CONVENTION MINUTES

Business Session - Friday Morning - June 19, 2009

Nick Pries Convention Chairman opened the meeting at 9:45 am and welcomed the Delegates to the 77th District Convention. Chaplain James Dariotes opened the meeting with a pray. Nick Pries led the Delegates in the Pledge of Allegiance. Nick Pries welcomed the District Governor Steve Miller who took over the meeting. Brother Steve Miller appointed the following Brothers as tellers: George Konstantopoulos, John Lagios, Arnold Dorer, and Alex Bazos. The following Brothers were elected as Convention Chairmen: Mike Pappas as Convention Chairman, James Dariotes and Convention Vice Chairman, and Bill Booras as Convention Secretary. Past Supreme President Andy Banis administered the Oath of Office. James Dariotes was appointed as parliamentarian and James Sarros was appointed as Inside Sentinel. Brother James Dariotes suggested that the Past District Governors be responsible for any parliamentary duties. The following Chapters had turned in Chapter Reporting Forms: San Francisco, Fresno, Oakland Stockton, Modesto, Garden City, Contra Costa, and San Mateo. The remaining Chapters either gave an oral report or did not attend. Brother Andy Banis congratulated the San Jose Chapter for putting out a well done Convention Album. He also reported that the Current Supreme President Ike Gulas did not send in a letter of support.

Standing Committee Reports:

Lou Janakos, PDG gave the District Scholarship report. There will be 13 Scholarship Awards to be given at the Saturday's luncheon plus two special awards with special funding, not from the Scholarship Foundation. The Foundation has \$285,000.00 in saving and that we should publicize the quantity of scholarship that we give out. The City of San Jose has committed to give us funding for six Scholarships for students from the San Jose area. George Booras, PDG gave the Charitable Raffle Report. See page 31 for a written report. At this hour there have been 659 raffle tickets that were turned in. Bill Christie gave the AHEPA Traveler report. See page 41 for a written report. He made mention on how we are limited in putting in the Traveler certain advertisements, see page 42 for clarification. James Dariotes suggested that we make a list of those Brothers and/or Sisters that we rather have the Traveler sent to them by E-mail. There was not written report from the Website Committee. It was noted that the web master needs news from the Chapters to insert on to the Web Page. Stamus Cocolas, Athletic Director gave his report. See page 43 for a written report. Bill Booras, PDG gave the Executive Secretary's Report. See page 45 for a written report. He also noted that the Chapters Officers and committee heads do not respond on turning in reports and paying per capita taxes. The Hellenic Project Report written report is on page 39.

District Lodge Officers Report:

District Treasurer Robert Sexton gave an oral report. Checking account balance \$5,637.44 plus \$15.00 and \$2,873.20 of unpaid bills. During his term of office the District has received \$16,005 and expenses of \$17,620.26. A written report will be submitted at a later date. There was some discussion on the treasurer's report. There were no other reports from the District Lodge except from the District Governor whose written report in on page 46. The Convention Chairman Mike Pappas listed the Chairmen for the Standing Committee's: James Dariotes – Grievance Committee, Tom Chiarchianis – Convention and Conference Cities Committee, Stamus Cocolas Sons of Pericles and Athletic Committee, Bill Christie – Traveler Committee, Steve Miller – Daughters of Penelope Liaison Committee, District Lodge – Awards Committee, George Booras, Special Projects Committee, Charles Spyropoulos – By-laws, Rules, and Legislation Committee, Nick Giannopoulos – Audit and Budget Committee, Alex Bazos – Membership, Growth, and Expansion Committee. It was noted that the 2010 National Convention will be held in Montreal, Canada during the month of July 2010.

