CONVENTION MINUTES

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY MORNING, JUNE 25, 2004

The 72nd Annual District #21 Convention, hosted by the Sacramento Chapter #153 and the Artemis Chapter #5 Daughters of Penelope, was called to order by the Convention Chairman Bill Rotas at 10:00 A.M. District Chaplain Steve Miller opened the meeting with a prayer. Brother Rotas welcomed all the delegates and assured them that a successful convention has been planed. Brother Rotas thanked Brothers Geroge Koufasimis and John Dariotis who were a great help. He then introduced the District Governor Anastasios Konstantin. Bro. Taso introduced Past Supreme President Andy Banis. Brother Steve Miller opened the meeting with a prayer. Distr. Secretary Byron Gavrilis calls roll of Delegates present. Voting strength was 28 Delegates. See page 10 of agenda for count. The following Brothers were appointed tellers: Peter Kireopoulos, Steve Miller, and Arnold Dorer.

Election of Convention Officers: The following Brothers were elected as Convention Officers:

Convention Chairman: Mike Pappas, Golden Gate Chapter #150 Convention Vice Chairman: Peter Kireopoulos, Golden Gate Chapter #150 Convention Secretary: Bill Booras, Fresno Chapter #151

Past Supreme Pres. Andy Banis gave the oath of office for the newly elected Convention Business Officers.

The Convention Chairman appointed Brother Chris Rockas as Parliamentarian and Brother Stamus Cocolas as Marshall/Sentinel.

District Governor suggested that the following committees be discussed as a committee of the whole: Convention Cities-Conferences, Sons of Pericles, Athletics, Traveler, Growth and Expansion, Special Projects, and Daughters Liaison. Committees to be held individually are Grievance, Audit and Budget, Resolutions and Legislation. Andy Banis moved that that we conduct the convention committees as presented by the District Governor for this convention only. Byron Gavrilis second the motion. Motion passed.

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Chapter Reports: The next item of business was Chapter Reports. The written reports are on pages 22-33 of the Convention Agenda. Brother Bill Booras agenda editor reported that only one chapter did not send in a Chapter Report. Many of the reports were incomplete. Bro. Booras reported that Bro. Steve Kakos from San Jose should be added to the memorial pages. Agenda Editors report is located on page 51. Convention Chairman reported that Chapter Reports are not to be read, only items of importance should be reported.

District Chaplain: Steve Miller. No written report-It has been an honor and pleasure to serve a Chaplain with Distr.Governor Taso. It was an eye opener to visit the chapters of the Distr. We are alive and well, but we need to recruit younger members.

District Athletic Director: Bill Kushner. No written Report

District Warden: Alex Bantis. No written Report District Marshall: Jim Nicholson. No written report

District Secretary: Byron Gavrilis. See written report on page 54.

District Treasurer: Vlasis Fousekis. See written report on page 55. There

is \$10,000 in the bank with most bills paid.

District Lt. District Governor: Paul Eliopoulos. See written report on

District Governors: Report will be given at the afternoon session

Charitable Raffle Report: See pages 35-46 for current report. Paul Eliopoulos chairman of the Charitable Raffle Committee reported on the results of the last years charitable raffle.

Selecting of Working Committees:

Chairman Bill Booras informed the delegates that sign up sheets for the Convention Committees were laid out on the table in the back of the room. He also informed the delegates that he would like to have one delegate from each chapter to sign up for the Hellenic American Veterans Memorial Committee. The chairman of the various committees have been pre-selected, and he urged the Brothers to find a committee that they were interested in and to sign up for more than one committee. Committee chairman will announce location and time of meeting. Convention minutes from the last three District Conventions were available for reference.

Good of the Order: Past Supreme President Andy Banis reported that District 21 has the opportunity to have a Supreme Governor. Past District Governor Chris Rockas from the Fresno Chapter #151 has aggreed to run for the position of Supreme Governor from District 21. Andy Banis moved that District 21 unanimously support and endorse Bro. Chris Rockas for Supreme Governor of the Order of AHEPA. Motion passed. Illias Frangos suggested that members of other chapters visit with the District Lodge visitations. Mike Pappas suggested that we try to get a District calendar to eliminate conflict between the chapters.

