CONVENTION MINUTES

BUSINESS SESSION – FRIDAY MORNING – JUNE 17, 2005

The 74th Annual District Convention hosted by the Reno Chapter #292 of the AHEPA and the Elis Chapter #89 of the Daughters of Penelope was called to order at 10:30 A.M. by the Chairman John Copoulos. Prior to the commencement of the business session there was a joint opening ceremonies with the Daughters of Penelope. AHEPA President John Copoulos and Daughters President Dorothy Delianides introduced District, Supreme, and Grand Lodge Officers. Supreme Governor Gus Hazifotis reported on the Emergency Relief Program and the Leadership Conference scheduled for November 18, 2006. The meeting was turned over to the District Governor Vlasis Fousekis. Brother Steve Miller District Chaplain opened the meeting with a prayer. The District Governor appointed the following Delegates as tellers: Byron Gavrilis, Lou Janakos, George Konstantopoulos, and Andy Mastoras. The following Brothers by unanimous ballot were elected to be Business Officers of the Convention: Mike Pappas as Chairman, Harry Metaxas as Vice Chairman, and Bill Booras as Secretary. Past Sup. Pres. Andy Banis gave the oath of office to the business chairmen.

The first order of business was the roll call of delegates by Executive Secretary Bill Booras. District Lodge Officers 5, Past District Governors 9, Chapter Delegates 13. Total Voting strength 27 Delegates. Brother Lou Janakos was appointed as Parliamentarian. George Booras appointed as Marshall, and Diamond Leos was appointed as Inside Sentinel.

Bro. Mike Pappas suggested that since Chapter reports are in the agenda they do not have to be read. It was suggested that only items of importance be read to the body. The Chapters gave a brief outline of their reports. Bro. Bill Booras from the Fresno Chapter reported that the Chapter would be donating funds from the Founders Day Brunch to the Diabetic Youth Foundation. Mike Pappas reported that San Francisco would be hosting the 2007 District Convention. He suggested that he would like to have a Chapter volunteer for 2008. Bro. Bill Booras reported that the Fresno Chapter is considering the 2008 District Convention and he urged all the Brothers to fill out the questionnaire survey located in the back of the room. Bro. Harry Metaxas reported that the Oakland Chapter netted approx. \$12,000 from there recent casino night. A portion of the proceeds is designated for a scholarship program for disadvantaged children. Bro. Byron Gavrilis reported for the Stockton Chapter. They are struggling to stay afloat. They will be in charge of the up coming church picnic. Bro. George Tzikas was introduced. Bill Rotas informed the delegates that Bro. Tzikas is part of the movie "11th Hour". Bro. George Vincent reported that the Modesto Chapter is expanding their Seminarian Fund donations outside of the Modesto Chapter area. See full Chapter reports on Pages 22-30.

Standing Committees: Bro. Andy Banis reported on the Scholarship Foundation. The committee would be presenting 11 scholarships at tonight's banquet. Unfortunately only 5 of the 11 will be present. The fact that the convention is held on Fathers Day weekend some of the recipients could not be here. Complete report is on Page 31. Bro. Andy thanked the Scholarship Foundation Committee.

Bro. Chris Rockas reported on the Hellenic Project. In addition to what the report states the Project has received an additional \$1900.00 in donations. It was the committee's intention to set up a fundraiser during the Leadership Conference in November with the help of Lou Janakos and Gus Hazifotis. The committee is also working on a Hellenism lapel pin for all donors. There are many non-Ahepan organizations that have donated to the Hellenic Project. See page 44-45 for full report.

Ahepa Traveler: Bill Christie was not present at this time, but Bro. Bill Booras reported that he has inserted last years report in the Agenda, because it had many important suggestions about the Traveler. He also asked the Delegates to provide additional ads for the Traveler. See page 46-47 for full report.

Executive Secretary: Bro. Bill Booras reported that there were only 3 Chapters that sent in full Chapter Reports, the other Chapters only sent in partial reports if at all. See page 48-49 for full report.

