

CONVENTION MINUTES

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY MORNING - JUNE 22, 2007

The 75th Annual District Convention hosted by the Golden Gate-Pacific Chapter #150 of the AHEPA and the EOS Chapter #1 of the Daughters of Penelope was called to order at 10:00 A.M. by the Chairman Mike Pappas. Prior to the commencement of the business session there was a joint opening ceremonies with the Daughters of Penelope at 9:25 AM. AHEPA Chairman Mike Pappas and Daughters President Foula Vasilogiorgis introduced District, Supreme, and Grand Lodge Officers. District Governor Vlasis Fousekis welcomed the Delegates and introduced his District Lodge and Past District Governors. Laurie Sahines District Governor of the Daughters of Penelope also welcomed the Delegates and introduced her District Lodge Officers and Past District Governors. Supreme Counselor Chris Rockas represented the Supreme Lodge. Grand Secretary Barbara Wolf represented the Grand Lodge.

Chairman Mike Pappas previewed the luncheons and dinners that would be happening the next two days. Chairman Mike Pappas turned the meeting over to District Governor Vlasis Fousekis who called on Bro. Steve Miller to give the opening prayer. District Governor appointed the following Brothers as tellers: Elias Tsiknis, Peter Kireopoulos, Harry Metaxas, and Nick Korakas.

The following Brothers by unanimous ballot were elected to be Business Officers of the Convention: Louis Janakos as Chairman, Nick Pries as Vice Chairman, and Bill Booras as Secretary. Supreme Counselor Chris Rockas gave the oath of office to the newly elected business officers.

The first order of business was the roll call of delegates by District Secretary Chris Frangos District Lodge Officers 4, Past District Governors 9, Chapter Delegates 20. Total Voting strength 33 Delegates. Brother Andy Banis was appointed as Parliamentarian. Agamemnon Zafiratos appointed as Marshall, and Lou Phillips was appointed as Inside Sentinel.

Chrm. Lou Janakos proposed fines for latecomers into the meeting of \$1.00. Chrm. Janakos suggested that since Chapter reports are in the Agenda they do not have to be read. It was suggested that only items of importance should be read to the body. Bill Booras of the Fresno Chapter reported that on July 1, 2007 the Chapter was having a Founders Day Brunch after church services with proceeds going to the Diabetic Youth Foundation. Bro. Harry Metaxas of the Oakland Chapter thanked Distr. Gov. Vlasis Fousekis for a job well done. Bill Rotas Sacramento Chapter reported that they initiated 2 new members Wednesday night, which brings their membership up to 63 members. Mike Frangadakis San Jose Chapter reported that the Chapter is honoring men in the service and hoped that all Chapters would do the same. Bro. John Lagis from the Reno Chapter reported that Reno had a very educational year with various lectures. There were no written reports from the Stockton, Solano, or Reno Chapters. See Chapter reports on Pages 21-29. Bill Rotas suggested that Chapter Reports should be sent to the Chapters in PDF form, and they can be returned to the Executive Secretary through the Internet. See San Jose Chapter Report under Good of the Order.

Standing Committees: Charitable Raffle. George Booras reported that, to date he has 668 Charitable Raffle tickets sold. See page 40 for winners Bro. Chris Rockas reported on the Hellenic Project: Bro. Rockas emphasized the purchase of the Hellenic Project lapel pins. See page 45 for full report.

Ahepa Traveler: Bill Christie reported that the Traveler could be read via the Internet. Suggested that Chapters should try to purchase advertising ads. See written report on page 41-42. Chapter Secretaries should update addresses of membership and send corrections to the Traveler Editor.

Executive Secretary: Bro. Bill Booras reported that there were 3 Chapters that did not send in a Chapter Report. There were 5 Chapters that sent in full Chapter Reports and 4 Chapters that sent in partial Reports. Bro. Booras also thanked the Chapters that bought ads for the Traveler and urged the Chapters to purchase additional ads. See page 37-39 for full report.

Web site: Chris Frangos, District Secretary, reported that Web site is progressing. All articles and Chapter information and affairs should come thru him. The Traveler will be included in the Web site. More ads will help defray costs of printing the Traveler.

<u>District Lodge Reports</u>: District Treasurer Steve Miller gave his report. For written report see page 32-35. Chaplain's report is on page 36. Brother Bill Rotas reported that the Budget and Audit committee to meet in Hospitality Room. Lou Janakos informed the Scholarship Committee to meet right after this meeting. Convention Guide Lines to also meet this afternoon.

Meeting recessed at 11:10 A.M. for lunch and to reconvene at 2:00 P.M.

BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY AFTERNOON - JUNE 22, 2007

The afternoon business session was reconvened at 2:00 P.M. and called to order by the Chairman Lou Janakos. A moment of silence was had in remembrance of our departed Brothers.