James Dariotes suggested that we confer with the Daughters regarding Convention City and Dates and the possibility of have a short convention. Bro. Dariotes will report back in the afternoon session. Andy Banis also suggested that we should consider a shorter District Convention. He also noted some of the advantages and procedures in putting on a Convention or Conference. James Dariotes informed the assembly on the up coming National Convention in San Francisco. National headquarters handles the whole convention. The host city is allowed one night affair and the Convention Album. Brother Dariotes explained what they are doing on that evening. Extra tickets for the various affairs can be purchase at the National Headquarters office located at the hotel during the proceedings. Bro. Banis reported that Bro. George Booras will be in the Credential committee and will also be running for Supreme Governor for Zone 8. Bro. Banis also reported that Past District Governor Taso Konstantin will be running for the office of Supreme Counselor and will also be running for Vice Chairman of the Convention. Bro. Banis emphasized that as Delegates we must vote for our people and everyone that are part of the AHEPA First Party. James Dariotes informed the Delegates wishing to be part of a committee to make contact with the Chairmen. After the Opening ceremonies and luncheon the following officers will give their reports: Nick Pries, Lt Governor, Demos Papadopoulos, District Secretary, and Steve Miller, District Governor. Vice Convention Chairman James Dariotes urged the Delegates to return after the luncheon to listen to the remaining reports before going to their respective committee meetings. The morning session was adjourned at 11:30 am for the Delegates Luncheon and opening ceremonies.

BUSINESS SESSION – FRIDAY AFTERNOON – JUNE 19, 2009

Convention Chairman Mike Pappas opened the afternoon session at 1:55 pm. Nick Pries, Lt. Governor gave a verbal report. District Secretary, Demos Papadopoulos gave a verbal report. He also commented on visiting the Oakland Chapter on a visitation and witnessing his first meeting that followed the ritual. He hopes that other Chapters did the same. District Governor Steve Miller gave his report. For a written report see page 46. He felt that the District was in good order. He also noted that other fraternal and service organizations are having the same problems, and he feels that the problems we have can be overcome. Bro. Miller reported that he visited all the Chapters at least two times. As a District we have to come up with new ideas and start doing things different that the old days. Hopefully we can get more help from National Headquarters. He thanked all the Distr. Lodge Officers and Chapters. Report accepted as read.

The Convention Chairman Mike Pappas held a moment of silence for our recently departed Brothers. See pages 18 through 22 for a list of our departed Brothers during this year.

New Business: See page 4a for new business that should be discussed. James Dariotes suggested that the items should be brought up after the various committees' have met. There discussion may help answer some of the questions on page 4a. The concern was brought up on whether to have a golf tournament on Friday, if we have a Saturday only Convention meeting. Convention Cities Committee will discuss all the events held during a District Convention. Convention cost are somewhat a problem, Bro Andy Banis suggested if the Convention Cities to try and have some of the affairs at the church halls. Stamus Cocoles suggested that we have a Committee of the Whole to discuss all the problems of the various committees'. Lou Janakos PDG, suggested the these committees' that we have, to get together during the year and to submit their report at the convention and no need to take time during the day to have these small meetings. It was also suggested that these committees' be designated to the various Chapters in our District. It was suggested that we should talk with the Daughters to hear their comments about a 1 or 2 day convention. The Convention Secretary read the roll call of Delegates: 6 District Lodge Officers, 11 Convention Delegates, and 9 Past District Governors. Voting strength is 26 Delegates. \$15.00 received from late entry fines. The Friday afternoon session was adjourned at 2:40 pm.

