## **BUSINESS SESSION - FRIDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 8, 2012**

The 80th Annual District #21 Convention, hosted by the Sacramento Chapter #153 and the Artemis Chapter #5 Daughters of Penelope, was called to order by the District Governor, Robert Sexton at 2:20 PM Andrew Banis, PSP, rose in memory of our past deceased Brothers. The Delegates were informed to reconvene at 9:00 AM Saturday Morning. Meeting recessed at 4:00 PM.

Saturday, June 9, 2012. The meeting was called to order by the Convention Business Chairman George Booras, PDG, at 9:05 AM. Convention Secretary Bill Booras reported that the Delegate count was 31 Delegates.

## **Committee Reports:**

Grievance Committee: Bill Anton committee Chairman reported that there were no grievances at this time.

Convention Cities Committee: Tom Chiarchianis chairman of the Convention Cities Committee reported on the possibility of having a future joint District Convention with 3 or more Districts. A meeting will be set up at the National Convention to discuss this issue for 2015. It was moved and seconded. Motion passed. Fall District Conference: The Fresno AHEPA Family is in discussion with the St. Nicholas Ranch and Retreat Center to host the Fall District Conference on Saturday, October 13, 2012. Oakland wishes to host the 2013 Spring District Conference, and San Jose will be hosting the 2013 Fall District Conference. Motion approved as presented.

### **CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED:**

Budget Committee: Alex Bazos chairman of the budget committee reported on the corrections needed for the 2013 proposed budget and the 2012 budget. Bill Anton made motion to approved the corrections as presented by Brother Bazos. Steve Miller seconds the motion. Motion passed. Lou Phillips inquired why we are giving the DOP half the cost of the Traveler Ads. Lou Janakos moved that income from the Traveler Ads be used to pay for the expense of the printing of the Traveler. Lou Philips seconds the motion. Motion passed. Written report on pages 34-1, 2, 3, 4.

Resolutions Committee: Chairman Chris Rockas, PSC, reported that the committee will be meeting in the afternoon.

Housing Committee: Chairman Michael Prokopakis will be checking the San Jose and Santa Clara areas regarding housing properties. He also will make contact with the Housing Committee at the National Convention. Bill Anton moved that we table discussion on the Housing committee until after the National Convention. Nick Pries seconds the motion. Motion passed.

Special Projects Committee: Distr. Gov. Robert Sexton explained the revised Charitable Raffle. First prize to be \$5000 and other prizes would be donations. Ticket costs will be \$100 per ticket or \$100 for 5 tickets. Each \$100 ticket sold would give the chapter \$30 per ticket. Robert Sexton moved that we consider the motion. Andreas Yerocostas seconds the motion. Lou Phillips reported that the San Francisco Chapter votes against the Charitable Raffle. George Booras explained that the proceeds from the raffle must go to a 501-c(3) organization within the state of California. There were 12 yes votes, 12 no votes, and 5 abstentions. Motion failed. See page 25 for a written explanation.

Poker Night Fund Raiser: Chairman Tom Chiarchianis explained the details of a Poker Night fund Raiser. Poker nights have to be organized and that we have two per year. Bill Anton moved that we accept the motion to have a Poker Night Fund Raiser at different locations in our District. George Konstantopoulos seconds the motion. Motion passed. For a written report see page 44.

Per Capita Tax increase: Nick Pries moved that we increase our District per capita tax payment from \$5 to \$15 per member. John Copoulos seconds the motion. Bill Christie amends the motion to raise the per capita tax payment by \$5 per member and he would absorb the AHEPA Traveler costs. Lou Phillips seconds the amended motion if Bill Christie not pay the Traveler expenses. Amended motion did not pass. Main motion passed. Elias Phillips moved that the increase in per capita tax become effective in 2014. Alex Bazos seconds the motion. Motion defeated. George Konstantopoulos moved that \$15 dollar per capita increase to start on January 1, 2013. Bill Anton seconds the motion. Motion passed.

