CONVENTION MINUTES

BUSINESS SESSION - SATURDAY MORNING - June 26, 2010

The 78th Annual District Convention hosted by the Stockton AHEPA Chapter #212 and the Daughters of Penelope, Sparta Chapter #18 was called to order by the Convention Chairman Tom Chiarchianis at 8:10 am. Brother Chiarchianis welcomed all the Delegates to the 78th District He introduced Brother Anthony Kouzounis, Supreme Secretary and Peter Triantafyllos, Supreme Governor of Region 8. He turned the meeting over to District Governor Nick Pries. Brother Pries welcomed the Delegates and call for the Chaplain James Dariotes to give the opening prayer. Brother Pries thanked all the chapters for welcoming the District Lodge during the visitations throughout the year. Executive Secretary Bill Booras gave the roll call of all the Delegates. There were 8 Brothers from the District Lodge, 17 Chapter Delegates, and 12 Past District Governors for a total of 37 Delegates. Brother Pries proceeded with the election of District Convention Officers. Bill Booras nominated Steve Miller, PDG for Convention Chairman. A unanimous ballot was cast for Brother Steve Miller as Convention Chairman. Stamus Cocoles nominated James Dariotes, PDG as Convention Vice Chairman. A unanimous ballot was cast for Brother James Dariotes as Vice Chairman of the Convention. Steve Miller nominated Bill Booras, PDG for Convention Secretary. A unanimous ballot was cast for Bill Booras as Convention Secretary. Supreme Secretary Anthony Louzounis gave the oath of office to the newly elected Convention Business officers. Convention Chairman Steve Miller thanked the Delegates for electing him as Chairman; he then appointed Robert Sexton as Parliamentarian, Tom Chiarchianis as Marshall, and Mike Pappas as Inside Sentinel.

<u>CHAPTER REPORTS</u>: The fact that we are limited in time, no Chapter Reports were given. Reports from the various Chapters could be read by going to the pages 22-31 and as listed in the table of contents.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Lou Janakos, PDG gave the SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION report. A written report can be found on page 32-34. Brother Lou Janakos thanked the Chapters for their support. The committee was able to give out \$11,500 to 10 qualified students. It was noted that all the Chapters should re-institute the "50-500" Club. The Fresno Chapter donated \$1900 to the Scholarship Foundation just from the "50-500" Club donations. Vlasis Fousekis, PDG noted that there were 3 qualified scholarship recipients that were denied scholarships because of lack of funds. He noted that maybe the committee should ask the chapters were the student is from for help to give an additional scholarship. It would be good for AHEPA to be able to give more scholarships. George Booras, PDG reported that this year the Charitable Raffle will be giving 20% from the proceeds to the Scholarship Foundation.

WEB SITE COMMITTEE: Chris Frangos reported that there was a bit more participation from the Chapters participating on the web site for events that they were having. He suggested that we may be able to put the Travelers Ads on the Web site at a small cost. The web master is still requesting any historical information that could be included on the web site. No personal information should be put on the web site or the Traveler. All District forms should be put on the web site.

CONVENTION CITIES REPORT: Tom Chiarchianis Convention Cities Committee Chairman written report can be read on pages 58-59. The committee has provided 4 issues that needed to be considered for future District Conventions. Coordination with management will help with putting a convention together. It was suggested by Nick Gianopoulos that each of the points should be discussed by the assembly. Nick Gianopoulos moved that all 4 items be tabled until the afternoon session. Motion passed. A sub committee will meet at 11:30 am to discuss all items with the Daughters.

SONS OF PERICLES: Stamus Cocoles presented the following suggestions: It is very important that District 21 forms a District wise Sons of Pericles chapter. The Scholarship Committee should provide an application to each recipient and that the local AHEPA Chapters or District 21 pay for the first year's membership into the Sons or the Maids of Athena.