Convention Minutes

Good of the Order Continued: Byron Gavrilis suggested that the chapters use the Internet to communicate with each other. Alex Bazos suggested that the District purchase a templete for Internet use and the various chapters work thru the web page. Chris Rockas reported that National Headquarters position on Hellenism has died. He inquired with National Headquarters as to what material they had on Hellenism; their reply was nothing. A resolution will be coming up at this convention from Fresno concerning Hellenism. Alex Bazos suggested that we need a committee on public relations. We are too laxed in blowing our whistle. We need person or a committee for public relations. Arnold Dorer suggested that the bigger chapters meet with the smaller chapters once or twice a year to exchange ideas and help the smaller chapter.

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY AFTERNOON JUNE 25, 2004.

The afternoon business session was called to order by the Chairman Mike Pappas at 2:00 p.m. The first order of business was a roll call of Delegates by the Secretary. The afternoon voting strength was 33 delegates. Taso Konstantin moved that we accept the District Lodge reports and Chapter reports already presented. Byron Gavrilis seconds the motion. Motion passed.

District Governors Report: District Governors written report on page 52. Taso announced that after his report there would be a Committee of the Whole meeting with all the Delegates. Budget and Finance will be meeting separately. District Governor Taso Konstantin thanked all the Brothers that helped him get started after Jim Dariotes steped down as Governor to accept a job out of state. He also encouraged the Brothers to maintain very good relationship with the Daughters of Penelope. Smaller Chapters should maybe merge with bigger neighbor Chapters and possible find members at communities that have large church congregations. He also suggested that we must find ways to conserve our archives. The membership should try to come up with a solution on saving the History of District 21 and its Chapters. Taso also thanked the Brothers that put on the workshops at the Conference in San Jose. Northern California AHEPA Athletic Hall of Fame has inducted members at three different sessions. There are 20 to 30 names yet to be investigated. He needs help to organize another induction. He would also like to see the Hall of Fame included in the web site. Initial web site was set up by Bro. Gus Hazifotis, but the web site is now locked up. The new web site can be used to keep most of our archives

District Governors report continued: At the Fall District Conference we will set up a display of the District Web site. A master calendar can be provided to show what events each chapter is having. Money will be requied to set up web site. Advertisers will help pay for the web site. Chris Rockas suggested that each Chapter pay \$50.00 per year to subsidize the web site. The Oakland Chapter web site costs approximately \$400.00 per year. Taso would like to have \$400.00 put in this years budget to take care of the web site. Stamus Cocolas moved that the Budget Committee include \$500.00 in the District Budget for the District web site, also a line item to be included for \$500.00 for 2004 to 2005. Byron Gavrilis seconds the motion. Motion passed. Distr. Gov. Taso Konstantin moved for the adoption of his report. Motion passed. See written report on page 52.

The Convention Chairman Mike Pappas in memory of our departed Brothers asked for a moment of silence. Convention Secretary Bill Booras read the names of our departed Brothers. Andy Banis also added the name of Fr. Anthony Kosturas who was supportive of AHEPA. Mike Pappas suggested that during the moment of silence for our current departed Brothers we should also include some of the names of Brothers who have departed from the past. The main meeting was adjourned at 3:05 P.M. and the Saturday meeting to begin at 9:30 A.M. Vice Chairman of the Convention Peter Kireopoulos announced that the Committee of the Whole will meet in five (5) minutes in this room.

<u>Committee of the Whole Meeting</u>: The meeting of the Whole was called to order by Taso Konstatin at 3:50 P.M. Topics to be discussed will include Daughters Liaison, Convention-Conference Cities, Traveler, Growth and Expansion, and Sons of Pericles-Athletics.