Web site: Bro. Taso Konstantin reported on the Web site. The Web site is now inter-connected with the National Web site. Web master is waiting for more Chapter history information that can be part of Web site. "ahepa21.org" is Web site address for District. Bro. Taso moved that the District purchase a new domain name, "ahepadistrict21.org". The cost will be approximately \$20.00. Motion passed. Bro. Taso reported that all submittals to the Web master must go thru the District Lodge first. It was suggested that we should consider solicitations for the Web site. Chairman Mike Pappas informed the Delegates that sheets would be posted in the back of the room for committee sign ups.

District Lodge Reports: District Treasurer Steve Miller gave his report. For written report see page 53-54. Brother Bill Rotas reported that the Budget and Audit committee to meet immediately after lunch.

Meeting recessed at 11:45 A.M. for lunch and to reconvene at 1:45 P.M.

BUSINESS SESSION – FRIDAY AFTERNOON – JUNE 15, 2006

The afternoon business session was reconvened at 3:15 P.M. Bro. Taso Konstantin reported for the Athletic Committee and AHEPA Hall of Fame: The committee has three persons to be inducted into the Hall of Fame. The committee failed to contact the local committee to include the Hall of Fame candidates. Bro. Taso reported that he has some former Ahepans that are willing to promote the Hall of Fame program.

Charitable Raffle: Report was given by Bro. Paul Eliopoulos. See pages 32-43 for full report. Committee approved that the Charitable Raffle project continue. Bro. George Booras will take over as Chairman and Bro. Paul Eliopoulos will be Chairman Emeritus. Bro. George Booras thanked Bro. Paul for all the work he has done for the Charitable Raffle. Special Projects Report on pages 63-64.

District Governors Report: Bro. Vlasis gave his report that can be read on page 50. Bro. Vlasis thanked Bro. Paul Eliopoulos for his work on the Charitable Raffle. He also thanked the Delegates for electing him as District Governor last year.

District Lodge Officers Reports: The balance of the District Lodge reports can be read on pages 50 thru 56.

AHEPA Time: Chairman Mike Pappas suspended the meeting to honor our recently departed Brothers. May there memory be eternal. The Secretary read the names of the departed. See pages 18-21 for list of Departed Brothers.

Committee of the Whole: Bro. Vlasis controlled the meeting. AHEPA Traveler: Bill Booras reported that he was given a written report from Bill Christie, his report was similar as last year with some up dates on cost of preparing the Traveler. See page 3 for written report. Bro. Byron Gavrilis suggested last year and this year on sending the Traveler via the Internet. This could help on the cost of mailing and printing. Bro. George Booras suggested that the Traveler could be posted on our Web site. The committee recommended that we vote tomorrow to have the Traveler published on the Web site. The meeting was adjourned at 3:50 PM. The Saturday morning business meeting will resume at 9:30 AM, Saturday, June 17, 2006.

BUSINESS SESSION – SATURDAY MORNING - JUNE 17, 2006

Business Chairman, Mike Pappas opened the meeting at 9:40 AM. Bro. Gus Hazifotis moved that all fines collected today be sent to the Hurricane Relief Fund. Emanuel Alfieris seconds the motion. Motion passed. At this time Bro. Hazifotis introduced the Supreme President Gus James who spoke to the Delegates.

Growth and Expansion: Byron Gavrilis reported that we must explore the problem of helping some of the existing chapters, re-activating some of the older chapters, and starting some new chapters in are area. Seek out chapter members that can go out and reinstate delinquent members. Explore starting up Sons of Pericles Chapters, if not recruit the youth as Ahepans. Make known the goals, purposes, activities, heritage, and contributions of the Chapter. For a full written report see page 65.

Roll Call of Convention Delegates: 4 – District Lodge Officers. 19 – Delegates. 10 – Past District Governors. Voting strength 33 Delegates.

Convention Guidelines: Lou Janakos reported the changes the committee recommended. The American, Greek, and any other appropriate flags must be displayed in each meeting room and events. When host city has hotel headquarters confirmed they should give the AHEPA Traveler and Web site the information for publication. The Delegate forms should include dietary information. For full written report see page 61.

Credentials Committee: Harry Metaxas reported that the Convention Chairman provide a list of pre-paid Delegates to the Convention Business Chairman. The Delegates that pay for their registration on arrival must report to the Business Chairman with proof of being registered as a Delegate. For written report see page 62. **Past District Governors remarks** by Chairman Mike Pappas: The performance of District Governor Vlasis Fousekis ranks very high with the Past District Governors. Considering that he was elected as Governor under trying circumstances he is doing an excellent job for the District and AHEPA.

