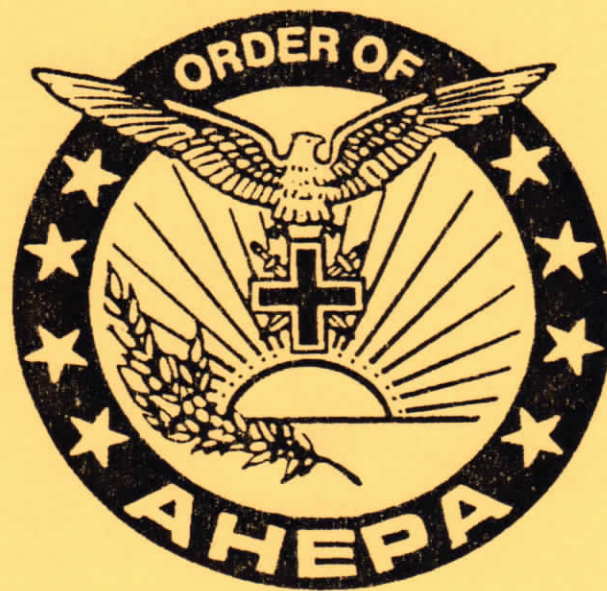

CONVENTION MINUTES

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY MORNING, JUNE 20, 2003

The 71st Annual District #21 Convention, hosted by the Modesto Chapter #246 and the Phaedra Chapter #29 Daughters of Penelope, was called to order by the Convention Chairman Byron Gavrilis at 9:35 a.m. District Chaplain Byron Gavrilis opened the meeting with a prayer. Brother Gavrilis welcomed all the delegates and assured them that a successful convention has been planed.

Brother Gavrilis introduced the District Governor James Daritotes. Brother Dariotes started the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Election of Convention Officers: The following Brothers were elected as Convention Officers:

Convention Chairman Bill Booras elected James Nicolaou, Gerald Vrionis, Jeff Brown, and Nick Pries and tellers.

Convention Chairman Bill Booras called the roll of delegates. The voting strength of the morning session was 21 delegates including District Lodge Officers and Past District Governors. See Voting Strength Page 11 in Convention Agenda.

Past Supreme President Andrew Banis moved that we dedicate this convention to our departed Brothers. Bill Booras read the names of the Brothers that had passed away this last year. See Memorial pages 19-21 in the Convention Agenda. The motion was passed.

The Convention Chairman appointed Brother Chris Rockas as Parliamentarian and Brother Charles Spyropoulos as Marshall.

CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED

Chapter Reports: The next item of business was Chapter Reports. The written reports are on pages 22-33 of the Convention Agenda. Brother Bill Booras who was agenda editor reported that only one chapter did not send in a Chapter Report. Many of the reports were incomplete. See written report on page 33-34. Brother Andy Banis apologized for the Oakland Chapter report for not being complete. He also felt that the report was not a majority of the chapter, but that of one person. District Governor James Dariotes suggested that a letter be written to the Oakland Chapter requesting that they send a completed chapter report including finances.

Selecting of Working Committees:

Chairman Bill Booras informed the delegates that the sign up sheets for the Convention Committee's were laid out on the table in the back of the room. He also informed the delegates that he would like to have one delegate from each chapter to sign up for the Hellenic American Veterans Memorial Committee. The chairman of the various committee's have been pre-selected, and he urged the Brothers to find a committee that they were interested in and to sign up for more than one committee. Committee chairman will announce location and time of meeting. Convention minutes from the last three District Conventions were available for reference.

Byron Gavrilis, Host City Chairman informed the Delegates that the Delegates Luncheon will be in the room next to the business meeting room. The Saturday "Greek Heritage Luncheon" will be ethnic oriented with music and a fine luncheon. He also reported that the Grand Banquet will be in this room, so please take all you materials with you after the afternoon business session.

Brother Byron Gavrilis also reported that Brother Alex Bass was taking video pictures of all the convention activities starting with the golf tournament and including all luncheons, grand banquet, Glendi, and Sundays going away brunch. The video will be for sale for \$10.00, and will be reviewed at the Glendi and the Sunday brunch.