Convention Cities and Conferences: There was a lot of discussion about having a District Convention. Mike Pappas with the approval of his chapter will chair the convention for 2006. Byron Gavrilis and Harry Metaxas suggested that we have the next District Convention at an Indian casino. Victor Kiriakis suggested that if we can not get a chapter to host the 2005 convention, why not have the District Lodge host the convention. It was also suggested that a joint committee with the Daughters of Penelope be formed to plan and host District Conventions. Most of the committee approved of the suggestion. It was also suggested that any Chapter could host a District Convention in Reno other than Reno.

Committee of the Whole continued:

Special Projects: Paul Eliopoulos reported that it has been harder to sell tickets. He does have help to record ticket sales, but needs help to sell raffle tickets. Paul Eliopoulos moved that we continue the Charitable Raffle for 2005. Stamus Cocolas seconds the motion. Motion passed. The Charitable Raffle could be advertised on the web page. The new Lt. Governor will promote the Charitable Raffle and assist the Chairman, Paul Eliopoulos.

Sons of Pericles and Athletics: It was reported that there was not a ligitimate Sons of Pericles Chapter in District 21. Taso Konstantin explained how the Sons come together during the basketball tournaments.

Athlectic Hall of Fame: Taso would like to have a chairman for the Northern California AHEPA Athletic Hall of Fame. The Athletic Director to be a member of the District Lodge should chair this function and the presentations should be in conjunction with the Delegates Luncheon during the Convention. This committee and the recipients should also be part of the web site.

Ahepa Traveler: Editor Bill Christie reported that he wants his recommendations to be read at the Saturdays Business session under Traveler Committee. Bill Booras encouraged the Brothers to try and get their Chapters and business? to advertise in the Traveler.

Growth and Expansion: Byron Gavrilis suggested that we look into starting new Chapters in other cities in our District. The District Lodge to explore area of growth. It was also suggested that a standing committee be formed to explore growth and expansion. It also was suggested that we go after past Scholarship recipients. Michael Makredes suggested that the Chapters must be able to provide a variety of programs to keep the new members and to reinstate delinquent members.

Committee of the Whole was adjourned at 5:00 P.M.

BUSINESS SESSION - SATURDAY, JUNE 26, 2004

The Saturday Business session was called to order at 9:35 A.M. by the Convention Chairman Mike Pappas. Convention Secretary Bill Booras read the roll of Officers and Delegates. The voting strength for the morning session was 37 Delegates. Vice Chairman Peter Kireopoulos called for the reading of Convention Committee reports.

Ahepa Traveler Committee Report: In the absence of the Editor Bill Christie Bill Booras read the Traverler Committee Report. Topics discussed included the following: Content, Circulation, Production Schedule, Cost, Advertising, Bulk Rate Permit, Recommendations, and Summary. The Traveler is interested in improving the content and delivery of the publication. Recommendations and suggestions, within budget restraints, are important. With little effort and cooperation from all we can achive this goal. See pages 72-73 for written report. Andy Banis PSG reported that the current District Governor has not furnished an article to the Traveler. It is imperative that the Governor supply the editor with a report for every issue. Vice Chairman Peter Kireopoulos referred the suggestion from Andy Banis to the Grievance Committee. Byron Gavrilis reported that receiving the Traveler through the Internet was a great idea. To do this we must have every members E-mail address. Alex Bazos reported that the easiest was to build up your data base is for those that wish to receive the Traveler via the Internet must provide their E-mail address to the Editor. Bill Christie suggested that at this time he would only need one E-mail address for each chapter. The Chapter Secretary or one member of the chapter then would print the Traveler and pass it on to the Chapters membership.

Special Projects: Bill Booras read the results from the Committee of the Whole. The committee approved the continuance of the Charitable Raffle for the year 2005. At this time Bill Booras moved that the Charitable Raffle be continued for the year 2005. Stamus Cocolas seconds the motion. Motion passed. It was suggested that Chapter Raffle ticket Chairmen keep accurate records of tickets sold and that they should pass on this imformation to Paul Eliopoulos.