BUSINESS SESSION: SATURDAY MORNING – JUNE 20, 2009

Business Chairman Mike Pappas opened the meeting at 9:30 pm. Convention Secretary read the roll call of Delegates: 6 District Lodge Officers, 13 Delegates, and 5 Past District Governors. Voting strength is 25 Delegates. Tom Chiarchianis Convention Cities Committee read his . Some of the items in the report are as follows: report. Written report can be read on Pages Eliminate Thursday Golf Tournament (Can be given at other times of the year), Start Saturday's business sessions at 8:00 am or 8:30 am, Standing Committees' can be appointed after the convention so that they could meet prior to the next convention, Saturdays Luncheon could be Athletic Awards or Scholarship presentations with Banquet Saturday evening. Host cities can use church facilities if available. It was also suggested that if no Chapter volunteers to host the District Convention, the District Lodge would select a Chapter starting with Chapter #150. George Booras PDG Special Projects Committee read his report. Written report can be . Bro. Booras informed the Delegates that the Charitable Raffle gives out \$45,000 to the winners every year. This amount is about 2/3rds of what we take in. In the past few years the amount of tickets sold has been dropping and the committee recommends that the total amount given out be reduced to \$42,000. The \$20,000 and the first three prizes would not be reduced. The "Early Bird" drawing will stay the same. Change in the distribution of the remaining funds would change as follows: Scholarship donation will change from 10% to 20%, Chapter rebates would change from 70% to 60%. At this time the ticket sales to date are up to 668 tickets. Brother Booras also thanked the Chapters that sold out their allotment. Delegates present approve report. Charles Spyropoulos chairman of the Resolution, Legislation, and By laws Committee. Written report on page . There were no changes submitted other than the approval and thanks to the Hotel and committees'. There was no report from the Budget and Finance Committee. The fact that there was no current budget Bro. George Booras moved that we use the 2007-2008 Budget temporarily. James Dariotes 2nd the motion. Bro. Banis recommended that we have committee of the whole to form a new budge for 2009 to 2010. There was much discussion on how to come up with a new budget, and how to proceed.

Nick Giannopoulos the newly appointed District Auditor entered the meeting room with a preliminary budget. Brother Nick Giannopoulos explained how he came to the balance of \$3,634.52. As a start he used the May 2008 bank balance to come up with the totals listed in his report. His written report on the Districts audit and bank balance is listed on pages George Konstantopoulos moved that we accept the preliminary Audit/Budget presented by Nick Giannopoulos. Motion was approved by all with no objections. Bro. Lou Phillips moved that the new treasurer re-issue the 4 checks that were not received or cashed. Motion passed. Lou Phillips moved that we close our books on April 30 of the year. Motion passed. This will give the Auditor and Treasurer time to balance the books prior to the District Convention. Stamus Cocolas chairman of the Sons of Pericles and Athletic Committee read his report. For a written report see pages. Delegates approved committee report as presented. Bill Christie chairman of the Traveler Committee read his report. You can read his report on Page inserting color pictures was asked by George Booras. Bill Christie will check on the cost of using color in the Traveler. Copy of the Traveler on the internet can show color pictures. Bro. Alex Bazos read his Membership Committee report. There are two written reports from Bro. Alex Bazos and Dr. Peter Scamagas that can reread on pages . It was suggested that if a recipient is a member of the AHEPA they should be given an extra bonus. District Governor Steve Miller on behalf of the District Lodge announced the District Lodge Awards: President of the year went to Michael Makredes, Fresno Chapter #151, Chapter of the year went to Stockton Chapter #212, and Ahepan of the Year went to Bill Booras PDG. District Governor Steve Miller Liaison with the Daughters of Penelope reported that the Daughters approved of having a 1 day or 1 1/2 day convention for next year. They also approved a task force to investigate this for 2010. The task force committee will consist of the present District Governor of the Daughters, Sylvia Golfes and Steve Miller would also like to chair the committee representing the AHEPA. The task force would be responsible for the guide lines and the location of the 2010 Host City. It was moved to accept his report as presented. Tom Chiarchianis said that the Stockton Chapter would consider the 2011 District convention. Brother Bill Booras informed the Delegates that he had Hellenic Project lapel pins for sale at \$100 a pin. Bro. Robert Sexton spoke about the need to educate the world about Hellenism. Bro. Elias Tsiknis suggested that the committee should have some different affairs to raise money. The morning session was adjourned for lunch at 11:40 am. \$38 was collected from fines.