District Lodge acknowledgements: The District Lodge has picked John Copoulos as the “President of the Year”. Byron Gavrilis was picked as “Ahepan of the Year”. There was no consensus on Chapter of the Year. The District Lodge agreed that San Francisco would host the 2007 Annual District Convention. Fresno is considering the 2008 District Convention. The Business Chairman Mike Pappas introduced the Supreme President Gus James for a few remarks. Past Supreme Pres. Andrew Banis welcomed and thanked the Supreme President for being here.

Hurricane relief: Bro. Gus Hazifotis the Tri-chair for the Hurricane Relief Program reported that he would like to develop relief centers in our churches. He will try to work in the Growth and Expansion Committee at the National Convention. He also reported that he will be running for a Supreme Lodge office and would to have “favorite son status” for whatever office he runs for. The morning business session was adjourned at 11:45 AM and the afternoon session will resume at 2:00 PM.

BUSINESS SESSION – SATURDAY AFTERNOON - JUNE 17, 2006

The afternoon business session was reconvened at 2:05 PM. Chairman Mike Pappas reported that all latecomers would be charged \$5.00 for being late.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE: Chris Rockas gave the resolutions report. All resolutions were approved including resolution #6 on Emergency Relief. See page 57 for written report.

BUDGET AND AUDIT COMMITTEE: Arnold Dorer reported on the audit committee. All records of the Secretary and Treasurer were reviewed and found to be in order. Budget was reviewed and put in order. Only the Delegates present will make any and all changes to the budget. Final reports will be ready for the Fall District Conference. Bill Rotas reported on the budget. It is hard to make a budget and audit of the books, because Chapters are still turning in per capita tax and other monies this weekend. It is difficult to make a correct and complete audit and budget with funds coming in this late. Bro. Rotas explained the expenses and incomes for the District Budget and the Travelers budget. See pages 58-60 for written reports. Suggestions to help the expenses would be to possibly raise per capita tax to \$6.00, get additional ads for the Traveler. Current bank balance \$14,336.19 additional income and expenses brought up this weekend brings the current bank balance to \$13,576.19. The budget and audit reports were approved as presented.

There was discussion about the dates that a District Convention can be held. Bill Booras moved that District Conventions only be held after the Fathers Day weekend. Arnold Dorer seconds the motion. Motion passed.

Re-naming AHEPA Founders Day: The Daughters of Penelope sent in a grievance that we should change the Founders Day from May to October. It was explained by the Supreme President that we have to clear this with the Archdiocese.

Grievance denied. Chris Rockas moved that the District Lodge hire an independent auditor to audit the District Lodge Books not exceed \$1500.00. Byron Gavrillis seconds the motion. Motion denied.

Fines collected: Lou Janakos reported that he collected \$77.00 for the Hurricane Relief Fund and \$37.00 for the Scholarship Fund.

Harry Metaxas Business Co-chairman announces that tonight's Glendi dinner dance will be at 6:00 PM and the Charitable Raffle will be at 11:00 PM. Tomorrows Church services will at St. Anthony's Church at 10:00 AM with complimentary brunch after services.

The Secretary Bill Booras called the roll to verify the voting strength of the convention: District Lodge Officers – 4, Past District governors – 10, Delegates – 18. Voting strength was 32 Delegates.

ELECTION OF DISTRICT LODGE OFFICERS:

Convention Chairman Mike Pappas appointed the following Brothers as Tellers: Andrew Mastoras, George Vincent, Lou Janakos, and Steve Drosos.

Election for District Governor: Steve Miller nominated Vlasis Fousekis for District Governor. Second by John Copoulos. Unanimous ballot cast for Vlasis Fousekis.

Election for Lt. Distr. Governor: George Vincent nominated Byron Gavrilis for Lt. District Governor. Gus Hazifotis seconds nomination. Unanimous ballot cast for Byron Gavrilis.

Election for District Secretary: Lou Janakos nominated Chris Frangos for Secretary. Byron Gavrilis seconds nomination. Unanimous ballot cast for Chris Frangos.

