In addition to being a fun and enjoyable event, it provides a great opportunity to meet with our fellow AHEPANs and exchange ideas that will help to grow and strengthen our Organization and lay the foundation for its success in the future. I

would like to thank the Convention Chairmen and the entire Convention Committee for all of their hard work, preparing a wonderful event at the Atlantis Casino Resort and Spa. I would also like to thank the Reno Chapter for hosting the Greek Night Glendi. Please consider attending!

This was an exciting year for District 21. We had the opportunity to reinstate the San Jose Sons of Pericles and Maids of Athena chapters, increasing the number of SOP and MOA chapters to 5. These young men and women are the future of our Organization and I hope we can continue increasing their membership in the coming years.

We also continued our fundraising for Phase III of the St Nicholas Ranch Dormitory Renovation project. So far we have collected over \$110,000 towards the \$180,000 goal. In addition to the Renovation project, the District is planning to participate in the Dogs for Warriors National project. These dogs are rescued from dog pounds and are specially trained to provide the veterans with companionship and to assist them on their path to recovery and management of their disabilities. The cost of training is \$15,000 per dog. We have setup a PayPal account to collect money and we will provide more information at the Convention.

In closing, I have really enjoyed serving as your Governor this past year. I had the pleasure to meet many of you during the visitations. I am grateful to my District Lodge for their dedication and loyalty. I would like to thank Lt Governor George Buck, Secretary Alex Mallas, Treasurer Chris Frangos, Marshal Vasili Karapanos, Warden Dr Spiros Kalogeropulos, Chaplain Steve Miller PDG, District Athletic Director Stamus Cocoles and District Advisor William Anton PDG, for a job well done. I would also like to thank DOP Governor Foula Vasilogiorgis and her Lodge for their support and kindness.







AHEPA Campaign to Build Saint Nicholas National Shrine at World Trade Center

September 11 was a national tragedy that forever changed America. Nearly 3,000 lives were lost; 39 of who were Greek Americans. Also lost that fateful day was the only House of Worship destroyed by the 9/11 attacks Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church.

The effort to rebuild Saint Nicholas was mired in bureaucracy. AHEPA's "Cut the Red Tape!"" campaign proved effective in helping to budge the bureaucracy of the New York/New Jersey Port Authority to allow for the construction of Saint Nicholas at Ground Zero.

Now the time has come to build the Saint Nicholas National Shrine at World Trade Center. AHEPA and its affiliated organizations, the Daughters of Penelope, Sons of Pericles, and Maids of Athena, will support the campaign to build the Saint Nicholas National Shrine by raising funds during the next two years.

Constantine Yerocostas

Constantine is a senior at John Adams Academy, Roseville, CA. His personal essay states his desire for a B.S. degree in Biomedical Engineering; he is accepted by UC-Davis to pursue his goal. Elias attends Marshall Ketchum University (MBKU) in preparation to complete a Physician Assistant Certification and is pursuing a Master's of Medical Science and a Physician Assistant Certification. He was awarded an Emergency Medical Tech Certificate from Skyline College with a 3.7 GPA; he also holds a 3.7 GPA from Sonoma State University with a BA degree in Psychology. His personal essay is well written and expresses his keen desire to "put myself at my patient's service as their coach, and motivator to change habits for longer, healthier lives." Elias was VP of P.A's at MBKU, volunteer at the Belmont Greek Festival, Dean's List member at San Mateo, Canada, and Skyline Colleges, and other activities. Both reference letters are strong. One letter mentions his "great character" and "dedication to the PA profession", while the other letter mentions notable "compassion and dedication to the well-being of others."

Yianni Papadokonstadakis

Yianni attends Archbishop Mitty High School in San Jose. His goal is a Bachelors and Master's Degree, with a major in Business from an institution yet to be named. Yianni is well on his way to further success with a 3.7 Total Cum GPA and a combined SAT (1600 scale) of 1310. He lists an impressive number of school, Church, Community and Civic activities. Some of these include: Honor Roll, Certificate in Greek Studies, Journalist (Monarch News) Football, Volleyball, and basketball team membership, GOYA member, Immersion trip to East Los Angeles, and others. His two reference letters are outstanding. For example, his Parish Priest mentions his "pleasant, enthusiastic personality" and "solid foundation in faith and culture". Two reference letters are highly supportive (one from his Dentist, and one from his Band Director).