Resolutions Committee: Chris Rockas reporting Resolution #1 thanking the Westin Hotel and its facility. *Victor Kyriakis, S.F. Chapter moved that we table resolution #1. He recalled the problems that the Convention Committee had putting the Hotel details together. Peter Kireopoulos 2nd the motion. Resolution #1 tabled. Resolutions #2 through #5 were approved as presented. Any further resolutions will be brought up at the Saturday Business session. After some discussion with Host City members, Resolution #1 will stay tabled. See pages 43-44 for written report.

<u>Charitable Raffle</u>: Paul Eliopoulos reported for George Booras that there have been 703 charitable raffle tickets sold so far.

2008 District Convention: Bill Booras started discussion on the 2008 District Convention. The question was asked on how many delegates would come to the District Convention on the weekend after Father's Day if the National Convention in Greece was starting 1-½ weeks after the District Convention. The majority of the Delegates present would attend both conventions. There was additional discussion on having 2-day mini District Convention. Brother Stamus Cocoles, Modesto, felt that Scholarships should be given out on Saturday to allow parents and recipient's time to attend.

25th of March Celebrations: Chris Frangos reported on the advantages of having the Flag Raising ceremonies on that day. All Chapters should consider doing this and the OXI Day remembrance as well. Andy Banis reported on the different 25th of March Celebrations. He suggested that the Chapters that celebrate the 25th of March should notify the District Lodge and other Chapters. Chris Rockas suggested that instead of saying "Long Live Greece" we should be saying "Long Live Hellenism". Mike Frangadakis brought up the Hellenic American Veterans Memorial project. He asked the Brothers to help promote this important project. The San Jose Chapter will be working on this project and encouraged all Chapters to come aboard.

Afternoon Business Session was adjourned at 3:15 P.M. Saturdays meeting to reconvene at 9:00 A.M.

<u>BUSINESS SESSION</u> - <u>SATURDAY</u>, JUNE 23, 2007 - Reconvened at 9:05 A.M. by the Chairman Lou Janakos. All recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Chris Rockas requested that any resolutions must be presented before Noon today.

<u>District Governors Report</u>: Bro. Vlasis gave his report that can be read on page <u>30</u>. Bro. Vlasis thanked Bro. Distr. *Governor Vlasis moved that we dedicate these morning's proceedings in memory of departed Brother and Lt. Governor, Byron Gavrilis. Motion was passed. He also thanked the Delegates for electing him as District Governor for the last two years.

Liaison and Convention Guide Lines Committee: *Bro. Vlasis moved that on page 5 of the Convention Guide Lines the item that refers to the Delegates purchasing the full Convention Registration be left as is. Elias Tsiknis 2nd the motion. Motion passed. There was extended conversation as to the Guide Lines be considered Guide Lines or Rules. *Harry Metaxas suggested that the "Convention Guide Lines" title be changed to "Convention Rules and Guide Lines". Harry Metaxas moved that the "Convention Guide Lines" be reviewed by committee and the new District Lodges report at the Fall District Conference. Victor Kyriakis seconds the motion. Motion passed. Steve Miller presented and amendment to the previous motion that the new District Lodges provide preliminary reports at the Fall and Spring District Conferences on the Convention Guide Lines. Final vote will be at the 2008 District Convention. Amendment passed. It was suggested that these Guide Lines be posted on the Web site.

Good of the Order: Hellenic American Veterans Memorial: Mike Frangadakis of San Jose reported that he is involved in making contact with Greek-American troops. He passed out envelopes and requested that Brothers give name and address of service personnel and the committee will contact them for any help that they may need. Mike also pointed out that we should not drop the project. Demos Papadopoulos of Sacramento suggested that we should take more pictures at all AHEPA affairs and make recordings of certain speeches for future use. He recommended that at future meetings and conferences we should try a keep recorded pictures for our history. Chris Rockas reported that the Hellenic Project was proceeding slowly, but with good prospects, and they have made many good contacts in the past few months. At this time he presented Bro. Nick Korakas with a Hellenic Project lapel pin. Bro. Chris also presented a Hellenic Project lapel pin to Arnold Dorer. See page 45. *Andy Banis reported on some history of the HAVM project and moved that District 21 not recognize the HAVM project and to give motion to the Special Projects Committee at the National Convention. Steve Miller seconds motion. After some discussion Andy Banis moved that the HAVM project be given to Mike Frangadakis to rejuvenate the project and to report at the next District Convention. Since the motion to table discussion on the HAVM was first, the body voted to table any additional conversation on the HAVM Project. Lou Janakos called for a 10-minute recess. The morning session was restarted at

<u>Liaison Committee</u>: Vlasis Fousekis reported that the Daughters of Penelope recommended that District 21 receive a wish list from St. Nicholas Ranch to pay for upcoming repairs or needs. Motion defeated.