Election for District Treasurer: Vlasis Fousekis nominated Steve Miller for Treasurer. Chris Rockas seconds the nomination. Unanimous ballot cast for Steve Miller.

Election for District Marshall: Vlasis Fousekis nominated Robert Sexton for Marshall. Vlasis Fousekis seconds the nomination. Unanimous ballot cast for Robert Sexton.

Elections for District Warden: Byron Gavrilis nominated John Copoulos for Warden. George Konstantopoulos seconds the nomination. Unanimous ballot cast for John Copoulos.

Election for District Athletic Director: Bill Rotas moved that the Athletic Director to be appointed by the District Governor. Gus Hazifotis seconds the motion. Motion passed.

Election for District Executive Secretary: Andy Banis nominated Bill Booras as Executive Secretary. Byron Gavrilis seconds motion. Unanimous ballot cast for Bill Booras.

The District Governor and the newly elected District Lodge Officers will appoint the balance of District Lodge Officers. The following were appointed: George Vincent as Chaplain. Bill Rotas as Auditor. George Booras as Charitable Raffle chairman.

Election for District Scholarship Members: Andy Banis explained that there were two openings for the Scholarship Foundation. He put in the names of James Nicolaou and Peter Kireopoulos. The Delegates as presented by Andy Banis approved the nominations. Unanimous ballot cast.

The Supreme President Gus James gave the oath of office to all the newly elected District Lodge Officers.

District Governor Vlasis Fousekis thanked the Delegates for their support. He asked for the support of the newly elected District Lodge Officers to further the progress of District 21.

Bill Rotas moved that the two District Lodge Officers not present be installed at the next District Lodge meeting. Andy Banis seconds the motion. Motion passed.

Gus Hazifotis moved to adjourn the 74th Annual District Convention of the Golden Gate District #21, Order of AHEPA, until June 2007, or at such time and place as will be announced by the District Lodge. Meeting adjourned at 3:31 PM.

Steve Miller gave the closing prayer.