#### **CONVENTION MINUTES CONTINUED:**

Web site Committee: Alex Bazos reported that the website master will cost up to \$100. Alex Bazos moved that we get the web master to cut his costs. Bill Anton moved that we table the motion. Steve Miller seconds the motion. Motion passed. Distr. Gov. Robert Sexton explained and moved that we add private E-mail addresses for District and Chapter officers at a cost of \$300. This would not expose our E-mail addresses. Steve Miller seconds the motion. Motion passed.

Morning session was recessed at 11:15 for the Scholarship Luncheon.

The afternoon session was called to order by the Convention Chairman George Booras at 1:45 PM. The roll call of Delegates was postponed until the time the District Lodge Elections will take place.

Grievance Committee: Chairman Bill Anton reported that there were no grievances brought to the committee.

By-Laws and Rules Committee: Chairman Chris Rockas reported that there were no changes submitted to the By-laws or Rules Committee.

Resolutions Committee: Chairman Chris Rockas read all the resolutions. All Resolutions as presented were approved. For the written report see page 42.

Supreme Governor Alex Christy spoke to the Delegates.

<u>District Lodge Awards</u>: Distr. Gov. Robert Sexton, Lt. Distr. Gov. Tom Chiarchianis, and Chaplain Steve Miller formed the committee and reported the following awards: The <u>Reno Chapter</u> was awarded the <u>Chapter of the Year for 2012</u>. George Gianopulos, Chapter #151 was awarded the <u>President of the year 2012</u>. The <u>Ahepan of the Year</u> was awarded to all the members of District #21.

Growth and Expansion Committee: Chairman Demos Papadopoulos reported that Chapters should have Family Picnics, Chapters should be involved in business net working, approach inactive members to rejoin AHEPA, provide scholarship awards to local students (not necessary as Ahepan members), and do formal mentoring. Report was adopted as presented.

**Liaison Committee:** No report presented.

Good of the Order: Tom Chiarchianis thanked the Sacramento Chapter for a successful District Convention. Robert Sexton showed pictures of his Grandson for winning a chess tournament. Lou Janakos suggested that we give acknowledgement to the young Scholarship recipients.

Athletic Hall of Fame: The name of John Christopulos a member of the Sacramento Chapter was inducted into the Northern California Hall of Fame. For a full report by the Athletic chairmen Stamus see pages 39 and 40.

AHEPA Traveler: Editor Bill Christie's report on the AHEPA Traveler can be read on page 26-1. Brother Christie emphasized that each Chapter should submit an article about their Chapter. It was moved that the income from the Traveler ads go directly to cover the cost of the AHEPA Traveler production.

District Project: It was reported by Nick Pries that the AHEPA building at the St. Nicholas Ranch requires about \$25,000 for repairs. Distr. Gov. Robert Sexton proposed that AHEPA District #21 adopt the AHEPA Lodge repairs as a District project. The District will provide funds and other assistance to complete these repairs. The District will establish and administer a fund into which donations will be deposited and from which the costs of these repairs will be paid. At the completion of the project, the District will decide how to disperse any remaining funds at the next District convention. Tom Chiarchianis seconds the motion. Motion passed. The Convention Chairman invited Supreme Governor Alex Christy to the podium to give the oath of office to the newly elected District Lodge Officers.

The District Governor Robert Sexton thanked the body for electing him and the new District Lodge and he wished for all to have a successful year. We will meet again at the next District Convention in Modesto 2013.


Steve Miller gave the closing prayer. The 80th District #21 District Convention was adjourned at 3:25 P.M.



#### Proposal for a District 21 Charitable Raffle

- 1. A single cash prize of \$5,000 to be offered. In the event of (unlikely) low ticket sales, the difference will be the responsibility of both the AHEPA District Lodge and DOP District Lodge.
- 2. Additional prizes of donated items to be offered. These prizes must be substantial, such as flat-screen TV's, iPOds, smart phones, gift cards, etc. These prizes must have a minimum value of \$100. (Chapters should be encouraged to provide as much of these as possible.)
- 3. <u>Tickets to be \$100 each</u>. They may also be sold as packets of 5 \$20 tickets.
- 4. The gross proceeds to be divided 30% to AHEPA District 21, 30% to DOP District 21, 30% divided among DOP and AHEPA chapters on a *pro-rata* basis. The remaining 10% covers the cash prize and expenses of the raffle.