Grievance Committee: James Dariotes reported on a question from Alex Bazos. What is the difference between Certified Mail and Express mail. Scholarship applications require that all applications be sent by Certified Mail. Scholarship Committee to review rules.

Byron Gavrilis Memorial: Vlasis Fousekis read a letter from Mary Gavrilis thanking the AHEPA Family for their support and kindness after Byron had passed away. James Dariotes suggested that the letter be included in the minutes.

<u>Charitable Raffle</u>: George Booras reported that to date 705 raffle tickets had been sold, that's 32 tickets more that last year. Modesto has sold 102 tickets and San Francisco and Contra Costa are above 60 tickets sold. See page 40 for winners.

Morning Business Session was adjourned at 11:45 A.M.

BUSINESS SESSION – SATURDAY AFTERNOON - JUNE 22, 2007

The Business Co-Chairman Nick Pries reconvened the afternoon business session at 2:05 PM.

BUDGET AND AUDIT COMMITTEE: Arnold Dorer gave a preliminary report on how the audit and budget is formulated. He also went though the various budget items indicating the various changes. Last year \$6,075.00 was brought in through per capita taxes, Supreme Lodge, and other income. This year the actual income was \$5,333.00. This year we anticipate the income for the year will be \$5,130.00. Last year disbursements were estimated to be \$9,595.00, but this past year we actually spent \$5,947.00. This year we are estimating that we will be spending \$8,950.00. The District Lodge allowances were not as much as proposed, therefore the same amount is being budgeted. Line items for Charitable Raffle, Sons of Pericles has been removed. \$400.00 was budgeted for reproduction of Convention Minutes. The income from convention cities estimated at \$500.00. The body approved the increase in changes to the Traveler Budget. The Budget was approved as presented. See pages 46-47 for written report. Bill Rotas suggested that the Chapters should charge the Life Members per capita tax of \$5.00 per year to help the budget; we also should increase our membership. Chapters should pay their per capita taxes before the District Convention.

Convention Cities: George Koulos, Sacramento, reported that he would convene with the Daughters of Penelope of Sacramento to consider the 2009 Annual District Convention. Andy Banis reported that the District Lodge has the authority to approve the 2009 District Convention before the Fall District Conference or the 2008 District Convention. Nick Pries reported that the San Jose AHEPA Family would host the Fall District Conference on October 27, 2007.

<u>RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE</u>: *Chris Rockas read Resolutions #6 and #7. Both were approved as presented. Resolution #6 pertains to Scholarship Recipients and Resolution #7 pertains to Byron Gavrilis. See page <u>43-44</u> for written report.

Web Page: Chris Frangos reminded the Brothers to post all affairs and functions their Chapters are having. District should also post Chapter Reporting forms, etc. All reports should be sent to the Web site via Chris Frangos. Vlasis Fousekis reported that the Scholarship Committee posts the pictures of the Scholarship Recipients on the Web site. He also urged the Chapter to send pictures of their functions to the Web site. The group picture that we took this morning should also go on the Web site.

<u>District Lodge Awards</u>: Since the District Lodge did have any proposals the body nominated and approve the following awards. Elias Frangos and <u>AHEPAN of the Year</u>. San Francisco Chapter No. 150 as <u>Chapter of the Year</u>. Elias Tsiknis, San Jose Chapter as <u>President of the Year</u>.

Roll Call of Delegates was given by Chris Frangos: There were 4 District Lodge members present, 23, Chapter Delegates present, and 13 Past District Governors. Total voting strength prior to the Election of District Lodge Officers was 40.

ELECTION OF DISTRICT LODGE OFFICERS:

<u>Election of District Governor</u>: George Konstantopoulos nominated <u>Steve Miller</u> for <u>District</u> Governor. A unanimous ballot was cast for Steve Miller.

<u>Election for Lt. District Governor</u>: Bill Christie nominated <u>Nick Pries</u> for <u>Lt. Dist. Governor</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Nick Pries for Lt. District Governor

<u>Election for District Secretary</u>: Vlasis Fousekis nominated <u>Robert Sexton</u> for <u>District Secretary</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Robert Sexton for District Secretary.

<u>Election for District Treasurer</u>: Vlasis Fousekis nominated <u>Chris Frangos</u> for District Treasurer. A unanimous ballot was cast for Chris Frangos for District Treasurer.

Election for District Marshall: No nominations

Elections for District Warden: No nominations

Election for District Athletic Director: No nominations

*James Dariotes moved that the new District Governor appoint the above vacant offices. Mike Frangadakis seconds the motion. Motion passed.