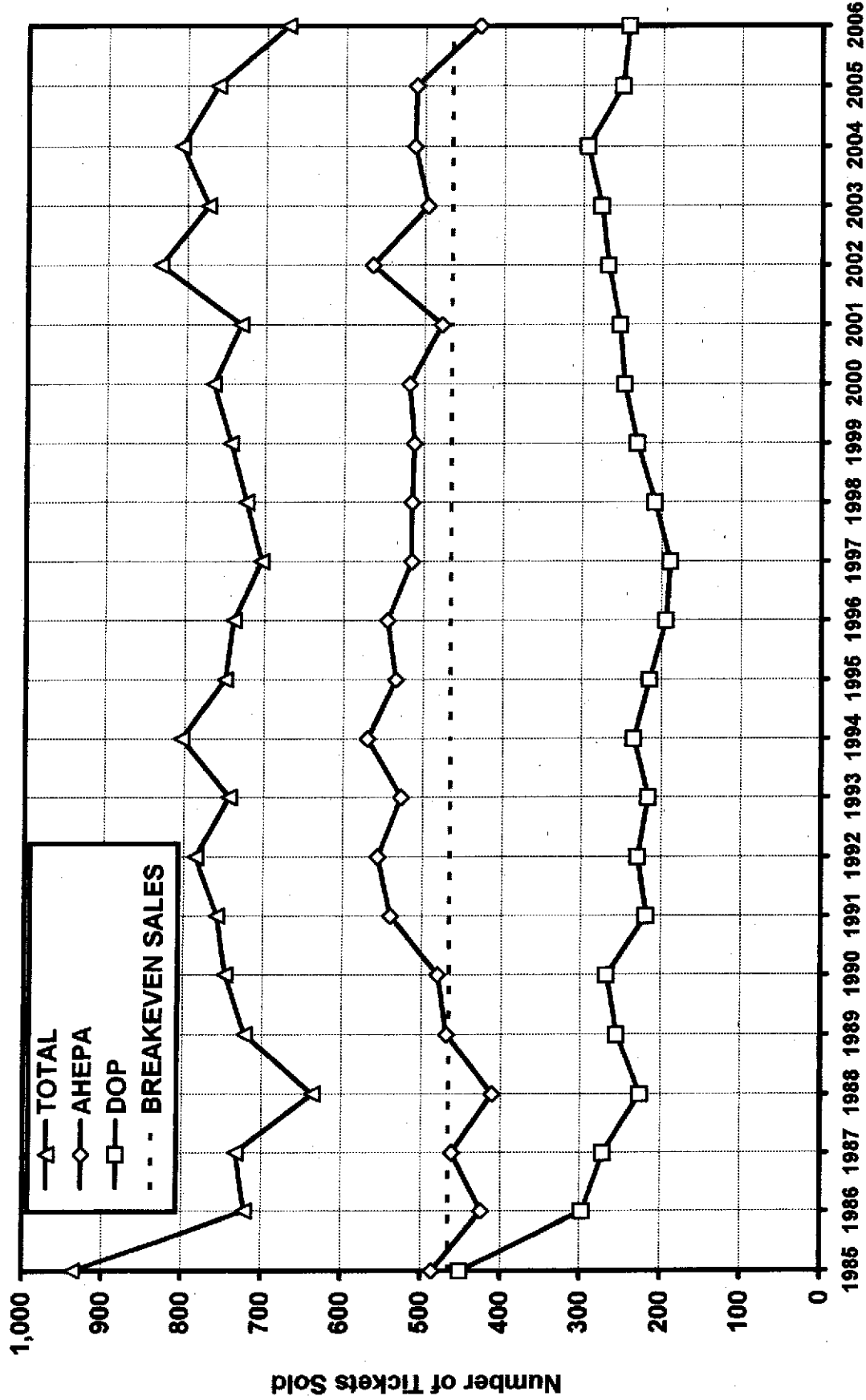

Report on

AHEPA HELLENIC PROJECT

May 22, 2006

As previously reported at the District Fall Conference in October 2005, and the District Spring Conference in March 2006, our drive is to raise \$490,000 to produce and distribute our film documentary on the contributions of the Ancient Greeks to Western Civilization began at the June 2005 District Convention held in Dublin, California.

During this past fiscal year your Oversight Committee composed of Fresno Brothers Robert Sexton, Bill Booras, Michael Makredes, Ted Boosalis, George Papangellin and myself have raised \$ 22,039.19. Our expenses to date have totaled \$16,070.29. We have had 1,500 brochures printed and distributed throughout the U.S. Ahepa domain and Australia.

Our Ohio Brother James Denney spearheaded a very successful fundraiser. It was held in Niles, Ohio and resulted in a \$3,000.00 net contribution to our project. Plans are in the works to have fundraisers in Atlanta, Georgia; the San Francisco Bay Area and in District #20.

Several hundred DVD trailers have been made and distributed throughout the country. The American Hellenic Project is now on the national AHEPA website, www.hellenicproject.com

Our production leader, Brother Tony Kocolas has traveled to Ohio and Las Vegas, Nevada to promote our project. He will also attend the Annual Convention to be held in Hollywood, Florida in July 2006. Contacts have been made with the Alexander Onasis Foundation, Ellios Society, and foundations in St. Louis, Missouri and Boston, Massachusetts.


Remember: Hellenism is our legacy, we must support and protect it.

To date we have had excellent publicity in the **Ahepa Traveler**, the **Greek Voice** (Boston area), **The Greek Star** (Chicago area), the **Greek-American Review** (New York area), **KPTH Magazine** (Pan Cretan monthly publication), **Chapter#314 Las Vegas Greek Independence Day awards dinner album**. Over 138 letters of solicitation have been sent out to chapters, individuals and publications.

The official news release of our project, with a photo of our oversight committee has been sent out for publication to eighteen (18) Greek-American newspapers and magazines. We are hopeful that these news releases will jump-start a big fund response.

Most Ahepa chapters and some Daughters chapters in District#21 have generously contributed to this project of "getting the record straight." 2006 74th Annual District Convention Report

Content

The Traveler is an eight or twelve page publication. Content includes news from the Headquarters, District Lodge, Chapters, reporting on special events, district officers list, chapter presidents and secretaries, advertising, etc. Although there is not a problem filling the eight pages and some times twelve pages, it would be helpful and useful if all the chapters would submit articles from time to time. More participation would make the publication more interesting. Report chapter special events, special recognition of a member(s) or family members, chapter projects, and other information of interest to the members. Since *The Traveler* is published only four times a year, it shouldn't be a problem hearing from each chapter at least once during the year.