Committee Reports Continued:

Brother Tony Kocolas from the Fresno Chapter No. 151 made a presentation on Our Greek Heritage - The Greek Roots of Western Civilization Tony Kocolas reported that the project would cost approximately \$450,00.00 to complete. At present the project will need \$125,000.00 to get started. See Resolutions Report for written report on page 10. The presentation is in tune with the Mission Statement of AHEPA, which includes Hellenism. This project will be made into a video that can be presented on Public Televisions Channels, public, and private schools. Classical historians working on the project are Victor Davis Hansen and Bruce Thornton. Both gentlemen are instructors at Fresno State University. It was suggested that getting a grant for this project would be helpful. It was moved that the project goes to the Resolutions Committee for final approval. See pages 60-61 for resolution approved by the National Convention Special Projects Committee.

Athletic Hall of Fame: From the discussion at the Meeting of the Whole Byron Gavrilis moved that the District Lodge recommends to the host chapter that they include the a the Athletic Hall of Fame Luncheon with the Delegates Luncheon. Michael Makredes seconds the motion. Motion passed.

Taso Konstantin moved that the body accept the Committee of the Whole report as presented. Motion passed. See page 5-6 for written report.

Convention Cities: District Governor Taso Konstatin moved that the District Lodge be given the authority to put together a District Convention when no chapter comes forth to be the host. Andy Banis seconds the motion. Bill Rotas, PSG referred to the year 1954 when John Gates was Distr. Gov. they had a miniconvention in Sacramento on Saturday and Sunday. Motion passed.

Grievance Committee: Chairman Nick Gianopoulos reported on the following:

- 1. There were no flags present in the meeting room.
- 2. Reservations to hotel were under the name of Daughters of Penelope.
- 3. Political speakers were speakers at the Friday night banquet.
- 4. There were 38 speakers at the banquet
- 5. Program for Scholarship recipients not followed as required.
- 6. Host City took away the program from the Scholarship Committee and did not clear with the Scholarship Committee.

Harry Metaxas moved that the AHEPA Scholarship Foundation have the sole responsibility to compose the editorial content of the scholarship portion of the banquet program. Nick Gianopoulos seconds the motion. Motion passed.

Continued discussion on the above matter was tabled until the afternoon session.

Peter Kireopoulos, Convention vice Chairman, read a letter from Past District Governor James Dariotes who is now working for the AHEPA National Housing Corporation in Indiana. See written letter on pages 77-78.

George Konstantopoulos, PDG, praised George Koufasimas and Bill Rotas for a job well done on the Convention.

Daughters Liaison Committee:

Distr. Governor, Taso Konstantin reported that the Daughters of Penelope will go along on helping the AHEPA on hosting the 2005 District Convention if no Chapter is found willing to host the District Convention. Report was adopted as presented. Additions to Liaison Committee: Taso Konstantin reported that he had suggestions from the Daughters that the Scholarship presentations could be done at the Friday or Saturday luncheons.

Vice Chairman Peter Kiriopoulos adjourned the meeting at 11:45 P.M. The afternoon session will resume at 1:45 P.M.

Convention Chairman Mike Pappas opened the afternoon session at 1:50 P.M.

Educational Foundation: Nick Gianopoulos Treasurer of the Foundation read his financial report. The begining balance for the year June 2003 was \$263,112.01 and the ending balance May 28, 2004 was \$282,746.45. For written report see pages 74-76. The Audit Committee has audited this report. Additional income received after the audit date totaled \$3.300.00. All investment money is in secured CDs. Jim Nicolaou made another donation of \$360.00 from the Fresno Chapter. Total donations from the Fresno Chapter are \$2,740.00. Jim Nicolaou stressed the point that most of these donations are from 50/500 members. He also stressed the point that if Fresno can do it so can the other Chapters. The report was approved as presented.

Grievance Committee Continued: Jim Nicolaou reported that at the Saturday Luncheon the Convention Chairwomen referred to Fresno as the other F word. He recommended that the Liaison Committee bring her in the meeting for an appology to the Fresno Chapter. Nick Gianopoulos moved to table the discussion. Chris Rockas seconds the motion. Motion passed.