AHEPA TRAVELER: Bill Christie editor of the AHEPA Traveler has a written report on pages 43-45. He reviewed the contents of the report to the Delegates. As of now there is no money saved by sending the Traveler via E-mail. The saving would occur when we drop the mailings by US mail. Gus Hazifotis moved that all those AHEPA members wishing to receive the Traveler via E-mail to notify the editor of the Traveler. Chapters should make copies of the Traveler to give to each member that does not have access to E-mail. Nick Gianopoulos seconds the motion. Motion passed. District Governor Nick Pries returned from the Daughters meeting to report that the Daughters are in favor of using the internet in sending out the Traveler. Vlasis Fousekis moved that we cut down the number of issues of the Traveler from 4 to 3 per year. Demos Papadopoulos seconds the motion. Chris Rockas moved to table the above motion. Bill Anton seconds the motion. Motion passed. James Dariotes suggested that each Chapter in the District should place an ad in the Traveler to help defray some of the costs.

<u>SPECIAL PROJECTS REPORT</u>: Paul Eliopoulos gave the report on the Charitable Raffle. For a written report see pages 60-61. The reported updated the prizes from the Charitable Raffle and the distribution of net proceeds, and recommended that the Chapters advertise the raffle in their area. The report was approved as submitted. George Booras reported that at this time he has 586 raffle tickets sold. He anticipates many more this afternoon.

At this time the Warden has collect \$35.00 from late fees. This will be given to the Scholarship Foundation. The meeting was adjourned for lunch at 11:15 am. The Vice Chairman of the Convention James Dariotes reminded the Brothers of the Convention Cities meeting at 11:30 am.

The afternoon session was started at 2:10.pm. Bill Booras Convention Secretary took the roll call of Delegates in attendance. There were 8 Brothers from the District Lodge, 18 Chapter Delegates and 10 Past District Governors for a total of 36 Convention Delegates.

AUDIT COMMITTEE: Nick Gianopoulos Audit Committee Chairman read his report. For a written report se page 57. Nick Gianopoulos read the 6 proposals from his report. Item 1 to have a budget from January 1 to December 31 was approved by all. Item 2 regarding checks not cashed for up to 6 months must be brought up at the District Convention to reissue. Passed. Item 3 states that at the Spring Conference the budget should be discussed and prepared. Passed. Item 4 authorizes the Auditor to audit the Charitable Raffle books annually. Passed. Item 5 states that the District Convention should elect at least 3 individuals for auditing. Passed. Item 5 requests that the Daughters of Penelope pay for half of the Traveler costs. Passed.

CONVENTION CITIES REPORT: Tom Chiarchianis reported that the committee met along with the Daughters of Penelope. Lodging courtesies to be extended for the length of the convention, not for 3 nights and shown. Each District Lodge officer to pay for registration. Complimentary tickets to given to Clergy and other invited dignitaries only. They also added Supreme Sons and Maids for complimentary tickets. Bill Anton moved that we accept the revised report as presented by Tom Chiarchianis. Nick Pries seconds the motion. Motion passed

BUDGET COMMITTEE: District Treasurer Alex Bazos presented the budget. Andy Banis presented the following items for expenses of the District Lodge. A \$500.00 line item for the District Governor to make all the District Lodge Visitations. A \$500.00 line item for the District Governor to attend the District Governors Conference in Washington, DC. A \$500.00 line item for the District Governor to attend the Supreme Convention. George Booras made an amendment to the motion that if the District Governor can not attend any function the Lt. Governor will receive the allocated funds to attend... Andy Banis moved for the adoption of these three motions. Nick Gianopoulos seconds the motion. Motion passed. \$200.00 for District Caucus at the National Convention to be removed. Motion passed. Andy Banis moved that \$1200.00 be allocated for the District Lodge Officers for their travel during Chapter Visitations. Motion was passed by a hand count. Nick Pries moved that we accept the adjusted budget to date until December 31, 2010 at a cost of \$3330.00. Gus Hazifotis seconds the motion. Motion passed.

<u>DISTRICT GOVERNORS REPORT</u>: Nick Pries announced that the <u>President of the Year</u> to be <u>Tom Chiarchianis</u>. The <u>Chapter of the Year</u> will be the <u>Oakland Chapter #171</u>. There were no Ahepan of the Year forms presented. Nick Pries brought to the attention of the Delegates that they should go back to using the ritual during the meeting.

Gus Hazifotis read a resolution about how Greece fought during World War 2. Resolution was passed and will be passed on to the National Convention.

Mike Pappas congratulated the Convention Business Officers for a job well done. He also congratulated Tom Chiarchianis for conducting a great District Convention.

Moment of silence was had for our departed Brothers. See pages 17-21 for the listing of our departed Brothers. May their memories be eternal.

<u>ELECTION OF DISTRICT LODGE OFFICERS</u>: the following Brothers were appointed as Tellers: Nick Gianopoulos, Elias Tsiknis, Vlasis Fousekis, and Bill Panagopoulos.

<u>Election of District Governor</u>: Andy Banis nominated Nick Pries. Gus Hazifotis seconds the nomination. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Nick Pries as District Governor</u>.

<u>Election of Lt. District Governor</u>: Nick Pries nominated Robert Sexton. John Lagios seconds the nomination. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Robert Sexton as Lt. District Governor</u>.

<u>Election of District Secretary</u>: Nick Pries nominated Tom Chiarchianis. Mike Pappas seconds the motion. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Tom Chiarchianis as District Secretary</u>.

<u>Election of District Treasurer</u>: Nick Pries nominated Alex Bazos. Tom Chiarchianis seconds the motion. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Alex Bazos</u> as <u>District Treasurer</u>.

<u>Election of District Marshall</u>: Nick Pries nominated Richard Kylan. A unanimous ballot was cast for Richard Kylan as <u>District Marshall</u>.

<u>Election of District Warden</u>: Jim Dariotes nominated Elias Tsiknis. A unanimous ballot was cast for Elias Tsiknis as District Warden.

<u>Election of Athletic Director</u>: Nick Pries nominated Stamus Cocoles. Elias Tsiknis seconds the nomination. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Stamus Cocoles</u> as <u>Athletic Director</u>.

The following Brothers were appointed by the District Governor:

<u>James Dariotes</u> as <u>District Chaplain</u>. <u>Nick Gianopoulos</u> as <u>District Auditor</u> along with <u>Lou Phillips</u> and <u>George Fonti</u>.

<u>Election of District Scholarship Foundation members</u>: The following Brothers were elected to the Scholarship Foundation for a 4 year term. <u>Peter Kireopoulos</u> and <u>Steve Miller</u>.

<u>Election of Executive Secretary</u>: Nominated Bill Booras as Executive Secretary. A unanimous ballot was cast for Bill Booras as Executive Secretary.

The Oath of Office for the newly elected District Lodge Officers was given by the Supreme Secretary Anthony Kouzounis.

District Chaplain James Dariotes closed the meeting with a prayer.

The 78th District Convention was adjourned at 5:15 pm until the 79th District Convention in 2011.

CONVENTION CITIES COMMITTEE 2010 REPORT

Tom Chiarchianis 2009 Committee Chairman

To: The 2009 Convention Cities Members

Re: Follow-up to the 2009 Convention Recommendations

Committee Members:

Last year we embarked on a change to the structure of the annual district conventions. With the approval in June 2009 of the convention delegates of both the Order of Ahepa and the Daughters of Penelope, we shortened the convention from four days to two days, with the Sunday church services included.

We also gave the host city the option to hold the Peter Pappas Memorial Golf Tournament the day before the convention meetings.

However, there are still some serious issue's that need to be discussed and resolved. In order to maintain the long term viability of the annual District Conventions, I would like to propose the following to the committee members:

- 1). It should no longer be the responsibility of the Host City to "Comp" the District Governor's of either the Ahepa or the Daughters of Penelope, and the Supreme Officers, WITH THE EXCEPTION of the Supreme President of the Ahepa and the Grand President of the Daughters of Penelope. The cost to the Host City can run over \$1,000.00, and with tight profit margins that can lead to a Host City running into the red financially.
- 2). Regarding the Convention Album; the Ahepa and DOP chapters should EACH purchase an ad for the album. The ad should be no smaller than one half page. The convention album can make or break a Host City's ability to realize a profit from hosting a district convention.
- 3). The issue of the percentage payout to the Ahepa District Lodge and the DOP District Lodge. There are two suggestions I have: one, if the status quo is to remain,

then the Ahepa and DOP District Lodge each should contribute financially (a predetermined sum) toward a Host City's expenses, AND the same assessment should come from each chapter.

4). If #3 is a "bitter pill" to swallow, then the percentage payout should come after expenses and only if there is net income realized over and above \$500.00 to \$1,000.00.

I understand that some of the recommendations put forth are pretty tough to take. However, putting on a District Convention is a very time consuming and costly event. As some of our chapters are losing members, we should not cause undue financial hardship to occur. Please review and let me know some of your comments.

GREECE WWII RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, In the course of WWII, Germany conquered the Netherlands, Belgium, and France in six weeks.

WHEREAS, It took more than seven months, several major battles before the combined forces of Italy and Germany with help from Albania and Bulgaria to subdue Greece. This took significant military assets from the Axis Forces and was the first victory for the Allied Forces.

WHEREAS, This came at a high price for Greece. Greece lost approximately ten percent of its population.

WHEREAS, No other country experienced that level of casualties and hardship for its population in WWII.

WHEREAS, Today, most history books have eliminated and make no mention of Greece's participation in WWII.

THEREFORE, This omission in the history books is unacceptable and should be addressed by AHEPA, the largest Hellenic Organization representing Greeks in the Diaspora.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the following motion was duly debated and passed unanimously:

- 1. That AHEPA takes this up as a Program and reinstates Greece's participation in WWII in the History Text Books for schools.
 - a. Develop a Strategy for addressing this problem
 - b. Develop a summary of Greece's Participation in WWII (George C Blytas)
 - c. Develop suggested language that may be adopted in text books (George C Blytas)
 - d. Work with various States that control content for text books
 - e. Identify book publishers and start dialogue with them
 - f. Identify this omission as a problem at the State and Federal Level
 - g. It is requested that AHEPA use its grass roots network to talk to State Legislators, School Districts, School Boards, School Administrators and Principals.
- 2. Apply the AHEPA Grass Roots Network to get the story to the proper decision influencers and decision makers.
- 3. This effort is positive. We are educating the Educators and Political Leadership of this important event in History.



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Scholarships are offered to qualified applicants each year. The number of Scholarships is dependent upon the funds raised and available each year. Recipients will receive their awards after proof of registration in the college or university of their choice has been provided to the Chairman of the Educational Foundation.

An Applicant must meet one or more of the following requirements:

A. Organizational Affiliation:

- 1. Be a member in good standing of the Order of AHEPA, Daughters of Penelope, Sons of Pericles or Maids of Athena for a minimum of three (3) consecutive years, **OR**
- 2. Be a child of an AHEPAN or Daughters of Penelope who has been in good standing for a minimum of three (3) consecutive years at the time of submitting their application, **OR**
- * 3. Be a grandchild of an AHEPAN who has been in good standing with a minimum of ten (10) consecutive years of membership at the time of submitting their application, **OR**
- 4. Be a grandchild of a deceased AHEPAN who had a minimum of ten (10) years of good standing membership prior to death. Eligibility under this section is valid for ten (10) years after the death of the grandfather or, OR
 - 5. If the applicant is a child of a deceased AHEPAN who has been a member for thirty-six (36) consecutive months prior to death, the applicant is eligible. If death occurs at any time within the last twelve (12) months of the deceased AHEPAN'S membership, the applicant is considered eligible.

B. Residency Requirements:

1. The applicant must be a resident of AHEPA Golden Gate District 21. This includes local residents who are attending college away from home.

C. Verification and Endorsement:

1. The application must be verified and endorsed by the local AHEPA Chapter President/Scholarship Chairman, and the Chapter Secretary.

D. Grade Point Average:

1. UNDERGRADUATE APPLICANT

- a. Exhibit scholastic excellence in High School or College Prep School maintaining a 3.0 GPA **OR** has attended a college or university full time for one (1) year maintaining a 3.0 GPA.
- b. Provide evidence of leadership qualities, church participation and community service.

2. GRADUATE APPLICANT

- a. Exhibit scholastic excellence and maintain a minimum of a 3.0 GPA.
- b. Provide evidence of leadership qualities, church participation and community service.

E. Previous Recipient:


Applicant must not have been a previous recipient of a District 21 Scholarship, and is eligible for only one District 21 Scholarship in any one year. HOWEVER, a graduate applicant who has received a scholarship award as an undergraduate student may apply for a Graduate student award.

F. Board review and Announcement:

The Educational Evaluator is solely responsible for the evaluation of all eligible applicants. The Foundation Board will announce the results in writing no later than May 1.

- 6. Explore combining the Daughters web site with the AHEPA web site.

2010 78th Annual District Convention Report - Stockton, California

Content

The Traveler is an eight or twelve page publication. Content includes news from Ahepa Headquarters, District Lodge, Chapters, reporting on special events, district officers list, chapter presidents and secretaries, advertising, etc. Although there is not a problem filling the eight pages and some times twelve pages, if all the chapters submitted articles from time to time it would make the publication more interesting. Reporting chapter special events, special recognition of a member(s) or family members, chapter projects, and other information of interest to the members. Since The Traveler is published only four times a year, it shouldn't be a problem hearing from each chapter at least once during the year. The Traveler is available to view in color and to print out individual pages on District 21's web site: www.ahepa21.org. Current and past issues are included on the web site. Starting with the Spring 2010 issue The Traveler is sent via email to all presidents and secretaries of AHEPA and Daughters of Penelope chapters.

Circulation

The June/Summer 2010 issue, was 1,166 copies. In 1999 "Address Correction Requested" was added to each issue. This has resulted in a more accurate mailing list because the post office reports changes of addresses while The Traveler is still forwarded to the new address. Unfortunately, if there is no forwarding address The Traveler is returned. The cost of this service now is \$1.20 per address correction and the average is about 5 copies per issue down from about 60-70 copies when the service was first started. Limiting one issue each per household, chapters not reporting new or reinstated members, deaths, and lost members all affect the circulation numbers. Starting with the March/Spring 2006 issue all addresses are "Cass Certified" meaning they are verified as a legitimate address and bar coded.

Production Schedule

The Traveler is published four times a year as follows:

Advertising

Established advertising rates are: regular size ads $(1.25" \times 2.25")$ \$70 per year, Double size $(2.5" \times 2.25")$ \$115 per year and a one issue ad $(2.5" \times 2.25")$ \$50. All advertising income goes to the District Lodge treasury.

As a non-profit organization there are some advertising limitations. Postal Regulations 6-1.3.1 Public Law 103-123 reads:

"This provision prohibits the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for credit, debit, or charge cards or similar financial instruments or accounts. This provision also restricts the mailing of material at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if it contains advertising for insurance policies and travel arrangements."

Bulk Rate Permit

The Traveler continues to use the Oakland Chapter's bulk rate permit. Starting with the June 2009 issue the Traveler is now mailed from the San Jose Main Post Office. A new permit number has been assigned (Permit #1007) but still under the name of Oakland Ahepa Chapter #171. The transfer fee of \$180 (separate from the annual mailing permit fee - now \$185) was paid by the Franciscan Press. An application will be submitted to change the name to AHEPA District 21.

Recommendations

- 1. Chapters should submit their mailing list to *The Traveler* at least twice a year to insure each member receives a copy. For example, submit a copy by August 15 for the fall and winter issues and by February 15 each year for the spring and summer issues. Or if the chapter would prefer, *The Traveler* could mail a copy of its chapter mailing list and the chapter could update and return them.
 - 2. Chapters should submit at least one article per year.
- 3. Chapters should support *The Traveler* by placing a chapter ad and solicit ads from their member's businesses.
- 5. Since the *The Traveler* is mailed by standard snail mail and is only published four times a year, it is not a practical method to use as communication tool when responses are needed quickly. Bulk mail may take anywhere from one day to two weeks (or never).

Summary

The Traveler is interested in improving the content and delivery of the publication. Recommendations and suggestions, within budget restraints, are important. With a little effort and cooperation from all we can achieve this goal.
