Memo from Vasilios Kalavrouziotis Chair of the AHEPA Technology Toolkit Committee

Email Phishing has been an issue that has been brought up by many members of our AHEPA community.

What is Phishing?

Phishing is the fraudulent attempt to obtain sensitive information such as usernames, passwords and credit card details by disguising oneself as a trustworthy entity in an electronic communication. Typically carried out by email spoofing or instant messaging, it often directs users to enter personal information at a fake website which matches the look and feel of the legitimate site.

Many organizations fall victim of "Spear Phishing", which is a targeted attempt to extort information or money from individuals. A large organization like AHEPA is susceptible to this because it has so many members and it is easy to find out the basic information and pretend to be someone else who need of fellow members from websites, Facebook, events, news articles, etc.. This doesn't mean we should abolish all new technology and only communicate with carrier pigeons; we simply need to be a little bit more diligent with our communications.

How What to look for in a phishing email

How to spot a fake message from a fellow member. AHEPA is a large organization with thousands of members so it is difficult to know everyone. These steps will help keep us safe.

FOLLOW UP - One way to keep yourself safe from disclosing information or transferring money to a fake member is to follow up in person or with a phone call. A good practice is to include a signature in your official emails that may include a contact number for people to confirm verbally.

SPREAD THE WORD – If you're feeling suspicious, get more people on board with the conversation. Follow up with people that would be in the know. Also letting others know of what's going on will keep them alert and protect them from falling for a scam as well. Two heads are better than one.

DO NOT SHARE PERSONAL INFO – If someone is reaching out to you, that you don't know, and needs your social security number, do not give it to them. Use common sense when it comes to sharing information. Exercise caution when talking to people you do not know personally.

How to spot a fake message from a fake company or organizations. Many times, you may receive an email that has a bogus invoice or asks you to sign in and fill out something.

Generic greeting. Phishing emails are usually sent in large batches. To save time, Internet criminals use generic names like "First Generic Bank Customer" so they don't have to type all recipients' names out and send emails one-by-one. If you don't see your name, be suspicious.

Forged links. Even if a link has a name you recognize somewhere in it, it doesn't mean it links to the real organization. Roll your mouse over the link and see if it matches what appears in the email. If there is a discrepancy, don't click on the link. Also, websites where it is safe to enter personal information begin with "https" — the "s" stands for secure. If you don't see "https" do not proceed.

Requests personal information. The point of sending phishing email is to trick you into providing your personal information. If you receive an email requesting your personal information, it is probably a phishing attempt.

Sense of urgency. Internet criminals want you to provide your personal information now. They do this by making you think something has happened that requires you to act fast. The faster they get your information, the faster they can move on to another victim.

Go through Official Channels. A good rule to follow is to avoid clicking links in emails and go through the official websites.

For example you receive an email from "rewards@amazonrewards.com" that says to sign in and claim your \$50 gift card, you may think that it is a good deal, but they would send you to a fake amazon sign in page where they can steal you username and password. If you want to check something go to the official site. If you did indeed win a gift card, they wouldn't keep it on a secret site, but rather inform you directly on their official website.

This is a basic guideline to avoid falling for scams. Below are a few links for more information about phishing. The internet isn't as scary as we all think, we simply need to be a little diligent and smart about how we use it.