George Konstantopoulos, PDG reported that the Oakland AHEPA Family is seriously considering hosting the 2005 District Convention. They will have to investigate and will report to the District Lodge.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE: Chairman Chris Rockas, PDG, moved that the proposal made by Tony Kocolas on **Our Greek Heritage - The Greek Roots of Western Civilization** be approved and presented to the National Convention in July. Byron Gavrilis seconds the motion. Motion passed. See pages 60-61 for the approved resolution from the National Convention Chairman Chris Rockas presented the resolutions: Resolutions #1 thru #5 were standard resolutions and approved by the convention body without discussion. Resolution #6 presented by Michael Frangadakis and Gus Hazifotis entitled **Improve your Golden Years** it refers to the awareness of the health issues facing many or our aging membership. Resolution passed. Resolution #7 was in regards to the efforts of the Artemis Chapter No. 5 of Sacramento in putting the 72nd Distr. Convention together. Resolution was passed. For written reports see pages 56-59.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE: Chairman Arnold Dorer gave Preliminary report. The audit committee looked over the books including bank statements and found everything in order. See preliminary report of budget and audit report on pages 62-71. The budget for 2003 to 2004 had a deficit of (\$2,175.00) but the actual balance at 2004 ended at (\$294.00) deficit The proposed butget for 2004 to 2005 has a deficit of (\$2,520.00). The income from the Chapters was based on 448 members. The Traveler proposed budget has a deficit of (\$3,210.00). Andy Banis moved that we adopt the budget as presented. Steve Miller seconds the motion. Motion passed.

ONE MAN ONE VOTE: District Governor Taso Konstantin reported on the One Man One Vote proposition that the National Convention this year is trying to pass. Taso Konstantin made the motion not to accept the One Man One Vote proposition. In addition Taso will act as liaison between National Headquarters and District No. 21. Bill Rotas seconds the motion. Motion passed.

The Convention Secretary gave the roll call of all Delegates. The voting strength was 33 Delegates. 6 District Lodge members. 7 Past District Governors. 20 Chapter Delegates.

GOOD OF THE ORDER: Andy Banis reported that there are some young men in the BayArea using the name of AHEPA and playing basketball. The District Lodge should check into this and inform them that they can not use the name of AHEPA. If an accident would happen to one of these men the AHEPA could be sued. Ellias Phillips recommended that Convention Committees be formed before the Convention so that they have more time to prepare and be able to have their reports passed around to the delegates for better discussion. This includes the Budget, Resolutions, etc.

Comvention Chairman appointed the following tellers for the Officers Election: Nick Korakas, Alex Bazos, Steve Houvardas, and Nick Gianopoulos.

The District Governor Anastasios Konstantin thanked the body for electing him and the new District Lodge and he wished for a successful year. We will meet again at the next District Convention.


Steve Miller gave the closing prayer. The 72nd District No.21 Convention was adjourned at 4:15 P.M.

Serving as a member of the Education Foundation Board for the past two years has been a most rewarding experience. My first year as Board Chairman has been an exceptional experience. While serving on the District Lodge as Secretary, I have been able to accompany our District Governor on most of his chapter visitations. The quality of our applicants has been mind-boggling. I would like to adopt each of them. The expressions of appreciation for and financial need have been heart-warming. I have met personally with the evaluator, a professor who lives in Berkeley. He has related how he has been strongly inspired by his reviews of our applicants, year after year.

As of this writing it would appear that the AHEPA Education Foundation will be able to award sixteen scholarships at this year's Grand Banquet.

2004 Convention Report

Content

The Traveler is an eight or twelve page publication. Content includes news from the Headquarters, District Lodge, Chapters, reporting on special events, district officers list, chapter presidents and secretaries, advertising, etc. Although there is not a problem filling the eight pages and some times twelve pages, it would be helpful and useful if <u>all</u> the chapters would submit articles from time to time. More participation would make the publication more interesting. Report chapter special events, special recognition of a member(s) or family members, chapter projects, and other information of interest to the members. Since *The Traveler* is published only four times a year, it shouldn't be a problem hearing from each chapter at least once during the year.