Any raffle must be structured in accordance with state laws regarding raffles and must be registered as required. The proceeds must be paid only to identifiable charitable funds. The portion paid to cover expenses and the cash prize may not exceed 10% of the gross.

The examples below show that a minimum of 500 tickets must be sold to make this a beneficial project.

#### Loss Case:

If 400 tickets are sold, the gross income is \$40,000. The district lodges and chapters each receive \$12,000. The chapters would receive \$30 for each ticket sold. The district lodges would incur a loss of \$1,000 plus expenses. This is a loss to the general funds because no more than 10% of the gross income can be used for expenses, including prizes (but not donated prizes.)

#### Break-even Case:

If 500 tickets are sold, the gross income is \$50,000. The district lodges and chapters each receive \$15,000. The chapters would again receive \$30 for each ticket sold. The district lodges would incur the loss only of expenses.

#### **Profitable Cases:**

If 600 tickets are sold, the gross income is \$60,000. The district lodges and chapters each receive \$18,000. The chapters would again receive \$30 for each ticket sold. The district lodges would receive a return of \$1,000 less expenses.

If 700 tickets are sold, the gross income is \$70,000. The district lodges and chapters each receive \$21,000. The chapters would again receive \$30 for each ticket sold. The district lodges would receive a return of \$2,000 less expenses.





#### Proposal:

To Adopt the AHEPA Lodge at St. Nicholas Ranch as a District Project

The AHEPA lodge at St. Nicholas Ranch was built with the help of the AHEPA and DOP chapters of District 21 many years ago. Through the years, the condition of this lodge has deteriorated such that major repairs are needed.

It is hereby proposed that AHEPA District 21 adopt the AHEPA Lodge repairs as a District project. The District will provide funds and other assistance to complete these repairs. The District will establish and administer a fund into which donations will be deposited and from which the costs of these repairs will be paid. At the completion of the project, the District will decide how to disburse any remaining funds at the next District Convention.

#### SPECIAL PROJECTS COMMITTEE

#### PROPOSED RAFFLE REPLACEMENT FUNDRAISER OUTLINE

- 1). Propose to hold three (3) annual Poker/Casino Night fundraisers throughout District 21.
- 2). Divide the District into three (3) Territories. Each Territory would hold one of the Poker Night Fundraisers. Territory 1: Greater SF Bay Area; Territory 2: Northern Central Valley (Sacramento Area); Territory 3: Central/Southern Central Valley (Modesto Area).
- 3). Within each Territory, one Ahepa Family Chapter(s) would hold the fundraiser. A committee must be formed, consisting of the host Ahepa Family Chapter(s) plus one or two members from each Ahepa Family Chapter(s) within the Territory.
- 4). The host chapter(s) need to register with the California DOJ per the 2007 law. It is a one page, very simple form the complete. It can be done at the DOJ website.
- 5). Sharing of expenses would need to be discussed. Should the Ahepa and DOP District Lodges be responsible for the expenses? Should the host territory share in the cost?
- 6). Each Ahepa Family Chapter(s) within each territory will alternate as a fundraiser host.
- 7). Poker Night Fundraisers would have one "buy in" fee of at least \$100.00 \$125.00 per player. Each event should a goal of 100 players for each territory. Set a goal of \$10,000.00 gross for each event plus re-buys during the night will increase the income over \$10K. Dinner or heavy appetizers plus a cash bar would be provided.
- 8). Possible increases in revenue: hold a raffle during the event. Prizes can be donated.
- 9). Chapter(s) can earn additional revenue: Make the event fun and competitive. Have each chapter, Ahepa and DOP, participate by having a contest to see which Chapter can bring in the most players/participants. Example: for each 5 players confirmed and paid the chapter will receive \$150.00. So if the Stockton Chapter brings in 20 confirmed and paid players, the Stockton Chapter would receive \$600.00. The chapter then can donate to a charity or back to the Scholarship Fund.