<u>Election for District Executive Secretary</u>: Mike Pappas nominated <u>Bill Booras</u> as <u>Executive Secretary</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Bill Booras as Executive Secretary.

Election for District Scholarship Members: *The following Brothers were nominated to fill out a 4-year term on the Scholarship Committee: Lou Janakos and Bill Booras. James Dariotes seconds the motion. A unanimous ballot was cast. *The following Brothers were nominated to fill out a 1-year term on the Scholarship Committee: Bill Rotas and Gus Hazifotis. James Dariotes seconds the motion. A unanimous ballot was cast.

New elected District Governor Steve Miller appointed James Dariotes as District Chaplain and Bill Rota: as District Auditor.

The Past Supreme President Andy gave the oath of office to all the newly elected District Lodge Officers.

District Governor Steve Miller thanked the Delegates for their support. He asked for the support of the newly elected District Lodge Officers to further the progress of District 21.

Lou Janakos thanked our guests from District 20. Bill Booras reported that the fines collected during the meeting totaled \$80.00, which will be donated to the Scholarship Fund.

Lou Janakos adjourned the 75th Annual District Convention of the Golden Gate District #21, Order of AHEPA, until June 2007, or at such time and place as will be announced by the District Lodge.

Meeting adjourned at 3:30 PM.

Steve Miller gave the closing prayer.



Content

The Traveler is an eight or twelve page publication. Content includes news from Ahepa Headquarters, District Lodge, Chapters, reporting on special events, district officers list, chapter presidents and secretaries, advertising, etc. Although there is not a problem filling the eight pages and some times twelve pages, if all the chapters submitted articles from time to time it would make the publication more interesting. Reporting chapter special events, special recognition of a member(s) or family members, chapter projects, and other information of interest to the members. Since The Traveler is published only four times a year, it shouldn't be a problem hearing from each chapter at least once during the year. The Traveler is now available to view and print out on District 21's web site: www.ahepa21.org. Current and past issues are included.

Circulation

The June/Summer 2007 issue, was 1223 copies. In 1999 "Address Correction Requested" was added to each issue. This has resulted in a more accurate mailing list because the post office reports changes of addresses while *The Traveler* is still forwarded to the new address. Unfortunately, if there is no forwarding address *The Traveler* is returned. The cost of this service is 90 cents an address correction and the average is about 5 copies per issue down from about 60-70 copies when the service was first started. Limiting one issue each per household, chapters not reporting new or reinstated members, deaths, and lost members all affect the circulation numbers. Starting with the March/Spring 2006 issue all addresses are "Cass Certified" meaning they are verified as a legitimate address and bar coded.

- 1) Printing includes layout, typesetting, graphics, scanning, setup, paper, printing and finishing.
- 2) Sales tax at 8.25%
- 3) Labeling includes mailing list maintenance, printing addresses, sorting by zip code, filling out postal forms, and delivery to the post office.
- 4) Fall 2006 postage includes \$160 annual mailing permit fee and postage of \$211.70. Postage rate increase effective May 2007 is reflected in the current Summer 2007 issue an increase of almost 50%.

Advertising

Established advertising rates are: regular size ads $(1.25" \times 2.25")$ \$70 per year, Double size $(2.5" \times 2.25")$ \$115 per year and a one issue ad $(2.5" \times 2.25")$ \$50. All advertising income goes to the District Lodge.

As a non-profit organization there are some advertising limitations. Postal Regulations 6-1.3.1 Public Law 103-123 reads:

"This provision prohibits the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for credit, debit, or charge cards or similar financial instruments or accounts. This provision also restricts the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for insurance policies and travel arrangements."

Bulk Rate Permit

The Traveler continues to use the Oakland Chapter's bulk rate permit. Oakland is the post office distribution center for the bay area. Mailing from the Oakland office is the best chance for the bulk mail to be distributed in a reasonable amount of time.

Recommendations

- 1. Chapters should submit their mailing list to *The Traveler* at least twice a year to insure each member receives a copy. For example, submit a copy by August 15 for the fall and winter issues and by February 15 each year for the spring and summer issues. Or if the chapter would prefer, *The Traveler* could mail a copy of its chapter mailing list and the chapter could update and return them.
 - 2. Chapters should submit at least one article per year.
- 3. Chapters should support *The Traveler* by placing a chapter ad and solicit ads from their member's businesses.
- 5. Since the *The Traveler* is mailed by standard snail mail and is only published four times a year, it is not a practical method to use as communication tool when responses are needed quickly. Bulk mail may take anywhere from one day to two weeks (or never).
- 6. The Traveler could also be set up as an electronic document and included on the District web site when it is up and running.

Summary

The Traveler is interested in improving the content and delivery of the publication. Recommendations and suggestions, within budget restraints, are important. With a little effort and cooperation from all we can achieve this goal.