Circulation

The June/Summer 2006 issue, was 1230 copies. In 1999 "Address Correction Requested" was added to each issue. This has resulted in a more accurate mailing list because the post office reports changes of addresses while *The Traveler* is still forwarded to the new address. Unfortunately, if there is no forwarding address *The Traveler* is returned. The cost of this service is 90 cents an address correction and the average is about 5 copies per issue down from about 60-70 copies when the service was first started. Limiting one issue each per household, chapters not reporting new or reinstated members, deaths, and lost members all affect the circulation numbers. Starting with the March/Spring 2006 issue all addresses are "Cass Certified" meaning they are verified as a legitimate address and bar coded. This has resulted in a postage cost reduction of about \$50, a reduction even with the postage increases which went into effect in January 2006.

Production Schedule

The Traveler is published four times a year as follows:

Fall issue	Articles to be submitted by August 15	Mail first week of September.
Winter issue	Articles to be submitted by November 15	Mail first week of December.
Spring issue	Articles to be submitted by February 15	Mail first week of March
Summer issue	Articles to be submitted by May 15	Mail first week of June

If articles are not submitted on time the production schedule can not be met.

Cost - The cost for publishing *The Traveler* is:

1) Printing includes layout, typesetting, graphics, scanning, setup, paper, printing and finishing. A printing cost increase of 7.4% is reflected in the Spring and Summer issues. With lower postage overall cost increase is only 1.7%.

2) Sales tax at 8.25%

3) Labeling includes mailing list maintenance, printing labels, affixing labels, sorting by zip code, filling out postal forms, and delivery to the post office.

4) Reduction in postage rate mentioned above is reflected in the Spring and Summer issues.

Advertising

Established advertising rates are: regular size ads (1.25" x 2.25") \$70 per year, Double size (2.5" x 2.25") \$115 per year and a one issue ad (2.5" x 2.25") \$50. All advertising income goes to the District Lodge.

As a non-profit organization there are some advertising limitations. Postal Regulations 6-1.3.1 Public Law 103-123 reads:

"This provision prohibits the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for credit, debit, or charge cards or similar financial instruments or accounts. This provision also restricts the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for insurance policies and travel arrangements."

Bulk Rate Permit

The Traveler continues to use the Oakland Chapter's bulk rate permit. Oakland is the post office distribution center for the bay area. Mailing from the Oakland office is the best chance for the bulk mail to be distributed in a reasonable amount of time.

Recommendations

1. Chapters should submit their mailing list to *The Traveler* at least twice a year to insure each member receives a copy. For example, submit a copy by August 15 for the fall and winter issues and by February 15 each year for the spring and summer issues. Or if the chapter would prefer, *The Traveler* could mail a copy of its chapter mailing list and the chapter could update and return them.

2. Chapters should submit at least one article per year.

3. Chapters should support *The Traveler* by placing a chapter ad and solicit ads from their member's businesses.

5. Since the *The Traveler* is mailed by standard snail mail and is only published four times a year, it is not a practical method to use as communication tool when responses are needed quickly. Bulk mail may take anywhere from one day to two weeks (or never).

6. *The Traveler* could also be set up as an electronic document and included on the District web site when it is up and running.

Summary

The Traveler is interested in improving the content and delivery of the publication. Recommendations and suggestions, within budget restraints, are important. With a little effort and cooperation from all we can achieve this goal.

Page 4, Item D, Add #5 “As soon as host City establishes date, location, and contact persons for Convention, to notify Traveler and Web site and place information with both”.

Page 4, Item D, Add #6 “Delegate forms shall indicate need for any dietary restrictions”.

Page 5, Item F continued – Chapter secretaries will submit elected Delegates and Alternates names to District Secretary, Executive Secretary, and Convention Host City no later than May 10 of the same year of the District Convention”.

Page 5, Item G shall read “Ticket Committee Chairperson is responsible for sale and distribution of event tickets. The Saturday luncheon and Grand Banquet Committee Chairpersons may wish to have their own ticket Chairperson, because of advance reservations and seating charts. Host City Chapter may retain the option to sell additional event tickets at the Convention”.

Credentials Committee Report:
