

CONVENTION MINUTES

BUSINESS SESSION - SATURDAY MORNING - June 25, 2011

The 79th Annual District Convention hosted by the Oakland AHEPA Chapter #171 and the Daughters of Penelope, EOS#4 Chapter was called to order by the Convention Chairman Steve Miller at 9:05 AM. On behalf of the Co-chairman Bill Anton and Sophia Johnston he welcomed all the Delegates. Due to the absence of the District Chaplain Steve Miller gave the opening prayer. Brother Steve Miller introduced District Governor Nick Pries to continue with the business session of the convention. Brother Nick thanked the Delegates for electing him District Governor for two years. He thanked the Chapters for receiving him and the District Lodge at their meetings through out the year. Convention Secretary Bill Booras called the roll of the Convention Delegates. There were 4 members of the District Lodge, 13 Convention Delegates, and 8 Past District Governors. Brother Pries appointed the following Brothers as Tellers: Arnold Dorer, Andrew Mastoras, Bill Panagopoulos, and Nick Gianopoulos. Brother Nick Pries called for nominations for Convention Chairman: Steve Miller nominated Brother Tom Chiarchianis, who had a unanimous ballot for Convention Chairman. Steve Miller nominated John Lagios as Vice Chairman of the Convention with a unanimous ballot. Steve Miller nominated Bill Booras as Convention Secretary with a unanimous ballot. Past Supreme President Andrew Banis gave the oath of office to the newly elected Convention Officers. Chairman Tom Chiarchianis appointed Chris Rockas as Parliamentarian, Nick Johnson as Marshall, and Arnold Dorer as Inside Sentinel.

CHAPTER REPORTS: Nick Johnson, President of the San Francisco Chapter #150 reported that the Agape Dinner they have annually helps the Chapter with their financial needs. They also donated \$1000 to the Scholarship Foundation. See page 13 for the written report. Bill Booras, Secretary of the Fresno Chapter #151 reported that they donated \$3150 to the Scholarship Foundation which included a \$2000 donation from Bro. Dr. Peter Scamagas. See page 14 for the written Report. Papadopoulos, President of the Sacramento Chapter #153 reported that the membership accounting has been corrected due to the Chapter Secretary Andreas Yerocostas. The have initiated a few new members. They are making reservation at the Thunder Valley Casino for the 2012 District Convention. Tom Chiarchianis complemented Brother Demos and his Chapter for reorganizing the Chapter. Supreme Governor Peter Triantafyllos reported that he was in attendance at the March 25 Flag Raising in Sacramento and that the luncheon and affair was very well done. Nick Gianopoulos, President of the Oakland Chapter #171 reported that at their AHEPA Day celebration they presented the Ascension Church the last payment for the parking lot structure. See page 16 for the written report. Tom Chiarchianis, Past President of the Stockton Chapter #212 reported that they initiated another person since the report was written. See page 17 for the written report. Arnold Dorer Secretary of the Solano Chapter #217 reported that they are trying to reorganize their Chapter. If that can't be accomplished they will transfer to the Oakland Chapter. See page 18 for a written report. There were no Delegates from the Marysville Chapter #228. See page 19 for the written report. Jeff Brown President from the Modesto Chapter #246 reported that they have 3 tentative members ready for initiation. Their crab feed was very successful and they donated \$2000 to the Scholarship Foundation. See page 20 for the written report.

CHAPTER REPORTS CONTINUED:

Richard Kylan Past President of the <u>San Jose Chapter #251</u> gave the report. See page <u>21</u> for the written report. There were no Delegates from the <u>Contra Costa Chapter #259</u>. See page <u>22</u> for the written report. John Lagios President of the <u>Reno Chapter #281</u> reported that their Chapter hosted an International Pan Cultural Brunch in May. See page <u>23-24</u> for the written report. Andy Salis Vice President of the <u>San Mateo Chapter #392</u>. They hosted the District Lodges with a turkey dinner. They also had a successful Christmas dance and they plan to host the Spring District Conference in 2012. See page <u>25</u> for the written report.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Scholarship Foundation: Lou Janakos reported that the Scholarship Foundation is giving \$11, 500.00 to the recipients this afternoon. He also reported that he will be retiring the position as president of the Foundation. He also reported that the city of San Jose donated \$1000 for a scholarship to a student from San Jose, but since there was no student that applied, the donation will be used next year. See page 26-27 for the written report.