BUSINESS SESSION – SATURDAY AFTERNOON – JUNE 20, 2009

Business Chairman Mike Pappas opened the meeting at 2:45 pm. He introduced Brother Nick Perdaris Supreme Governor of Zone 8. He passed out the District 20 publication and pointed out the new HUD housing in San Bernardino. He also mentioned the Journey to Greece which was welcomed by all. It is a good opportunity for our youth. He has been trying to promote another Regional Convention. He is hoping that one can be had in 2011. He is still trying to put in another float for the New Years parade, but he will not apply for entry until he has all the money in the bank. District 20 has the AHEPA Hellenic Heritage Foundation to raise money to be able to send students to Greece. GOOD OF THE ORDER: It was brought up from the floor to form an Excel Spread Sheet showing all the members in our District for the District Secretary and Treasurer to keep track of membership and payment of per capita tax. Elections of District Lodge Officers will be next. Chairman Mike Pappas appointed two new tellers: Harry Metaxas, Stamus Cocoles, Lou Phillips, and Tom Chiarchianis. The Convention Secretary read the roll call of Delegates. There were 7 District Lodge officers. 16 Delegates, and 10 Past District Governors. Total voting strength for elections was 33 votes.

<u>Election of District Governor</u>: Steve Miller nominated Nick Pries for <u>District Governor</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Nick Pries for District Governor.

<u>Election of Lt. District Governor</u>: Steve Miller nominated Robert Sexton for <u>Lt. District Governor</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Robert Sexton for Lt. District Governor.

<u>Election of District Secretary</u>: Nick Pries nominated Tom Chiarchianis for <u>District Secretary</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Tom Chiarchianis for District Secretary.

<u>Election of District Treasurer</u>: Nick Pries nominated Alex Bazos for <u>District Treasurer</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Alex Bazos for District Treasurer.

<u>Election of District Marshall</u>: Nick Pries nominated Rick Kylan for <u>District Marshall</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Rick Kylan for District Marshall.

<u>Election of District Warden</u>: Nick Pries nominated Elias Tsiknis for <u>District Warden</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Ilias Tsiknis for District Warden.

<u>Election of District Athletic Director</u>: Taso Konstantin PDG nominated Stamus Cocolas for <u>District Athletic Director</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Stamus Cocolas for District Athletic Director.

<u>Election of District Executive Secretary</u>: Alex Bazos nominated Bill Booras PDG for <u>District Executive Secretary</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for Bill Booras for District Executive Secretary.

The following Brothers were appointed to the following positions: James Dariotes as Chaplain, Nick Giannopoulos as Auditor, Taso Konstantin as Legal Advisor.

The following Brothers were elected for a 4 year term on the <u>Scholarship Foundation</u> <u>Committee</u>: Vlasis Fousekis PDG and Andy Banis PSP.

The Oath of Office was given by Supreme Governor Nick Perdaris.

Ilias Tsiknis urged the Brothers to make their reservations for the National Convention. Nick Pries thank everyone for their help. He stressed the need to bring in new members.

Meeting adjourned at 3:45 pm. James Dariotes gave the closing prayer

PROPOSAL TO THE DAUGHTERS OF PENELOPE

Proposal: To condense the District 21 convention to Friday and Saturday.

Proposal Highlights:

- 1). Delete the Thursday events: Do not hold a convention golf tournament. A separate annual District 21 golf tournament can be held. Please Note: The host city can elect to have a convention golf tournament to be held on Friday.
- 2). Convention can begin with registration on Friday: registration can be from 3:00PM 6:00PM. This can be followed by a Welcome Night Glendi.
- 3). Saturday business meetings can begin earlier at 8:00am or 8:30am. Business sessions could go on until 4:00 or 5:00. The athletic/sports luncheon would be Saturday.
- 4). Saturday night would be the banquet with the scholarship awards to be held during the dinner. The host city would have the option of holding a less formal event.
- 5). The host city can have the option to hold the Friday event off-site at the church or other community hall/center. If the host city church facilities are able, some of the other events can be held there as well.

Summary: It is our attempt to make the district conventions economically feasible for the host city/chapters as well as for the delegates and their guests. This may help to increase chapter participation to host a district convention.

This can also help make the registration packages less expensive could be the impetus needed to increase convention attendance.