Good of the Order:

Byron Gavrilis asked the delegates to view at the Veterans Memorial statue located in the lobby. The sculptor is here and the location is scheduled for Greece. Meeting recessed at 11:30 p.m. and to resume at 2:00 p.m.

CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY AFTERNOON JUNE 20, 2003

The afternoon business session was called to order by the Vice Chairman Mike Pappas at 2:00 p.m.. The first order of business was a roll call of Delegates by the Vice Chairman. The afternoon voting strength was 29 delegates. Brother Mike Pappas, Vice Chairman, asked if there were any reports other than the District Governors that should be presented. None appearing the Vice Chairman introduced the Supreme Governor K. Gus Hazifotis. Brother Gus congratulated the Modesto Chapter for putting on a great Convention and a Convention Album. He commented on the recognition of the few deceased family members that were recognized in the album. He related to his activities on the Supreme Lodge, and his experience on the Supreme Lodge has been very disappointing. Brother Hazifotis praised Past Supreme Governor Said Hussein for his accomplishments in Ahepa. This year Brother Hussein received the Ellis Island Medal of Honor for his accomplishments. Brother Gus stated that we have to start re-building Ahepa. He urged all elected Delegates to be at the National Convention. He also said that the good works of Ahepa start at the Chapter and District level. Supreme Governor Gus Hazifotis also apologized for the Supreme President James Dimitriou for not sending a message for the Convention Album.

District Governors Report:

Brother James Dariotes reported that he did receive a form letter from the Supreme Presidents which was sent out from National Headquarters, but it was received too late to be published into the Convention Album. The District Governors report can be found on page 43 of the Convention Agenda. Brother James also reported that he had presented Past District Governor Bill Booras his PDG plaque at his testimonial dinner on May 31st in Fresno. At this time he presented to Brother Byron Gavrilis a gift for being nominated President of the Year at the 2002 District Convention.

Convention Vice Chairman, Mike Pappas and Convention Cities Chairman, reported that in the past we had a three year list of hosted District Convention Cities. Of late it has come down to year by year. He urged the Delegates present to volunteer their chapter for the up coming District Conventions. He also reported that the District Governor of the Daughters of Penelope Jan Spanos told him that Sacramento is willing to host the 2004 District Convention. If this is true we only need host chapters for 2005 and 2006. Brother Mike reported that the Convention Cities Committee will meet in this room when the afternoon session is adjourned.

CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED

He also reminded the Delegates to sign up for one or two of the committee's and to remove all their papers after the recess. Brother Arnold Dorer District Secretary reported that one of the organizations that he is a member of secures conventions with the same hotel for three years in advance. This way the rates can be lower? Brother Andy Banis suggested that the business sessions should start a 1:00 p.m. on Fridays. He felt that the Friday business could be conducted in a shorter time. The District and/or the Past District Governors should consider ways to shorten the convention days and they also should be more diligent in promoting the District Convention to the District Chapters. It was suggested that the District should have a web site to promote its activities and conventions. It was suggested that the two District Lodges get together prior to the Fall District Conference and come up with a newer format for District Conventions.

Good of the Order:

Brother Lou Janakos, PDG suggested that we get back to basics by having joint chapter installation of officers. He felt that we do not have anything together except for conferences and conventions. Other combined affairs and other family oriented activities may draw in new members. Brother Andy Banis felt that we should acknowledge the Modesto Chapter for arranging this room correctly, with the two flags, the Ahepa Seal, and table arrangements. Past District Governors to meet after the Banquet in room 426. Brother Mike reminded the Delegates that all reports will be ready at 9:00 a.m. tomorrow and that the reports should be typed or neatly printed. The meeting was recessed until 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning.

BUSINESS SESSION - SATURDAY, JUNE 21, 2003

The Saturday morning business session was called to order by the Chairman Bill Booras at approximately 9:20 A.M. The first order of business was the roll call of Delegates present. The voting strength at the morning session was 35 Delegates. See page 11 of Agenda for the count. Brother Harry Metaxas from the Oakland Chapter moved that any registered Delegates entering the meeting will be charged \$5.00 for being late. Any money collected will be for the Scholarship Fund. He also agreed to be the collector. Bro. Peter Kireopoulos second the motion. Motion passed.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE: Chairman Bro. Peter Kireopoulos reported that there were no grievances from any of the Chapters or members.

CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED

CONVENTION CITIES & CONFERENCE COMMITTEE: Chairman Bro. Mike Pappas reported that he did get a 3 year cushion on convention cities. The Fall conference will be hosted in October by Oakland, the Spring conference will be hosted by the San Jose Chapter in February. Convention City for 2004 will be in Sacramento. Convention City for 2005 will be in Reno. Convention City for 2006 will be in San Jose. Note: The Sacramento convention will be a District Lodge Project, this will be a joint effort with the Sacramento Chapter and the District Lodge. See page 10 for report.

GROWTH AND EXPANSION COMMITTEE: Chairman Bro. Charles Spyropoulos reported on six items to help the chapters. Some of the items are: Joint meetings with the Daughters of Penelope to discuss guest speakers. Time limits for meetings. District Lodge to recruit past Sons of Pericles members. Oath of office should be delivered by members of the district lodge. For written report see page 11.

AHEPA TRAVELER COMMITTEE: Chairman Bro. Byron Gavrilis reported that the Traveler should send one copy per household. Should delinquent members receive the Traveler? The Traveler should be the advocate for the District Lodge. The Traveler must be the **VOICE OF THE DISTRICT LODGES**. Additional ads should be solicited to help finance the Traveler. The current editor should be commended for the excellent quality of the Traveler. The above recommendations are intended to make this publication an even more effective tool of communications to assist chapters and the district to promote goals, projects, and events. For the written and more detailed report see page 12.

Discussion from the floor indicated that we should be on the Internet to better communicate between Chapters, District, and National Headquarters. Using the Internet to receive the Traveler will cost less per copy. P.D.G. Bill Rotas reminded the chapter secretaries should send to the editor of the Traveler an updated mailing list of active members of the Ahepa and Daughters chapters.

SPECIAL PROJECTS COMMITTEE: P.S.P. Andy Banis reported that the primary project of the District is the Charitable Raffle. The beneficiaries of the raffle are the: The Scholarship Committee, Individual Chapters, and the District Lodges. It was approved that the Charitable Raffle be continued. There was also discussion on the convention city providing a photo album on all the affairs of the convention. The photo album and/or video could be sold to the Delegates of the convention. For the written and more detailed report see page 13.

CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED

DAUGHTERS LIAISON COMMITTEE: District Governor James Dariotes reporting. Bro. Jim met with Jan Spanos District Governor of the Daughters of Penelope. The Daughters want us to continue with and will support the Charitable Raffle. There was no other problems between the two Lodges. There was no written report submitted.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE: The chairman was P.D.G. Chris Rockas. Resolutions #1 thru #5 were standard resolutions and approved by the convention body without discussion. Resolution #6 was to have the various chapters of the district to allocate \$100.00 or more to each delegate that they send to the District Convention as a delegate. After much discussion Resolution #6 was tabled.

Resolution #7 was in regards to the Soldier Statue Project to be removed from HAVM Foundation. The Soldier Statue to be sponsored by the Ahepa Chapter No. 171 within District #21 and will be separated from the HAVM Foundation project. This resolution was passed

Resolution #8 was for the support of the Pan Macedonian Association to remove the name Macedonia from the FYROM name. This resolution was passed. For the written and more detailed report see pages 14-19.

PAST DISTRICT GOVERNORS REPORT: There was no written report at this time. Bro. Bill Booras reported that the P.D.G. elected Mike Pappas as Chairman, Bill Booras as Vice Chairman, Paul Eliopoulos as Treasurer, and Steve Bolaris as Secretary. The committee will get together to revise the Rules and Regulations on conducting a District Convention. One recommendation from the Past District Governors was to start the business session of the convention at 11:00 A.M. or 12:00 Noon on Friday instead of 9:00 A.M. This will shorten the convention time and allow the delegates more time to get to the convention city. See written report on page 20-21. The written report was received after the convention.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT: This report was not given at the business session of the convention. The Scholarship Committee has been superseded by the Scholarship Foundation. See written report on page 22.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE: Preliminary report was given by Chairman Arnold Dorer. See report on pages 28-30.

CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED

YEAR END DISTRICT 21 FINANCIAL STATEMENT: The following report was received after the convention. For the written and more detailed report see pages 20-27. For the Educational Foundation Operating Statement see pages 31-32.

DISTRICT LODGE COMMITTEE REPORT: District Governor James Dariotes reported on the awards for President of the Year, Chapter of the Year, and Ahepan of the Year. See page 33 for the written report.

The voting strength of the convention body at Saturday afternoon was 35 Delegates: District Lodge - 7, Past District Governors - 9, and Chapter Delegates - 18. The convention chairman appointed the follow delegates to be tellers for the purpose of counting election votes.: James Nicolaou from Fresno Chapter, Gerald Vrionis from San Francisco, Jeff Brown from Modesto and Chris Frangos from San Mateo.

The Convention Chairman Bill Booras informed the body that the appointed officers for the positions of Chaplain, Auditor, Advisor to the Sons of Pericles, Legal Advisor, and Public relation will be appointed by the District Governor and the District Lodge.

NOMINATIONS FOR SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: James Nicolaou read the names of the Brothers that will be going off the Scholarship committee: Steve Bolaris, Bill Booras, Bill Rotas, and Andy Banis. Since Andy Banis wanted off the committee he recommended Bro. Alex Bantis.

Brother James Nicolaou put into nomination all of the above Brothers. A unanimous ballot was cast for Steve Bolaris, Bill Booras, Bill Rotas, and Alex Bantis to be on the Scholarship Committee for the next 4 years.

CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED

The Convention chairman invited Past Supreme President Andrew Banis to the podium to give the oath of office to the newly elected District Lodge Officers and the newly elected Scholarship committee members.

The District Governor James Dariotes thanked the body for electing him and the new District Lodge and he wished for a successful year. We will meet again at the next District Convention.

Byron Gavrilis gave the closing prayer. The 71st District Convention was adjourned at 4:30 P.M.



TRAVELER COMMITTEE

Recommendations

1. Closer controls are needed to insure that those members who are entitled to receive the Traveler actually receive the Traveler. Many members are not getting it on a regular basis. One copy per household would be sufficient.
2. The matter of members who are delinquent in dues needs to be restudied and communicated with the printer.
3. The Traveler must be an **advocate** for the District Lodges. Both district governors should use the Traveler as their primary source of getting out their messages to individual members. The Traveler must be the primary source for promoting conferences, conventions and social events. Any cost for postage and handling of extra promotional pages may be paid by the chapter(s) hosting these events. The Traveler must be the **VOICE OF THE DISTRICT LODGES**. The District Governors must become more involved with the choices of articles and notices to be published.
4. The Traveler must be published on a timelier basis according to a schedule determined jointly with District Lodge Governors and the publisher. A special edition should focus primarily on Convention activities, deadlines and costs. At least one additional publication should be scheduled and mailed on a predictable calendar basis.
5. Additional ads should be solicited to help finance the Traveler. Consideration should be given to place certain ads inside the pages.
6. The current editor should be commended for the excellent quality of our Traveler. Very few complaints were discussed. The above recommendations are intended to make this publication an even more effective tool of communications to assist chapters and the district to promote goals, projects and events.

Where as, the mission of the Ahepa Family is to promote Hellenism, Education, Philanthropy, Civic Responsibility, Family and Individual Excellence

Where as, the Order of Ahepa is the leader in upholding the History, Tradition, & Culture of Hellenism;

- ❖ To streamline the convention, Mike Pappas suggested that we skip verbal presentation of the chapter reports and the morning reporting sessions.
- ❖ Bill Rotas suggested that the newly elected District Lodge meet on Sunday.
- ❖ Gus Hazifotis suggested a Glendi after the Scholarship Banquet.
- ❖ The PDG Committee acting as the steering committee for Dist 21 will recommend that the following members be nominated for the DL: Tasso Konstantin as Lt. Governor; Byron Gavrilis as Secretary; Vlasi Fousekis as Treasurer (Nick Kourakis, current Treasurer cannot run); Alex Bantis as Warden; Jim Nicholson as Marshall; and Paul Eliopoulos as Chairman of the Scholarship Raffle Committee.



