pass. See page 31 for written report.**

Legislation & Resolutions Committee: Chairman Bro. John Guy read the Legislation & Resolutions report:

Item 1 - St. Nicholas Ranch & Retreat Center. The committee agreed that if any monies are to be allocated for the renovation or repairs for the Ahepa Building, then the following criteria is recommended from the Diocese: 1. At least two more construction bids be submitted in detail for all expenses. 2. An audit of the financial records pertaining to the Ahepa Building be submitted regularly. 3. Maintenance records are to be submitted for inspection. 4. A list of the duties of the maintenance personnel be submitted. 5. A deposit to be required by all groups using the facility. 6. A detailed report after each use of any damages be submitted. 7. Cost of damages to be deducted from deposit. 8. District 21 would like to know extent of the insurance of our Ahepa Building funding. The proposal submitted by Bro. John Guy and his committee was tabled until the Fall Conference. See page 34 for written report. See Special Project report on page 30 for further input.

Special Projects Committee: Chairman, Bro. James Nicolaou reported.

*** Item 1. Charitable Raffle. The committee approved the ongoing of the District 21 Charitable Raffle as it is currently being carried out. Approved by the body. See pages 30 & 44**

*** Item 2. St. Nicholas Ranch: Regarding the proposal submitted by Fr. Paris. \$10,000.00 is to be allocated from the District 21 funds for improvements to the Ahepa Lodge Building at the St. Nicholas Ranch. Before release of these funds to the Diocese the following conditions must be met. 1. An Ahepa District Committee will be formed with a minimum of 3 and a maximum five members to meet with the Diocese on matters concerning the renovations of the facility and review their proposal. 2. A written proposal from the Diocese on how the money will specifically be spent, and also to include a written program on how the facility will be maintained in the future. 3. Before the Fall Conference 2001, the District Committee will evaluate the Dioceses proposal and report to the Fall Conference and authorize the release of funds at that time, if appropriate. 4. The Chapters and the District in the coming years through ongoing fund raising efforts continue to finance the renovations of the Ahepa Lodge facility. Bro. Bill Rotas PDG second the motion. Bro. Charles Spyropoulos PDG suggested that a itemization of St. Nicholas Ranch expenses should be allowed to be inspected on a regular basis. Bro. Steve Houvardas suggested that guide lines be part as a amendment to the previous resolution with safeguards. The motion was defeated.**

Monies from CD: Bro. Bill Rotas PDG reporting. Currently the budget has \$11,715.00 to spend. Bro. Rotas moved that District 21 treasury put \$10,000.00 in a CD (preferable for a short term i.e.. 6 months). Bro. Alex Bantis amended the motion to read "in a money market account instead of the CD" The motion and amendment were tabled until further discussion.

The morning business session was recessed for the Salute to Veterans Luncheon at 11:50 A.M. The afternoon session was to reconvene at 2:00 P.M.

The Saturday afternoon business session was called to order by the Convention Chairman Harry Metaxas at 2:10 P.M. Bro. Metaxas stated that the roll call of Delegates will be just before the District Lodge Elections.

Special District Awards Committee: The current District Lodge met and decided on the following awards: **The Ahepan of the Year - K. Gus Hazifotis**, PDG, Garden City Chapter #251. Brother Gus will be presented at the National Convention representing District No. 21 for National Ahepan of the Year. **Chapter President of the Year - Bro. Byron Gavrilis**, Modesto Chapter No. 246. **Chapter of the Year - Contra Costa Chapter No. 259.** **Most improved Chapter Marysville Chapter No. 228.** See page 36 for written report.

* Bro. John Copoulos, Reno #281 stated that Reno would not be bidding for the 2002 District Convention. Convention Chairman Harry Metaxas suggested that District 21 would opt for a Trio-District Convention in Reno for the year 2002. Bro. Copoulos questioned how the net profits, if any, would be distributed among the three Districts? Bro. Metaxas answered that the division of profits would be determined on a percentage basis. Bro. Mike Pappas PDG, Convention Cities Chairman reported that the Daughters of Penelope delegates from Modesto thought that the Ahepa Delegates from Modesto would opt for the 2002 District Convention, before the Fall Conference. Bro. Ted Pantazis President of the Sacramento Chapter No. 153 stated that they are considering the District Convention for 2003. Bro. John Koplos PDG moved that the Convention Cities Report be tabled until the Fall Conference. Bro. James Dariotes second the motion. Motion passed.

Distr. Governor Bill Booras stated that the San Francisco Ahepa Family is willing to host the Fall District Conference on Sunday, November 11, 2001, in conjunction with the 72nd Anniversary of the Daughters of Penelope Eos Chapter #1 with a luncheon or dinner for Saturday, November 11, 2001.

* **Budget and Finance:** Bros. Ted Pantazis and Steve Houvardas reported the following: After reviewing the projections of the District 21 Operating Account Summary Bro. Pantazis moved that the per capita tax be increased by \$1.00 per member starting January 1, 2002 to lessen the deficit of the annual proposed budget. Motion was approved. See pages 41 & 42.

* At this time Bro. Gus Hazifotis PDG brought up the issue that was approved at the 1995 District Convention pertaining to the payment of a **full package by the Delegates at each Convention.** The Parliamentarian Bro. Bill Rotas PDG stated the 1995 amendment(to the best of his recollection) that it was superseded by another motion. The new motion was to re-word the 1995 amendment for the full convention package so that it was clearer. Bro. Tassos Konstantin stated that the 1995 full package amendment was somewhat unclear about the wording. The 1995 full package amendment remains the same. Bro. Steve Bolaris PDG moved that the registration fee be increased from \$10 to \$50 in order to supplement lack of revenue. Bro. Ted Pantazis second the motion. However the motion was a no vote. The registration package remains the same. District 21 future conventions will use the same format as San Jose #251. Guest and partial packages should also be made available.

Bro. Louis Eleopoulos stated that the Ahepa Veterans should not have to pay for the Veterans Medal. It was announced by National Headquarters that the individual Chapters should pay the \$25 for each of the medals to be presented. Bro. Eleopoulos announced that there were two District #21 Chapters that did not pay for the Ahepan Veterans Medal. Bro. Eleopoulos Chairman for the Hellenic American Veterans Memorial urged the Delegates to get the word out to Veterans that they know about the Memorial. This will help promote the AhepaHeaven.Org., so we can help honor our Veterans by organizing committees. See page 40

Scholarship Foundation: Bro. Charles Spyropoulos asked if the Foundation is considered a non-profit organization. Bro. Bill Rotas PDG answered that the Foundation has been recognized as a non-profit organization, however it has not been finalized officially.

The Convention Chairman Harry Metaxas call for a roll call of Delegates prior to the nominations and elections of District Lodge Officers. The voting strength was 35 Delegates. The Golden Gate District #21 Scholarship Program once again has awarded in 2001 a total of 13 scholarships in the total amount of \$13,000.00. The recipients are:



Bro. Chairman, District, Officers of this District Lodge, Delegates & Brothers:



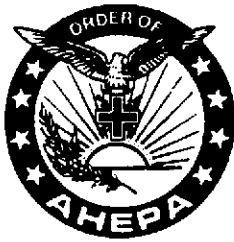