Over the last four to five years our average Ahepa Family Charitable Raffle ticket sales have been about 700, but generally declining. We give out 17 prizes totaling \$44,500. This prize money represents nearly 64% of our gross sales. The Committee recommends reducing the total prize money to \$42,000 by eliminating one of the three \$1,000 prizes and three of the ten \$500 prizes. This would reduce the total prize money to about 60% of our gross sales while keeping the top money prizes unchanged. The prizes would then be as follows:

1 st Prize	\$20,000
2 nd Prize	\$10,000
3 rd Prize	\$5,000
4 th Prize	\$1,500
5 th and 6 th Prizes	\$1,000 each
7 th thru 13 th Prizes	\$500 each

Four of the seven \$500 prizes will continue to be awarded at the Early Bird Drawing during the Spring District Conference.

The Committee further recommends that the Ahepa net profit be redistributed to give a higher percentage to the Scholarship Fund. This would result in a slight reduction of the percentage rebated to the Ahepa Chapters. The current and proposed net profit distributions are as follows:





2009 77th Annual District Convention Report

Content

The Traveler is an eight or twelve page publication. Content includes news from Ahepa Headquarters, District Lodge, Chapters, reporting on special events, district officers list, chapter presidents and secretaries, advertising, etc. Although there is not a problem filling the eight pages and some times twelve pages, if all the chapters submitted articles from time to time it would make the publication more interesting. Reporting chapter special events, special recognition of a member(s) or family members, chapter projects, and other information of interest to the members. Since The Traveler is published only four times a year, it shouldn't be a problem hearing from each chapter at least once during the year. The Traveler is available to view in color and to print out individual pages on District 21's web site: www.ahepa21.org. Current and past issues are included.

Circulation

The June/Summer 2009 issue, was 1,206 copies. In 1999 "Address Correction Requested" was added to each issue. This has resulted in a more accurate mailing list because the post office reports changes of addresses while *The Traveler* is still forwarded to the new address. Unfortunately, if there is no forwarding address *The Traveler* is returned. The cost of this service now is \$1.20 per address correction and the average is about 5 copies per issue down from about 60-70 copies when the service was first started. Limiting one issue each per household, chapters not reporting new or reinstated members, deaths, and lost members all affect the circulation numbers. Starting with the March/Spring 2006 issue all addresses are "Cass Certified" meaning they are verified as a legitimate address and bar coded.

The Traveler is published four times a year as follows:

Advertising

Established advertising rates are: regular size ads $(1.25" \times 2.25")$ \$70 per year, Double size $(2.5" \times 2.25")$ \$115 per year and a one issue ad $(2.5" \times 2.25")$ \$50. All advertising income goes to the District Lodge.

As a non-profit organization there are some advertising limitations. Postal Regulations 6-1.3.1 Public Law 103-123 reads:

"This provision prohibits the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for credit, debit, or charge cards or similar financial instruments or accounts. This provision also restricts the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for insurance policies and travel arrangements."

Bulk Rate Permit

The Traveler continues to use the Oakland Chapter's bulk rate permit. Starting with the June 2009 issue the Traveler will be mailed from the San Jose Main Post Office. A new permit number has been assigned (Permit #1007) but still under the name of Oakland Ahepa Chapter #171. The transfer fee of \$180 (separate from the annual mailing permit fee - also \$180) was paid by the Franciscan Press.

Recommendations

- 1. Chapters should submit their mailing list to *The Traveler* at least twice a year to insure each member receives a copy. For example, submit a copy by August 15 for the fall and winter issues and by February 15 each year for the spring and summer issues. Or if the chapter would prefer, *The Traveler* could mail a copy of its chapter mailing list and the chapter could update and return them.
 - 2. Chapters should submit at least one article per year.
- 3. Chapters should support *The Traveler* by placing a chapter ad and solicit ads from their member's businesses.
- 5. Since the *The Traveler* is mailed by standard snail mail and is only published four times a year, it is not a practical method to use as communication tool when responses are needed quickly. Bulk mail may take anywhere from one day to two weeks (or never).

Summary

The Traveler is interested in improving the content and delivery of the publication. Recommendations and suggestions, within budget restraints, are important. With a little effort and cooperation from all we can achieve this goal.