Circulation

The March/Spring 2004 issue, was 1225 copies. Circulation has gone down from a high of about 1,700 to about 1,200. In 1999 we added "Address Correction Requested" to each issue. This has resulted in a more accurate mailing list because the post office reports changes of addresses while *The Traveler* is still forwarded to the new address. Unfortunately, if there is no forwarding address *The Traveler* is returned. The cost of this service is 60 cents an address correction and the average is about 20 copies per issue (average was about 60-70 copies when the service was first started). Limiting one issue each per household, chapters not reporting new or reinstated members, deaths, and lost members all affect the circulation numbers.

Production Schedule

The Traveler is published four times a year as follows:

Fall issue	Articles to be submitted by August 15	Mail first week of September.
Winter issue	Articles to be submitted by November 15	Mail first week of December.
Spring issue	Articles to be submitted by February 15	Mail first week of March
Summer issue	Articles to be submitted by May 15	Mail first week of June

If articles are not submitted on time the production schedule can not be met.

Cost

The cost for publishing The Traveler is:

1)	Printing	\$1,013.00
2)	Sales Tax	83.57
3)	Labeling	150.00
4)	Postage	263.20 (varies depending of number copies mailed).
	Total Cost	\$1,509.77

- 1) Printing includes layout, typesetting, graphics, scanning, setup, paper and printing.
- 2) Sales tax at 8.25%
- 3) Labeling includes mailing list maintenance, printing labels, affixing labels, sorting by zip code, filling out postal forms, and delivery to the post office.
- 4) Postage (for the March/Spring issue). \$263.77 cost is for standard mail (bulk rate snail mail). The cost per copy for the this issue is 21.5 cents each. (\$263.77 divided by 1225 copies). Mailing first class would have cost 60 cents each or \$721.80 total.

Advertising

Advertising is down significantly. Current advertisers are the two district lodges, four chapters, The Meniktas Group and Joseph R. Kafka. Established advertising rates are: regular size ads (1.25" x 2.25") \$70 per year, Double size (2.5" x 2.25") \$115 per year and a one issue ad (2.5" x 2.25") \$50. All advertising income goes to the District Lodge.

As a non-profit organization there are some advertising limitations. Postal Regulations 6-1.3.1 Public Law 103-123 reads:

"This provision prohibits the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for credit, debit, or charge cards or similar financial instruments or accounts. This provision also restricts the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for insurance policies and travel arrangements."

Bulk Rate Permit

The Traveler continues to use the Oakland Chapter's bulk rate permit. Oakland is the post office distribution center for the bay area. Mailing from the Oakland office is the best chance for the bulk mail to be distributed in a reasonable amount of time.

Recommendations

- 1. Chapters should submit their mailing list to *The Traveler* at least twice a year to insure each member receives a copy. For example, submit a copy by August 15 for the fall and winter issues and by February 15 each year for the spring and summer issues. Or if the chapter would prefer, *The Traveler* could mail a copy of its chapter mailing list and the chapter could update and return them.
 - 2. Chapters should submit at least one article per year.
- 3. Chapters should support *The Traveler* by placing a chapter ad and solicit ads from their member's businesses.
- 5. Since the *The Traveler* is mailed by standard snail mail and is only published four times a year, it is not a practical method to use as communication tool when responses are needed quickly. Bulk mail may take anywhere from one day to two weeks (or never).
- a) To reach the membership more quickly, copies of *The Traveler* could be mailed to each chapter secretary for distribution to their members. This would save time and some of the cost of mailing.
- b) The district lodge may want to consider using the internet to communicate to their chapters. A newsletter could be published by the district lodge and emailed and/or mailed first class to each chapter the last week of the month, in time for the chapter's next monthly meeting.
- c) The Traveler could also be set up as an electronic document and emailed to each chapter for distribution to their members. Ahepa headquarters is doing this with their monthly newsletter. This would be a cost savings of at least \$6,000 per year. Also, it could be set up on a web site so individual members could download a copy. An electronic document could be complete and include color graphics and color photographs.

Summary

The Traveler is interested in improving the content and delivery of the publication. Recommendations and suggestions, within budget restraints, are important. With a little effort and cooperation from all we can achieve this goal.