Hellenic Project: Chris Rockas Past Supreme Councilor reported on the Hellenic Project which is now a 501(3)C Foundation and will now be dropping out of the National Projects Committee at National Headquarters. The foundation is now independent. Brother Chris explained all the details: At the 2009 National Convention in Miami Beach, Florida the project was approved and we have had little or no cooperation from National Headquarters. The production manager is now in Florida at the Pan Cretan convention seeking funds. See page 34-35 for the written report.

Convention Chairman Tom Chiarchianis at this time recognized Supreme Governor of District 8 Peter Triantafyllos. George Booras gave a preliminary report on the <u>Charitable Raffle</u>. At this time he had 646 raffle tickets sold which was more than last year at this same time period. Sacramento, Reno, and San Francisco have out sold themselves compared to last year. With sales above last year the rebates to the Chapters and the District will be a bit higher. The Daughters of Penelope Chapters have also done better than last year. The 2010 Charitable Raffle written report can be seen on pages <u>28-33</u>.

DISTRICT LODGE OFFICERS REPORTS:

There were no written reports from the District Chaplain, District Marshall, and the District Governor. Athletic Director Stamus Cocolas was not in attendance, but his report can be read on page 44 and his application for future Athletic Awards is on page 45. District Warden Elias Tsiknis was not in attendance, but his report can be read on page 43. District Treasure Alex Bazos reported that the budget will be discussed during the Auditors Report. The Treasures written report can be read on pages 39-42. District Secretary Tom Chiarchianis read parts of his report. He recommends that when a Chapter sends in the per capita tax check, the check should go to the Treasurer and the billing form should be sent to the Secretary. Brother Tom also reported that he made a District #21 Excel spread sheet that could be corrected via the Flash Drive as he receives the paid per capita billing forms. Demos Papadopoulos reported that the Sacramento Chapter is hooked up with a "Drop Off" program that enables them to keep track of all its members. See page 38 for the written report of the Distr. Secretary. District Lt. Governor Robert Sexton thanked the Brothers for there hospitality and Brotherhood during his Chapter visitations. See page 37 for his written report. Executive Secretary Bill Booras read his report. See page 46 for the written report. The convention committees got together to end the morning session.

Chairman Tom Chiarchianis opened that afternoon session at 12:45 pm. Convention Secretary gave the roll call of Delegates. There were 4 District Lodge Officers, 16 Chapter Delegates, and 8 Past District Lodge Officers. A moment of silence was held for our departed Brothers. See pages 10-12 for a list of the departed Brothers for this past year. Nick Gianopoulos thanked Brothers Steve Miller and Bill Anton for putting this District Convention together, even though they did not receive much help from the Oakland Daughters of Penelope. Steve Miller read the "Oath of Alexander the Great" He felt this was apropos for the world today and is happening in AHEPA.

Committee Reports:

Andy Banis Chairman of the Grievance Committee reported that there was no record of the District Lodge visitations like pictures or written report. There was some rebuff that there was record in the Traveler on some of the visitations. Brother Andy also noted that our District should support the National Convention more. Committee members were: John Lagios, Bill Anton, George Konstantopoulos, and Vlasis Fousekis. There was no written report. Nick Pries reported on future joint District Conventions. He talked with Supreme Governor Peter Triantafyllos regarding a joint District Convention in 2014 with Districts 19, 20, and 21. Nick Pries also suggest that the Fall District conference be used to inform the various Chapter Officers on their duties. It was also noted that the Modesto Chapter will consider hosting the 2013 District Convention. They also noted that the 2012 National convention will be August 19-24, 2012 at the Monte Carlos Hotel Casino in Las Vegas. Since the Convention the National Convention dates for 2012 have been changed to July 22-27, 2012. There was no written report. Nick Johnson President of the San Francisco Chapter moved that the convention city charge \$50 for a Delegate. This would entitle the Delegate to participate and vote in the meetings only. Andy Salis seconds the motion. After much discussion Andy Banis moved that this motion be tabled and that the new District Lodge look into this matter. AHEPA Traveler Committee: The committee reported that we need to get a new web master. We need someone that will be pro-active in getting information from the Chapters. It was also suggested that we go to Face Book to pass on local news. Face Book could be set up to only include AHEPA people and it might help to bring in younger men into the group. The committee felt that the Traveler is doing the right thing by going on the internet and web site with the Traveler. Nick Pries moved that we get a new webmaster. John Lagios seconds the motion. Motion passed. We have to get a release number from the current webmaster. George Booras moved that we get a Face Book Page. Nick Gianopoulos seconds the motion. Motion passed. Chris Rockas chairman of the Resolutions Committee moved that the Chapter Secretary sends the per capita to the District Treasurer with a copy of the billing roster to the District Secretary. George Konstantopoulos seconds the motion. After discussion the motion was withdrawn. The bylaws state that the per capita tax payment must go to the District Secretary and he in turn sends the check to the District Treasurer. Nick Gianopoulos chairman of the Auditors Committee reported that the Treasurer Alex Bazos did a good job with the bookkeeping. He then went over the income and expenses of the 2012 Budget. A \$200 item on the District Income was removed which leaves an income for 2012 of \$8,430.00. The following expenses for the District were changed as follows: It was moved that the Executive Secretary to receive \$500. Robert Sexton moved that miscellaneous expenses be raised to \$200. Nick Pries moved that we include \$500 for the District Governor for discretionary funds. The total expense budget is now \$6,950 which leaves the District with \$1,480 net income for the year 2012. Chris Rockas moved that we accept the adjusted budget for 2012. Motion passed. Nick Pries read the following awards: Chapter of the Year - Sacramento Chapter #153. President of the Year - Rick Kylan, San Jose Chapter #251. AHEPAN of the Year - Bill Christie, San Jose Chapter #251. The Convention Secretary gave the roll call of Delegates prior to the election of District Lodge Officers: District Lodge 4, Convention Delegates 15, and Past District Governors 7. Voting strength was 26 Delegates.

ELECTION OF DISTRICT LODGE OFFICERS:

Tom Chiarchianis called for nomination for <u>District Governor</u>: Nick Pries nominated Robert Sexton for District Governor of District #21. Nick Gianopoulos seconds the nomination. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Robert Sexton for District Governor</u>.

Steve Miller nominated Tom Chiarchianis for Lt. Governor of District #21. Nick Gianopoulos seconds the motion. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Tom Chiarchianis for Lt. District Governor</u>.

Andy Banis nominated Bill Anton for <u>District Secretary</u>. Robert Sexton nominated Bill Booras for <u>District Secretary</u>. A secret ballot was called for by Steve Miller. <u>Bill Booras</u> was elected as <u>District Secretary</u>.

Jeff Brown nominated Alex Bazos for <u>District Treasurer</u> of District #21. Vlasis Fousekis seconds the nomination. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Alex Bazos for District Treasurer</u>.

Robert Sexton nominated George Gianopulos for <u>District Warden</u>. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>George Gianopulos for District Warden</u>.

There were no nominations for District Marshall. The District Governor will appoint one.

Nick Pries nominated Stamus Cocoles for <u>District Athletic Director</u>. Andy Salis seconds the nomination. A unanimous ballot was cast for <u>Stamus Cocoles for District Athletic Director</u>.

Steve Miller, PDG was appointed as District Chaplain.

The following Brothers were nominated and elected to continue on the <u>Scholarship Foundation Board</u>: <u>Lou Janakos</u> and <u>Bill Booras</u>.

Supreme Governor Peter Triantafyllos gave the oath of office to the newly elected District Lodge Officers.

District Governor Robert Sexton thanked the Delegates for electing him as District Governor for District #21.

Steve Miller gave the closing prayer.

Convention Chairman Tom Chiarchianis adjourned the 79th District Convention until we meet again in 2012.

- and Business Convention Secretary Bill Booras PDG, carrier out their duties in a proper manner,