2,500 Years of Heroic Running...The modern Athens Marathon commemorates the run of the soldier Pheidippides from a battlefield at the site of the town of Marathon, Greece, to Athens in 490 B.C., bringing news of a Greek victory over the Persians. Legend has it that Pheidippides delivered the momentous message "Niki!" ("victory"), then collapsed and died, thereby setting a precedent for dramatic conclusions to the marathon.

When the modern Olympic games were inaugurated in 1896 in Greece, the legend of Pheidippides was revived by a 24.85 mile (40,000 meters) run from Marathon Bridge to Olympic stadium in Athens. Traditionally the final event in the Olympics, the first organized marathon on April 10, 1896 was especially important to all Greeks. Greece was hosting those first modern Olympic Games. The Greeks had yet to win a medal, and had one final chance to bring glory to their nation. Twenty-five runners assembled on Marathon Bridge. The starter mumbled a few words and fired the gun, and the race was on. "The excitement of the crowd waiting at the finish line at the newly constructed replica of Athens' ancient stadium was beyond description" writes the Greek historian Quercetani. Spiridon Louis, a Greek postal worker from the village of Marusi and veteran of several long military marches, crossed the finish line a full seven minutes ahead of the pack. His time was 2 hours, 58 minutes, 50 seconds for the 40 kilometer distance. When it was all over nine runners finished, 8 of them Greeks. The host nation was ecstatic, and the marathon was born.

So many of our American heroes come home from war physically, but mentally they remain on the battle-field. They are imprisoned by their own thoughts, crushed by post traumatic stress disorder ("PTSD"), which causes 22 veterans every single day to choose to commit suicide rather than live with the effects of their invisible battle scars. AHEPA has decided to join the

To this end, AHEPA has joined the K9 for Warriors effort (www.k9sforwarriors.org), a life-saving program that


fight to end the scourge of PTSD.

pairs a service dog (usually a rescue dog) with a veteran suffering from PTSD. The results are extraordinary. These wonderful service dogs are a proven recovery tool empowering warriors suffering from this debilitating and deadly disease to return to civilian life with dignity and independence. The cost to train a service dog is \$15,000, however there is no cost to the Veteran. The dog is initially trained alone and when paired with a veteran the two spend three weeks training together at the K9 for Warriors facility in Florida.

AHEPA's involvement with K9 for Warriors was started by Garden State Chapter 517, Holmdel, NJ (www.ahepa517.org). It became a NATIONAL AHEPA PROJECT in July 2016 and is now coordinated and funded through AHEPA SERVICE DOGS FOR WARRIORS, INC., a 501 (c) (3) organization (www.ahepa-servicedogs.org)

We raised enough funds to sponsor four (4) dogs through the end of 2017. We anticipate sponsoring eight (8) dogs in 2018.

AHEPA VETERANS REGISTRATION

AHEPA Medal for Military Service is awarded to all veterans in Honor of their service to the United States.

"The Mission of the Order of AHEPA Veterans Committee is to archive and recognize all veterans of the Order and Hellenic community through sound communication and publication. Furthermore, to conduct fund raising and philanthropic outreach through a cohesive, limited, yet well defined activity that reflects well on the Order of AHEPA and brings credit to the organization at large."

The AHEPA Medal for Military Service, approved by the 106th Congress, was presented to all AHEPA veterans present at the 34th Biennial Congressional Banquet, March 29, 2000. The Supreme Lodge then encouraged its districts and chapters to present this medal to its deserving veterans unable to attend this banquet. It is this committee's intent to register AHEPA Veterans and have the AHEPA Medal presented at appropriate events at the District and Chapter levels. Funds collected through this effort cover medal production and other administrative costs to include shipping. Remaining proceeds will be donated to the Wounded Warrior Program annually.

Eligibility requirement for AHEPA Medal for Military Service includes Honorable Service and Discharge. Service includes Active Duty, National Guard, or Reserve status of the United States Armed Forces. REGISTER ONLINE AT WWW.AHEPA.ORG. File a copy with your chapter Secretary after registration is complete. Medals are normally shipped in the fall and in time for Veteran's Day celebrations in November.
